Introduction to Voice-Based Systems

In today's world, businesses face multiple challenges. Supply chains are becoming bigger, more complex, and time critical. Businesses continuously strive to keep pace with increasing customer demands, while keeping their operating costs low. These challenges apply to warehouses that are an integral part of the supply chain as well. An efficient warehouse management system enables a business to achieve better productivity. Many businesses have now recognized the benefits of using voice technology for warehouse-related tasks such as picking, replenishment, and putaway.

A voice-based system includes a mobile headset unit that can be used by warehouse users. These users do not have to hold a bar code scanner to perform picking activity, and do not have to take their eyes off the task they are performing to read the system prompts that appear on the barcode screen. This translates to immediate time and productivity gains in the overall warehouse process.

Users can not only receive voice instructions, but can also confirm their actions back to the system orally. A primary advantage of voice-based systems is the short training period associated with learning how to operate them. Additionally, users can send and receive instructions in their native language. Voice-based systems also increase accuracy because of real-time communication. They are ideal for use in locations with freezers, where users wear gloves and find it difficult to carry the bar code scanner in their hands. It is also ideal for use in high-rise locations because users' hands remain free, improving their accuracy and productivity.

Understanding Voice-Based Picking

Picking activity, which was traditionally performed using either papers or a radio frequency (RF) mobile device, can now be performed using voice technology. A warehouse user no longer has to read the instructions from either a paper or an RF device. Instead, the user wears a headset with an attached microphone, and listens to the picking instructions given by the system in the form of voice prompts.

A user receives a voice prompt from the system about the source location to visit, the number of items to pick from that location, and the destination at which to deposit the picked items. Accordingly, the user visits the corresponding location, performs the picking task, and deposits the picked items. After the task is completed, the user orally confirms to the system that the action is completed. This serves as an indicator to the system that the next picking task can be assigned to the user.

In order to enable voice-based picking activity in a warehouse, and ensure user safety, the Sterling Warehouse ManagementTM System has integrated with Voxware's VoiceLogistics ProTM (VLP).

Advantages of VoiceLogistics Pro

The Sterling Warehouse Management System supports voice-based picking by integrating with Voxware's VoiceLogistics Pro, which provides user-defined, customizable workflows that match individual business requirements.

Following are some of the advantages of integrating the Sterling Warehouse Management System with Voxware:

♦ Voxware provides voice-driven software products that optimize the full spectrum of warehouse operations for greater accuracy, productivity, and flexibility in supply chain execution.

- ♦ Voxware provides a powerful suite of tools that can be used to design and implement voice-enabled warehouse and distribution center logistic solutions that manage activities such as picking, receiving, and replenishment.
- ♦ Voxware combines configurable solutions with voice-enabled technology to improve the productivity and accuracy of a warehouse.

Stack for Installing the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro Integration Pack

The Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro integration pack is supported on the following stack:

- ◆ Database server Oracle[®] 9i and later.
- ◆ Application server Apache TomcatTM 5.0.
- ◆ Operating system Windows® Server 2003
- ♦ JavaTM plug-in JDK 1.5

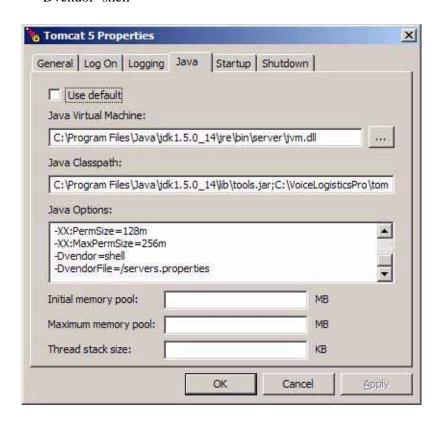
Prerequisites for the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro Integration Pack

The Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro integration pack is certified on VLP 2.1.3.5.

