IBM® Sterling Gentran:Server® for Microsoft Windows Extension for SAP provides Multiple Host/Client functionality. This release is compatible with Sterling Gentran:Server release 5.3 and assists you in your e-business solution implementations of SAP.

Before You Begin

Introduction	This section describes requirements that you must meet before you begin the Extension for SAP installation.
Pre-installation requirements	The following are pre-installation requirements:
	• You must already have SAP installed.
	• You must have installed Sterling Gentran:Server 5.3.
	 Identify the name of the database and ODBC data source that you created for your Sterling Gentran:Server system. The Extension for SAP installation program automatically creates tables within this database during the install process.
	• Identify the ODBC user ID and password that you want the Extension for SAP to use to log on to the database.
	Note This user ID must have full access to the Extension for SAP database. We recommend that you set it to be the same as an existing Sterling Gentran:Server user.
	• Identify the database user or group for which you want to grant access to the tables.
	• Exit all Windows programs before running the setup program.
	• Run the setup program on the Sterling Gentran:Server primary system controller.
	• Ensure that Sterling Gentran:Server is installed on your Sterling Gentran:Server computer.
	Recommendation We recommend that you grant access to the users in your EDI group.

How to Download the Extension for SAP from the Internet

Introduction

These instructions contain procedures for downloading the Extension for SAP components from the Internet.

Downloading the Application File

To download the archive file:

Step	Action
1	In the E-mail message you received from IBM, click the link to the Electronic Software Distribution Download Area.
2	In the Security Alert dialog box, click Yes.
3	On the Login page, type the following information: w IBM order number w Company name w Customer ID
4	Click Login, and the system displays the Download Area.
5	Locate Gentran:Server for Windows, version 5.3 and click Download.
6	In the File Download dialog box, click Save.
7	When the Save As dialog box opens, save the archive file to the C:\ drive. Note If Internet Explorer adds a number in brackets to the name of the downloaded file (for example, gsw53[1]_sap_cd.zip), rename the file on the Microsoft Windows system before you transfer it to the system where it will be installed.
8	Right-click the archive file icon, and extract the file to an empty directory. Note A folder named SAP_cd is created.

How to Install/Upgrade the Extension for SAP from CD

Introduction

This section describes how to install and/or upgrade the Extension for SAP.

Note

If you ever need to re-install Sterling Gentran:Server, you must also re-install the Extension for SAP.

Note

The installation program displays a warning message if you try to exit the setup program before setup is complete. Click **Exit Setup** to exit the installation program or click **Resume** to continue with installation.

Use this procedure to install or upgrade the Sterling Gentran:Server Extension for SAP.

How to install or upgrade the extension

Step	Action
1	If you are installing from CD-ROM, complete the following:
	a. Insert the Sterling Gentran:Server Extension for SAP CD in the CD-ROM drive on your primary system controller.
	b. If Autorun is disabled on this machine, select Run from the Start menu and continue with c . Otherwise, continue with Step 3 .
	c. Browse to the CD-ROM drive and run setup.exe file on the disk to initiate the installation.
	System Response The setup program prepares a wizard to guide you through the installation program, and then displays the Welcome dialog box. Continue with Step 3 .
	Note The software may take several seconds to prepare the wizard.
2	If you are installing from the Internet, browse to the SAP_cd folder and run setup.exe .
	System Response Setup begins. The system displays the Welcome dialog. The installation wizard guides you through the installation process. Continue with Step 3 .
3	Click Next.
	Note If the Sterling Gentran:Server Executive service is currently running on this machine, the system prompts you to stop the service so installation can proceed.

(Contd) Step	Action
4	Click OK and then click Yes to stop the service and continue with the next step.
5	Are you installing the Extension for SAP for the first time?
	W If <i>yes</i>, the system displays the Database Logon dialog box.Continue with Step 8.
	w If <i>no</i> (you are upgrading your SAP installation), the system displays the Select Components dialog box. Continue with Step 6 .
6	Verify that Install/Replace the existing SAP Extension is selected and click Next .
	System response The system displays the Database Access dialog box. Continue with Step 10 .
7	Click Next.
	System Response The system displays the Database Logon dialog box.
8	Type the name of the user ID and password used to log on to the Extension for SAP database and click Next .
	System Response The system displays either the ODBC Data Source Name dialog box (Step 9) or the Database Access dialog box (Step 10).
	Note When you install the Extension for SAP on your primary system controller, the installation program can automatically obtain the ODBC data source information it needs from your Sterling Gentran:Server registry. Therefore, it can skip the ODBC Data Source Name dialog.
9	Type the name of the ODBC data source and click Next .
	System Response The system displays the Database Access dialog box.
10	Type the name of the security group for which you want to grant access rights to the database table for the extension and click Next .
	System Response The system asks you if you want to install the SAP sample maps.

(Contd) Step	Action
11	Click Yes to install the sample maps.
	The system installs the maps and restarts the Sterling Gentran:Server Executive service (if this service was executing prior to installation). The system then informs you that installation is complete.
12	Click OK to complete setup.
