1.0 Introduction

This program directory is intended for the system programmer responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information concerning the material and procedures associated with the installation of the XML Toolkit for z/OS V1.6.0 (Toolkit). You should read all of this program directory before installing the program and keep it for future reference.

The program directory supports three levels of the Toolkit, the current level V1.6.0 (FMID HXML160) plus two previous levels V1.5.0 (FMID HXML150) and V1.4.0 (FMID HXML140). These three levels together are referred to as the Toolkit V1.6.0 package. The program directory supports three levels because the Toolkit is based on open source software from the Apache Software Foundation which does not provide for upward compatibility. The Toolkit V1.6.0 package is designed so that applications using Toolkit V1.5.0 or V1.4.0 may continue to run against those levels. So unless otherwise stated, the information contained within the program directory applies to all three levels of the Toolkit (V1.6.0, V1.5.0, and V1.4.0).

The program directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, “Program Materials” on page 5 identifies the basic and optional program materials and documentation for the Toolkit.
- 3.0, “Program Support” on page 9 describes the IBM support available for the Toolkit.
- 4.0, “Program and Service Level Information” on page 11 lists the APARs (program level) and PTFs (service level) incorporated into the Toolkit.
- 5.0, “Installation Requirements and Considerations” on page 13 identifies the resources and considerations for installing and using the Toolkit.
- 6.0, “Installation Instructions” on page 21 provides detailed installation instructions for the Toolkit. It also describes the procedures for activating the functions of the Toolkit, or refers to appropriate publications.

Before installing the Toolkit, read the Read-Me-First and the Memo-To-Users-Extension that were supplied with this program softcopy as well as this Program Directory and then keep them for future reference.

The Toolkit is supplied in a Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3). The Program Directory is provided softcopy on the CBPDO tape which is identical to the printed copy shipped with your order. Your CBPDO contains a softcopy preventive service planning (PSP) upgrade for this product. All service and HOLDDATA for the Toolkit are included on the CBPDO tape.

1.1 The Toolkit

The Toolkit provides XML technology to assist customers in integrating vertical/industry-specific data formats, structures, schemas, and metadata to ensure industry compliance of data representation and content. Some of its key uses include categorizing and tagging data for exchange in disparate environments, as well as transforming ad hoc unstructured data to XML records, enabling you to search, cross-reference, and share records. The Toolkit also provides this support for use by other dependent IBM and vendor products.

The Toolkit includes the XML Parser, C++ Edition and the XML Parser, Java Edition. The XML Parser, Java Edition is an unmodified version of IBM's XML4J parser. The XML Parser, C++ Edition is a port of IBM's XML4C parser. The two parsers are tested and packaged for use on z/OS and OS/390. Both XML4C and XML4J are based on open source code from the Xerces Apache project of the Apache Software Foundation.

In addition to the parsers, the Toolkit includes the XSLT Processor, Java Edition. It also includes the XSLT Processor, C++ Edition (this processor is not supported in Toolkit V1.5.0.). The XSLT Processor, C++ Edition is a port of IBM's XSLT4C XSLT processor (formerly known as LotusXSL-C++); the XSLT Processor, Java Edition is an unmodified port of IBM's XSLT4J processor (formerly known as LotusXSL-Java). They are tested and packaged for use on z/OS and OS/390. Both are implementations of the W3C recommendations for XSL Transformations (XSLT) Version 1.0 and XML Path Language (XPath) Version 1.0. Both XSLT4C and XSLT4J are based on open source code from the Xalan Apache project of the Apache Software Foundation. They allow users to transform XML documents into other XML documents, HTML, or text, and run on multiple platforms.

The Toolkit is backed by OS/390 and z/OS world-class service and support.

Machine Requirements: Version 1 Release 6 XML Toolkit for z/OS and OS/390 runs on hardware that supports one of the following:

- z/OS Version 1 Release 2 or higher operating system
- z/OS.e Version 1 Release 3 or higher operating system

Programming Requirements: Version 1 Release 6 XML Toolkit for z/OS and OS/390 requires one of the following:

- z/OS Version 1 Release 2 or higher operating system
- z/OS.e Version 1 Release 3 or higher operating system

2.0 Program Materials

2.1 Basic Machine-Readable Material

The distribution medium for this program is magnetic tape or downloadable files. It is installed using SMP/E, and is in SMP/E RELFILE format. See 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 21 for more information about how to install the program. Figure 1 describes the file content.