Notes:

- ♦ VLP is not bundled with the Sterling Warehouse Management System. Install VLP on your system using the instructions provided in the *VLP Bookshelf Guide*.
- ◆ Ensure that you have the Sterling Warehouse Management System, version 8.5, installed on your system.
- ♦ By default, VLP installs and points to JDK 1.4.2, which is installed as part of VLP installation. For the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro integration pack, point the environment to either JRE 1.5 or to a later version. For the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro integration pack, the environment variable JAVA_HOME should point to JDK 1.5.
- ♦ Ensure that you have performed the following tasks:
 - a. Navigate to the <VOX_HOME>/vlp_core/src/voxconnect_ext directory path
 - b. Open the build.xml file
 - c. Go to target voxconnectextensions
 - d. add source parameter in javac task as:
 - e. <javac destdir="\${build}" debug="true" debuglevel="lines,vars,source"
 source="1.4">
- ♦ When configuring the Tomcat service properties, navigate to the Java tab, configure the Java Virtual Machine (JVM) parameter to point to JDK 1.5, and under Java Options, add the following properties as shown in the image that follows: Also ensure that your environment variable points to JDK 1.5.
 - DvendorFile=/servers.properties

◆ -Dvendor=shell



Install the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro Integration Pack

Perform the following steps to install the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP) integration pack:

- 1. Place the Sterling Warehouse Management System, version 8.5, installation CD in the appropriate drive.
- 2. From the installation CD, copy the WMS_Add-in.jar file, and unzip it to a temporary folder.
- 3. Copy the SterlingVoxwareIntegrationPack.zip file to a new folder in the machine where the VLP is installed.
- 4. Unzip the SterlingVoxwareIntegrationPack.zip file in this folder.
- 5. Save the ynw_vox_variable.properties.sample file as ynw_vox_variable.properties.
- 6. Open the /resources/ynw_vox_variable.properties file in any text editor, such as the Notepad, and perform the following tasks:
 - Set the value of the voxhome property to the path of the VLP's installation folder.
 - Set the value of the ynw.voxware.dbtype property to the database type used by VLP, for example, if VLP is installed in Oracle, set it to oracle.
 - Set the value of the ynw.voxware.dbdriver property to the database driver's classname in order to connect it to the VLP database, for example, ynw.voxware.dbdriver=oracle.jdbc.OracleDriver
 - Set the value of the ynw.voxware.dbjar property to the driver jar or zip to connect it to the VLP database, for example,

```
ynw.voxware.dbjar=c\:/sterling/dbjar/jdbc/Oracle/ojdbc14.jar
```

• Set the value of the ynw.voxware.dbPool.url property to the connection URL to connect it to the VLP database, for example,

```
ynw.voxware.dbPool.url=jdbc:oracle:thin:@10.11.20.80:1521:orcl
```

• Set the value of the ynw.common.folder.root property to the same folder path that is specified in the Completion Directory property of the File I/O component in the data upload services, as described in the topic on *Configure Data Upload and Import Services*.

If it is a network path, the property should be configured as follows:

```
ynw.common.folder.root=\\\\<root>\\VoicePicking\\Completed
```

If it is an absolute path, the property should be configured as follows:

```
ynw.common.folder.root=c\:/VoicePicking/Completed
```

• Set the value of the ynw.move.folder.root property to a folder path to which the data upload files are to be moved after data import is complete from VLP side.

If it is a network path, the property should be configured as follows:

```
ynw.move.folder.root=\\\\<root>\\VoicePicking\\Done
```

If it is an absolute path, the property should be configured as follows:

```
ynw.move.folder.root=c\:/VoicePicking/Done
```

7. Open the /resources/yifclient.properties file and set the following values:

- yif.apifactory.protocol=HTTP
- yif.httpapi.url=http://<hostname>:<portnumber>/smcfs/interop/VoiceInteropHttpServlet In this instance,
 - hostname is the computer name or IP address of the computer where the Sterling Warehouse Management System is installed.
 - portnumber is the listening port of the computer where the Sterling Warehouse Management System is installed.

Note: For more information about how to configure a secured communication between the Sterling Warehouse Management System and VLP, refer to the topic *Security for Voice Integration*

8. Execute the following command in the folder in which the SterlingVoxwareIntegrationPack.zip file was unzipped:

ant -f ynw_voxware_installer.xml

Deploy the Sterling Picking Workflow

Perform the following steps to deploy the Sterling Picking workflow:

- 1. Open Voxware's VoxStudio using the default user name SUPERVISOR and default password voxware.
- 2. The VoxStudio user interface is displayed. From the menu bar, navigate to File > Open Workflow Group.
- 3. The Create dialog box is displayed. Browse to <voxhome>/SterlingPickingWorkflow\workflow\STERLING_VOICE_WORKFLOWS, select
 STERLING VOICE WORKFLOWS.wsf from the list, and click Open.
- 4. The PICKING workflow is displayed in the VoxStudio workspace. From the Languages panel of the PICKING workflow, select the American English check box, and navigate to File > Save Workflow Group.

