Purpose

The purpose of this document is to provide instructions for installing the Standards that you received with IBM® Sterling Gentran:Server® for iSeries® Release 3.6.

Note

The DWNSTD job does not have to be run by the QSECOFR user. However, the user must have authority access to the CRTLIB and RSTOBJ iSeries commands that will be used during the job.

Installing Standards

Use the following procedure to install the Standards. You may either add new standards to your online versions or replace all of your online standards with a different list of versions.

1. If installing from CD-ROM, load the Standards CD-ROM. The Standards CD-ROM volume ID is GSISTD.

If installing from save files, download the Standards save file onto your iSeries. Refer to the instructions for downloading standards from a save file.

2. For Standards, type **DWNSTD** on the command line and press **F4** (prompt).

- 3. Type the device name where the CD-ROM is loaded, or type ***SAVF** if restoring from a save file.
- 4. Specify the name of the library where the standards should be loaded (G3X6DTA is the default name).
- 5. Use this table to determine what value to enter in the Add or Replace Standards field.

You want to add new standards to your online standards,	type *add.
You want to replace your on-line standards with a new list of versions,	type *replace.

- 6. If you are restoring Standards from a save file, enter the library name where your GSISTD save file exists.
- 7. Press **Enter** when you have entered all of the options.

- 9. Type 1 (Select) beside all versions that you want to add or to replace on this screen. After you have made all your selections on this screen, press **Enter**. Press **Page Down** to view the next screen of versions. Continue to make your selections by typing 1 (Select) and then pressing **Enter** only after you have selected all the versions on that screen.
- 10. Press F3 when you have finished selecting the versions you wish to add or replace.

The download process runs interactively and displays a message when complete.