Notes:

1. The data set attributes in the table should be used in the JCL of jobs reading the data sets, but since the data sets are in IEBCOPY unloaded format, their actual attributes may be different.
2. You are installing the Toolkit using the Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO) (5751-CS3). Information about your tape may be found in the CBPDO documentation that came with your order. Additionally, some of the information in these figures may not be valid. Consult the CBPDO documentation for actual values.
3. If any RELFILES are identified as PDSEs, ensure that SMPTLIB data sets are allocated as PDSEs.

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating the Toolkit. The following terminology is used:

- *Driving system*: the system used to install the program.
- *Target system*: the system on which the program is installed.

In many cases, the same system can be used as both a driving system and a target system. However, you may want to set up a clone of your system to use as a target system by making a separate IPL-able copy of the running system. The clone should include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Some cases where two systems should be used include the following:

- When installing a new level of a product that is already installed, the new product will delete the old one. By installing onto a separate target system, you can test the new product while still keeping the old one in production.
- When installing a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. Installing onto a test system or clone will allow you to assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install the Toolkit.

5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

The user ID under which the SMP/E installation jobs execute must have the following characteristics:

- defined to use z/OS UNIX System Services (z/OS UNIX) or OS/390 UNIX System Services (OS/390 UNIX)
- a superuser (UID=0) or have read access to the BPX.SUPERUSER resource in the RACF facility class.

z/OS UNIX or OS/390 UNIX must be available in "full-function mode" with the shell and utilities available.

5.2 Target System Requirements

The target system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

5.2.2 Programming Requirements

5.2.2.1 Mandatory Requisites

A mandatory requisite is defined as a product that is required without exception; this product either **will not install** or **will not function** unless this requisite is met. This includes products that are specified as REQs or PREs.

5.2.2.3 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites

A toleration/coexistence requisite is defined as a product which must be present on a sharing system. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD at different time intervals.

The Toolkit has no toleration/coexistence requisites. Upwards compatibility for the Toolkit V1.4.0, V1.5.0, and V1.6.0 is provided by shipping the code for the Toolkit V1.4.0 and V1.5.0. In addition, V1.4.0, V1.5.0, and V1.6.0 can all coexist together within in the same SMP/E zones, target and distribution libraries, and in the same HFS file system.

5.2.2.4 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites

A negative requisite identifies products which must *not* be installed on the same system as this product.

Toolkit V1.6.0 is **NOT** upward compatible to Toolkit V1.1.0, Toolkit V1.2.0, or Toolkit V1.3.0. Therefore, Toolkit V1.1.0, Toolkit V1.2.0 and Toolkit V1.3.0 users must either preserve their version of the Toolkit or migrate applications to use a newer version (V1.4.0, V1.5.0, or V1.6.0).

5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

The Toolkit libraries can reside on all supported DASD types.

Figure 12 on page 17 lists the total space required for each type of library.

5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Toolkit V1.6.0 (HXML160) will not delete Toolkit V1.5.0 (HXML150) or Toolkit V1.4.0 (HXML140) if either was installed. Toolkit V1.5.0 (HXML150) will not delete Toolkit V1.4.0 (HXML140) if it was installed.

If you are installing from the Toolkit Web site, use the instructions available on the Web site and make sure to review section 6.1.1, “Considerations for Using the SMP/E Web Download for the Toolkit” on page 21.

Whether you are installing from the tape or Web site, make sure to review sections 6.1.7, “Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries and Paths” on page 24 and 6.1.8, “Create DDDEF Entries” on page 24, which discuss how data set sizes are allocated for Toolkit V1.6.0 and Toolkit V1.5.0.

Toolkit V1.5.0 and later releases can receive performance enhancements through z/OS support for Unicode. These services are not mandatory for installation of the Toolkit but will be utilized if z/OS support for Unicode is configured correctly. For more information on configuring these services, see page 36.

6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the step-by-step procedures to install and to activate the functions of the Toolkit.

Please note the following:

- If you want to install the Toolkit into its own SMP/E environment, consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on creating and initializing the SMPCSI and the SMP/E control data sets.
- Sample jobs have been provided to help perform some or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries required for SMP/E execution have been defined in the appropriate zones.
- The SMP/E dialogs may be used instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.
- **As of V1.6.0, once the installation of the Toolkit is complete, within the UNIX file system the owning userid of the Toolkit files and directories will be UID 0, and the owning group id will be the GID of the installer.**

6.1 Installing the Toolkit

6.1.1 Considerations for Using the SMP/E Web Download for the Toolkit

The SMP/E web download package for the Toolkit is packaged using the SMP/E GIMZIP function. The SMP/E GIMUNZIP function is required to process the downloaded package.

