1.0 Introduction

This program directory is intended for the system programmer responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information concerning the material and procedures associated with the installation of DB2 REXX SQL. You should read all of this program directory before installing the program and then keep it for future reference.

The program directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, "Program Materials" on page 2 identifies the basic and optional program materials and documentation for DB2 REXX SQL.
- 3.0, "Program Support" on page 5 describes the IBM support available for DB2 REXX SQL.
- 4.0, "Program and Service Level Information" on page 6 lists the APARs (program level) and PTFs (service level) incorporated into DB2 REXX SQL.
- 5.0, "Installation Requirements and Considerations" on page 7 identifies the resources and considerations for installing and using DB2 REXX SQL.
- 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 10 provides detailed installation instructions for DB2 REXX SQL.
- 7.0, "Service Instructions" on page 11 provides detailed servicing instructions for DB2 REXX SQL.

Before installing DB2 REXX SQL, read 3.1, "Preventive Service Planning" on page 5. This section tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this program directory. You should also review the DB2 REXX SQL Memo to Users and the DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation manual, GC09-2660.

The Memo to Users is supplied on Tape File 2 and is called I5648ELO MEMO.

2.0 Program Materials

An IBM program is identified by a program number and a feature code. The program number for DB2 REXX SQL is 5648-A70.

The program announcement material describes the features supported by DB2 REXX SQL. Ask your IBM marketing representative for this information if you have not already received a copy.

2.1 Basic Machine-Readable Material

The distribution medium for this program is 9-track magnetic tape (written at 6250 BPI), 3480 cartridge, 1/4-inch tape cartridge, or 4mm tape cartridge. The tape or cartridge contains all the programs and data needed for installation. DB2 REXX SQL is installed using the ELOINLS EXEC. See 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 10 for more information about how to install the program. Figure 1 describes the tape or cartridge. Figure 2 describes the file content of the program tape or cartridge.

Note: The program tape and cartridge contain "Restricted Materials of IBM."

4.0 Program and Service Level Information

This section identifies the program and any relevant service levels of DB2 REXX SQL. The program level refers to the APAR fixes incorporated into the program. The service level refers to the PTFs integrated. Information about the cumulative service tape is also provided.

4.1 Program Level Information

The new version of DB2 REXX SQL for VM has incorporated all closed APARs from previous versions/releases at the time of this product GA.

4.2 Service Level Information

Check the DB2VSEVM610 PSP bucket for any additional PTFs that should be installed or additional install information.

4.3 Cumulative Service Tape

There is no cumulative service tape for DB2 REXX SQL.

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating DB2 REXX SQL. In most cases, you can install DB2 REXX SQL on a running system (target system). However, sometimes two systems may be required. If two systems are required, then the following terminology is used:

- 1. The system used to install the program (driving system)
- 2. The system on which the program is installed (target system).

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install DB2 REXX SQL.

5.1.1 Programming Requirements

The DB2 REXX SQL installation process for VM/ESA assumes that VMFPLC2 or its equivalent is used to transfer the distribution tape files to any Direct Access Storage Device (DASD) supported by VM/ESA. The *VM/ESA CMS Command Reference* describes VMFPLC2. The installation of the DB2 REXX SQL distribution tape is supported by an IBM-supplied EXEC.

5.1.2 DASD Storage Requirements

DASD storage requirements are described in detail in the *DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation* manual, GC09-2660

5.2 Target System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the target system required to install and use DB2 REXX SQL.

5.2.1 Operating System Requirements

DB2 REXX SQL operates under the VM/ESA Version 2 Release 2 operating system.

5.2.2 Machine Requirements

There are no special machine requirements for the target system.

5.2.3 Programming Requirements

It is assumed that DB2 Server for VM Version 6 has already been installed and verified, thereby creating an DB2 for VM database virtual machine, DB2 for VM production and service minidisks or Shared File System (SFS) directories, and a user virtual machine. The instructions provided in the DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation manual, GC09-2660, are based on the recommended installation procedures for DB2 for VM. If DB2 for VM was not installed using defaults, you may need to substitute machine names, virtual addresses, or SFS directory names to install DB2 REXX SQL.

5.2.4 DASD Storage Requirements

DASD storage requirements are described in detail in the *DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation* manual, GC09-2660.

5.3 Program Considerations

There are no program, system, or special considerations for

5.3.1 Operating System Requirements

The VM/ESA Release 2 Version 2 or later operating system is used to install DB2 REXX SQL.

5.3.2 Machine Requirements

There are no special machine requirements for the driving system.

5.3.3 Programming Considerations

There are no programming considerations for DB2 REXX SQL.

5.3.4 System Considerations

There are no system considerations for DB2 REXX SQL.

5.3.5 Special Considerations

DB2 REXX SQL uses the CMS Message repository for storing its error messages. Consequently, you must issue the following CMS command before running any DB2 REXX SQL EXECs:

SET LANG AMENG (ADD ELO USER

You may include the SET LANGUAGE command in your PROFILE EXEC. This SET LANGUAGE command must be issued after the linking or accessing to the DB2 REXX SQL production minidisk or SFS directory. This is valid for an American English installation.

For any other language you must replace AMENG with the appropriate language identifier. Eg. You would enter

SET LANG UCENG (ADD ELO USER

to set the default language to UCENG. Please follow the instructions in Chapter 3 of the DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation manual, GC09-2660 for more details on NLS installation.

6.0 Installation Instructions

6.1 Installing DB2 REXX SQL

6.1.1 Overview

For an installation overview, refer to the checklists in the *DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation* manual, GC09-2660.

After proper installation of DB2 REXX SQL, a standard return code of 888 is returned. The DB2 REXX SQL distribution tape is positioned at the tape mark following the end of the last DB2 REXX SQL file on Tape File 12. See the *DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation* manual, GC09-2660, for instructions on verification.

During execution of the installation EXEC (I5648ELO), you cannot override the default minidisk passwords with a blank password.

If you are prompted for a new password, you must enter a nonblank password to change the default. Pressing Enter or entering a blank password indicates that you are accepting the default.

If you do not use passwords for minidisks, press Enter to accept the default password. The default value will be shown again for verification. Access the default. The minidisk link and access will be done.

6.1.2 General Comments

Once the installation process has been completed (I5648ELO, ELOAMOD, and ELOHLPD) and the verificaiton has been done, you can copy the DB2 REXX SQL production files to another minidisk or SFS directory if you so choose. All files from the production minidisk or SFS directory should be copied. If you do decide to copy the production files to another minidisk or SFS directory, it is recommended that you use the minidisks or SFS directories that you used for installation for any corrective or preventive service. After the servicing is complete, you can recopy the serviced production files.

7.0 Service Instructions

Details of the service instructions for DB2 REXX SQL can be found in *DB2 REXX SQL for VM/ESA Installation* manual, GC09-2660.
