Applying Product Fixes to Sterling Gentran:Realtime

Introduction

IBM® Sterling Gentran:Realtime® for z/OS® product fixes can be ordered on CD-ROM, or they are available 24/7 on the Internet from the IBM® Sterling Customer Center Web site at: http://customer.sterlingcommerce.com.

In addition to the executable load modules for modified batch and online programs, the fix file contains current Error Message and Help files, modified Utility Source programs and JCL members, along with a Readme that describes the fixes that are included.

This document provides step-by-step instructions to install the fixes, including the Error Message, Help, Utility Source, and Readme files.

Note: The new Point Release feature, which displays the

current maintenance level on the EDIM000 Logon screen, uses CICS modules included with this fix. We recommend that you ALWAYS install Batch and CICS fixes at the same time, as instructed. If you do not, the Point Release displayed on your system may be

inaccurate.

Procedure

Note: If you are installing fixes using the Sterling

Gentran: Realtime product fix CD, perform **Step 1a**.

If you downloaded fixes from the Internet, perform **Step 1b**.

Step 1a Transfer files from the product fix CD-ROM to your PC.

Check the box next to each task as you complete it.

Insert the Sterling Gentran: Realtime product fix CD-ROM into your computer's
CD-ROM drive and navigate to locate the file named

Realtime_6.6.??_Fix.exe (where ?? represents the Point Release Number). This is a self-extracting .zip file that contains all of the Sterling Gentran:Realtime product fixes.

- Double-click the file name to begin extracting the files onto the local hard disk on your PC. A system message prompts you with a default folder name to which the system will save the files it extracts. If you want to select a different location, change the default folder name to your desired location in this system message.
- At the completion of the process, note the file location. The folder should contain the following files:

Step 5 Build the sequential Sterling Gentran:Realtime files on your mainframe.

This step reads the Sterling Gentran:Realtime product fix file that you uploaded in **Step 4** and extracts the files needed to complete the installation of the fixes on your mainframe.

The following table lists the data sets that will be extracted.

Data Set Name	Description
GENTRAN.V6X6.RTE.BATCH.LOAD.FIX	Partitioned data set that contains all of the batch program load modules that have been changed.
GENTRAN.V6X6.RTE.CICS.LOAD.FIX	Partitioned data set that contains all of the CICS program load modules that have been changed.
GENTRAN.V6X6.SEQ.ERRCTL	Sequential data containing the content of the Error Message and Control file.
GENTRAN.V6X6.RTE.JCL.FIX	Partitioned data set that contains all of the execution JCL members that have been changed.
GENTRAN.V6X6.RTE.README	Sequential data set containing information about product fixes.
GENTRAN.V6X6.RTE.UTILITY.SOURCE.FIX	Partitioned data set that contains source code of all the utility programs that have been changed.
GENTRAN.V6X6.SEQ.EDI.EDIHELP	Sequential data set containing the content of the Help file.

Customize JCL member PCRTEFX2 that you uploaded in Step 2.

Change the data set names as required by your installation. Change only the first two index levels (GENTRAN. V6X6). If you are installing Sterling Gentran:Realtime, it is important that you use the same high-level qualifier that was used in the installation process.

Read the comments within the JCL and follow any additional instructions.

Submit the job and verify the job results. You should never receive a return code greater than 0.

Step 6 Merge fix files with existing files.

Important: This section provides a recommend method to merge fixed modules and members with the originals. This section is based on the assumption that you have followed recommendations to change only the first two index levels of each data set name (GENTRAN.V6X6) during installation. If you maintain your load modules using different naming conventions, you should adjust these steps to meet your needs.

Check the box next to each task as you complete it.

Copy members (with Replace) from the .FIX libraries to the corresponding original libraries. Make backup copies of the original libraries first, in the event that you need to reverse the changes.