You will need to perform the following tasks:

1. For a description of the GIMZIP and GIMUNZIP function, refer to the SMP/E web page at:

<http://www.ibm.com/servers/eserver/zseries/zos/smpe/>

Ensure that configuration requirements for using GIMUNZIP have been completed.

2. Allocate a R/W HFS directory on the z/OS or OS/390 system where the package will be staged. This is the repository for the download package.
3. Download the Toolkit package.

The package is available from the following Web site:

<http://www.ibm.com/servers/eserver/zseries/software/xml/>

There are two parts of the package:

- xml160.README.txt

This file contains a sample job that performs the following tasks. It must be updated to reflect your environment.

- Executes the z/OS UNIX System Services or OS/390 UNIX System Services pax command to extract the GIMZIP archives from the downloaded package.
- Executes the GIMUNZIP program to expand the GIMZIP archives and places their contents in data sets that can be processed by SMP/E.
- Executes the SMP/E RECEIVE from DASD function to receive the FMID.
- xml160.pax.Z

This pax archive file consists of the base function. The file contains the SMP/E MCS and the associated RELFILEs. This must be downloaded to a node that has connectivity to the target z/OS or OS/390 system. Transfer the file to the host using binary format.

4. Run the sample job in xml160.README.txt

This job will perform the required tasks up to and including the SMP/E RECEIVE from DASD step.

5. Complete the installation using the instructions in this program directory, beginning with 6.1.7, “Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries and Paths” on page 24.

6.1.2 SMP/E Considerations for Installing the Toolkit

The SMP/E dialogs may be used to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

6.1.3 SMP/E Options Subentry Values

The recommended minimum values for some SMP/E CSI subentries are shown in Figure 17. An SMP/E UTILITY entry for the binder is required in the global zone. You can specify any of these program names in the UTILITY entry: IEWBLINK, HEWL, IEWL, LINKEDIT, or HEWLH096. The linkage editor, which uses the names HEWLKED, HEWLF064, IEWLF440, IEWLF880, and IEWLF128, cannot be used. DSSPACE is a subentry in the GLOBAL options entry. PEMAX is a subentry of the GENERAL entry in the GLOBAL options entry. Refer to the SMP/E manuals for instructions on updating the global zone.

6.1.4 SMP/E CALLLIBS Processing

The Toolkit uses the CALLLIBS function provided in SMP/E to resolve external references during installation. When the Toolkit is installed, ensure that the DDDEF entry exists for the libraries SCEELKED and CSSLIB.

Notes:

1. Toolkit V1R6 does not use the CALLLIBS function.
2. The SCEELKED and CSSLIB DDDEFs are used only to resolve the link-edit for the Toolkit using CALLLIBS. These data sets are not updated during the installation of the Toolkit.

6.1.5 Sample Jobs

The following sample installation jobs are provided as part of the product to help you install the Toolkit:

You can access the sample installation jobs by performing an SMP/E RECEIVE and then copying the jobs from the SMPTLIBs to a work data set for editing and submission. See Figure 18 to find the appropriate SMPTLIB data set.

6.1.6 Perform SMP/E RECEIVE

This step loads SYSMOD information for FMID HXML160, HXML150, and HXML140 from the program tape into the SMPPTS data set and the global zone, and places the associated data records into temporary SMPTLIB data sets for subsequent processing.

Note: If you obtained the Toolkit as part of a CBPDO, you can use the RCPDO job found in the CBPDO RIMLIB data set to RECEIVE the Toolkit FMID HXML160, as well as information on each of the following (also included on the CBPDO tape):

1. service
2. HOLDATA

3. preventive service planning (PSP)

For more information, refer to the documentation included with the CBPDO.

6.1.7 Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries and Paths

Edit and submit sample job IXMALLOC to allocate the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for the Toolkit. IXMALLOC must be run from the Toolkit V1.6.0 relfiles. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

If you already have HXML140 or HXML150 installed, you still need to run IXMALLOC from the Toolkit V1.6.0 relfile. That will give you the larger data sets in order for you to copy Toolkit V1.4.0 or V1.5.0 data sets into the larger data sets allocated by the Toolkit V1.6.0 IXMALLOC job. After you have allocated the data sets to the correct size, the DDDEFs must reflect the new names, if you used new names of the data sets.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: The job is considered successful if return code zero is received.

The IXMISMKD job invokes IXMMKDIR exec to create the ixm directory under `-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp` where `-PathPrefix-` is the high level directory name. Insure the directory path `-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp` exists prior to running this job.

Edit and submit sample job IXMISMKD to allocate the HFS paths for the Toolkit. IXMISMKD must be run from the Toolkit V1.6.0 relfiles. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

If you plan to create a new HFS for this product, you should consider updating the BPXPRMxx PARMLIB member to mount the new HFS at IPL time. This may be helpful if an IPL occurs before the installation is complete.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: The job is considered successful if return code zero is received.

6.1.8 Create DDDEF Entries

Edit and submit sample job IXMDDDEF to create DDDEF entries for the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for the Toolkit. IXMDDDEF must be run from the Toolkit V1.6.0 relfiles.

SMP/E APPLY and ACCEPT processing for the Toolkit requires DDDEFs for SAMPLIB and ASAMPLIB since elements will be installed in these libraries. These libraries and DDDEFs are created during z/OS or OS/390 installation. DDDEFs are also required for SCEELKED and CSSLIB for CALLLIBS processing. These DDDEFs are created during z/OS or OS/390 installation. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: The job is considered successful if return code zero is received. Check the messages and ensure the DDDEFs were successfully created.

6.1.9 Perform SMP/E APPLY

Notes:

1. If Toolkit V1.4.0 or V1.5.0 were not previously installed, and you want them installed, the SMP/E APPLY step must be performed for levels V1.4.0, V1.5.0, and V1.6.0, since they are shipped together. If Toolkit V1.4.0 or V1.5.0 were previously installed, or you do not want them installed, V1.4.0 (HXML140) or V1.5.0 (HXML150) should be removed from the APPLY job.
2. If Toolkit V1.5.0 is removed and subsequently reinstalled, PTF UA04099 for APARs OA03241 and OA03895 will need to be reapplied. Also, if Toolkit V1.5.0 is being installed for the first time, PTF UA04099 for APARs OA03241 and OA03895 will need to be applied to Toolkit V1.5.0. Similarly, if Toolkit V1.4.0 is removed and subsequently reinstalled, PTF UW95866 for APAR OW56816 and PTF UA04043 for APARs OA03241 and OA03895, will need to be reapplied. Also, if Toolkit V1.4.0 is being installed for the first time, PTF UW95866 for APAR OW56816 and PTF UA04043 for APARs OA03241 and OA03895, will need to be applied to Toolkit V1.4.0.

Edit and submit sample job IXMAPPLY to perform an SMP/E APPLY CHECK for the Toolkit. IXMAPPLY must be run from Toolkit V1.6.0 refiles. Run the APPLY CHECK to identify any requisite service and additional holds (for example, HOLDSYS(DOC,EC)) that might need to be resolved before APPLY processing. Resolve any holds and receive any requisite service identified by the APPLY CHECK before the next step. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Because this job references the Toolkit HFS path `/usr/lpp/ixm/IBM/`, it must run on a system that has z/OS UNIX or OS/390 UNIX in full-function mode (with the shell and utilities available) and have access to the file system containing the path. Superuser status is required to preserve access permission bits. In addition, the user ID under which the job executes must be defined to use z/OS UNIX or OS/390 UNIX (in other words, must contain an OMVS segment).

Note: As of V1.6.0, once the installation of the Toolkit is complete, within the UNIX file system the owning userid of the Toolkit files and directories will be UID 0, and the owning group id will be the GID of the installer.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the APPLY CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the APPLY CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the APPLY.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E apply all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Note: When APPLYing HXML160, HXML150 and HXML140 together, you will receive NOT SELs for parts that are in those levels. The part will be selected for HXML160 and not selected for any lower levels the part was in. This is expected and acceptable. A similar situation will occur when APPLYing service to these parts.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY CHECK: The job is considered successful if return code zero is received.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY: For FMIDs HXML160, HXML150 and HXML140, which use SMP/E CALLLIBS, you will receive warning messages IEW2454W when the load modules are link edited into the SMPLTS data set. For example:

```
IEW2454W SYMBOL xxxxxxxx UNRESOLVED. NO AUTOCALL(NCAL) SPECIFIED
```

These warning messages are expected and are acceptable.

The job is considered successful if return code zero is received.

6.1.12 Verify Installation of Toolkit FMID HXML160

To verify that FMID HXML160 has installed correctly, run the following procedure:

1. Open the UNIX shell prompt.
2. Set up an environment variable to point to the location where the XML Parser, C++ Edition component was installed:

```
export XERCECROOT=/usr/lpp/ixm/IBM/xml4c-5_2
```

3. Type in the following command statements:

```
export LIBPATH=$XERCECROOT/lib:$LIBPATH
export ICU_DATA=$XERCECROOT/lib
export PATH=$XERCECROOT/bin:$PATH
```

4. Run the DOMPrint application from the \$XERCECROOT/bin directory by typing the following command statement:

```
DOMPrint -v=always -wenc=IBM-1047-s390 -wfpp=on $XERCECROOT/samples/data/personal.xml
```

This sample application should then parse the personal.xml file, construct the DOM tree, and invoke DOMWriter::writeNode() to serialize the resultant DOM tree back to an XML stream.

If you see the following sample output from DOMPrint, the Toolkit FMID HXML160 was installed correctly:

6.1.15 Perform SMP/E ACCEPT

Note: If Toolkit V1.4.0 or V1.5.0 were not previously installed, and you want them installed, the SMP/E ACCEPT step must be performed for levels V1.4.0, V1.5.0 and V1.6.0, since they are shipped together. If Toolkit V1.4.0 or V1.5.0 were previously installed, or you do not want them installed, V1.4.0 (HXML140) or V1.5.0 (HXML150) should be removed from the ACCEPT job.

Edit and submit sample job IXMACCEP to perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for the Toolkit. IXMACCEP must be run from the Toolkit V1.6.0 refiles. The ACCEPT CHECK processing will identify any requisite service and additional holds (for example, HOLDSYS(DOC,EC)) that may need to be resolved before ACCEPT processing. Resolve any holds, and RECEIVE and APPLY any requisite service identified by ACCEPT CHECK before the next step. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the ACCEPT CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Before using SMP/E to load new distribution libraries, it is recommended that you set the ACCJCLIN indicator in the distribution zone. This will cause entries produced from JCLIN to be saved in the distribution zone whenever a SYSMOD containing inline JCLIN is accepted. For more information on the ACCJCLIN indicator, see the description of inline JCLIN in the SMP/E manuals.

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the ACCEPT CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the ACCEPT.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E accept all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions. If you want SMP/E processing to exclude APARs and usermods, specify 'GROUPEXTEND(NOAPARS,NOUSERMODS)' with the ACCEPT command in the job.

Note: When ACCEPTing HXML160, HXML150 and HXML140 together, you will receive NOT SELs for parts that are in those levels. The part will be selected for HXML160 and not selected for any lower levels the part was in. This is expected and acceptable. A similar situation will occur when ACCEPTing service to these parts.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT CHECK: The job is considered successful if return code zero is received.

If PTFs containing replacement modules are being accepted, SMP/E ACCEPT processing will linkedit and bind the modules into the distribution libraries. During this processing, the linkage editor or binder may issue messages documenting unresolved external references, resulting in a return code of 4 from the ACCEPT step. These messages can be ignored, because the distribution libraries are not executable and the unresolved external references will not affect the executable system libraries.

6.1.16 Cleaning Up Obsolete Data Sets, Paths, and DDDEFs

There are no obsolete data sets, paths, or DDDEFs to delete in the Toolkit.

6.2 Activating the Toolkit

The Toolkit consists of a set of interfaces and conforms to various specifications that are necessary for activation. The following two tables presents a quick summary of the major features found in the XML Toolkit for z/OS V1.6.0 package. Symbols in the tables have the following meaning:

- "-": feature absent;
- "S": completely supported;
- "P": subset;
- "X": experimental;
- "N/A": not applicable.

Sample applications have also been provided to demonstrate the features of the Toolkit. The procedures required to set up and configure these sample applications for z/OS, OS/390, z/OS UNIX and OS/390 UNIX environments are described in the *XML Toolkit for z/OS User's Guide*.

6.2.1 Toolkit Activation Procedure Updates

This section provides a brief summary of the changes and updates to the Toolkit activation procedures for releases V1.6.0, V1.5.0, V1.4.0. Note that the changes are effective in the release they were implemented, as well as all subsequent releases. However, these changes are not effective for releases prior to the changed release. For example, changes implemented in V1.5.0 **DO NOT** apply to V1.4.0, but are applicable to V1.6.0. The following is a list of activation changes for each release of the Toolkit. For detailed descriptions of the activation procedures, see the *XML Toolkit for z/OS User's Guide*.

- V1.6.0
 - This release runs only on z/OS V1.2.0 or higher.
 - The XML Parser, C++ Edition now supports access to DTDs or schemas on a remote system via `http://` protocols. To enable this support, you must be able to make URL connections through your proxy server (make sure you do not have strict firewall settings which prevent URL connections).
 - The XML Parser, C++ Edition is now built with C++ Namespace support enabled. Therefore, your applications that link with the distributed binary packages must namespace qualify all the XML4C classes/data/variables with `xerces::` or add the `using namespace xerces` clause. For more information on utilizing C++ Namespace Support, see the Programming Guide section of the html documentation that comes with the Toolkit package.
 - The XSLT Processor, C++ Edition is now built with C++ Namespace support enabled. Therefore, your applications that link with the distributed binary packages must namespace qualify all the XSLT4C classes/data/variables with `xalanc::` or add the `using namespace xalanc` clause. For more information on utilizing C++ Namespace Support, see the Programming Guide section of the html documentation that comes with the Toolkit package.
 - The V1.6.0 XML4J Parser's `xmlParserAPIs.jar` file, even though it still exists, has been deprecated. It is replaced by the `xml-apis.jar` file. Eventually, `xmlParserAPIs` will be removed in a future release, so you should start using `xml-apis.jar` instead.

- Load modules now use PDSEs instead of PDSs; the JCLIN is removed as a result.
- Once the Toolkit installation is complete, within the UNIX file system, the owning userid of the Toolkit files and directories will be UID 0, and the owning group id will be the GID of the installer.
- The h1q.SIXMMOD1 load module name has been changed to h1q.SIXML0D1. Toolkit releases V1.4.0 and V1.5.0 still use h1q.SIXMMOD1,
- V1.5.0
 - This release runs only on z/OS V1.2.0 or higher.
 - Unicode Services activation instructions provided for XML Parser, C++ Edition.
 - Export statement changed in build instructions for XML Parser, C++ Edition z/OS UNIX and OS/390 UNIX environments.
- V1.4.0
 - A new export statement `export ICU_DATA=$XERCESSROOT/lib` is required for setting the library path for running XML Parser, C++ Edition and XSLT Processor, C++ Edition.
 - The XML Parser, Java Edition `xerces.jar` file has been replaced by two new files: `xercesImpl.jar` and `xmlParserAPIs.jar`.
 - The XSLT Processor, Java Edition `xerces.jar` file has been replaced by two new files: `xercesImpl.jar` and `xml-apis.jar`.
 - The naming conventions for the MVS native definition side-decks have been changed. They will no longer have the same name as the `.dll` files. Presented below is a list of the new names for the side-decks affected by this change:
 - IXM4C40X, instead of IXM4C40
 - IXM20UCX, instead of IXMI20UC
 - IXM2018X, instead of IXMI2018
 - IXMLC13X, instead of IXMLC13

6.2.2 z/OS Support for Unicode

Toolkits V1.6.0 and V1.5.0 can receive performance enhancements through z/OS support for Unicode. These services are not mandatory for installation of the Toolkit but will be utilized if z/OS support for Unicode is configured correctly. You will need to read and understand the instructions from *z/OS Support for Unicode: Using Conversion Services*, SA22-7649, available for download at:

If you are not currently using z/OS Support for Unicode, install the component as described in *z/OS Support for Unicode: Using Conversion Services*. When you get to chapter 3, "Creating the conversion environment", use the sample job provided with the XML Toolkit to create the conversion environment. Then follow the directions to activate the conversion environment. The Toolkit will now be able to take advantage of the services.

If you are currently using z/OS support for Unicode, you may have to make changes to your existing conversion environment. You will need to:

1. Locate the job you used to create your existing conversion environment.
2. Compare your existing job to the sample job provided with the Toolkit
3. Add any new control statements which do not exist in your current job.
4. If the the ccsid parameters are the same on any entry, but the techniques are different, then you must add the control statement with the different technique.
5. Create the new conversion environment.
6. Refer to chapter 4, "Changing the conversion environment" for instructions on how to activate the new conversion environment.

The following sample job is provided with the Toolkit to create the conversion environment.