Note:

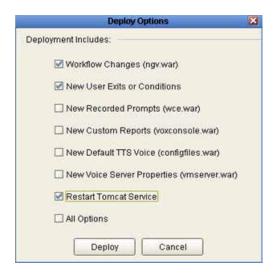
Only the English language is supported for the out-of-the-box PICKING workflow. Localization to other language will require customization. For more information about customization, please contact Sterling Customer Support.

- 5. From the VoxStudio menu bar, navigate to Edit > Grammar. The Languages dialog box is displayed. Select a language from the drop-down list, and click OK.
- 6. The editing window opens. Remove the contents of this file, paste the contents of the DemoPicking.grm file into this file, and save the file.

Notes:

- The DemoPicking.grm file is provided by Sterling Warehouse Management System for defining the grammar for the PICKING workflow. This file is present in the <voxhome>/SterlingPickingWorkflow/grammar folder.
- Out-of-the-box, the grammar file supports only numeric strings or digits for CaseID, PalletID, SerialNo, Tag Attributes, Zone Check Digit, Equipment Check, and Task Type ID. Grammar can be customized to support alpha-numeric values. In order to do so, please contact Sterling Customer Support.
- 7. From the VoxStudio menu bar, navigate to File > Deploy.

8. The Deploy Options dialog box is displayed. Select the Workflow Changes, New User Exits or Conditions, and the Restart Tomcat Service check boxes, and click Deploy.



Configure Data Upload and Import Services

In order to execute workflows, VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP) must possess certain details about the Sterling Warehouse Management System's configuration, for example, the warehouse, the locations and zones, the users of the warehouse, and the equipments being used. This chapter describes the steps involved in synchronizing data between the Sterling Warehouse Management System and its associated voice instance.

The configuration data is transferred from the Sterling Warehouse Management System to VLP using XML files. Both the Sterling Warehouse Management System and the corresponding VLP instances must have access to the common folder containing these XML files.

Details pertaining to the following are required for voice-based task execution:

- ♦ Ship Node
- **♦** Zone
- ◆ Location
- ◆ Task Type
- ♦ Equipment
- **♦** Execution Exception
- ◆ Item

Data synchronization between the Sterling Warehouse Management System and VLP is based on a shared folder mechanism and involves the following steps:

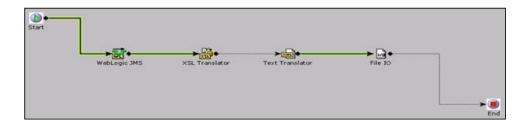
- 1. Uploading the Sterling Warehouse Management System configuration data as XML files to the shared folder.
- 2. Importing (reading) the XML file from the shared folder to VLP.

Upload the Sterling Warehouse Management System Configuration Data as XML Files

The Sterling Warehouse Management System provides data upload services for each configuration data entity. Each service extracts the Sterling Warehouse Management System configuration data, converts it to a data format that is understood by VLP, and uploads the data as an XML file to a shared folder.

Data Upload Mechanism

All the upload services have a common structure, and are asynchronous services. The following figure illustrates a typical service.



Each upload service consists of the following components:

- **♦** JMS
- **♦** XSL Translator
- ◆ Text Translator and File I/O

The data is first sent to the JMS queue as a request in the Sterling XML format. The data that is posted to the queue is controlled by a template that is provided out-of-the-box by the Sterling Warehouse Management System.

A common integration server is configured for these services, which picks up the request from the JMS queue, and passes it to the XSL Translator. This Translator converts the data to VLP XML format. Finally, the Text Translator and the File I/O Components write the data to an XML file in the common shared folder.

Data Upload Services

The Sterling Warehouse Management System provides the following out-of-the-box data upload services:

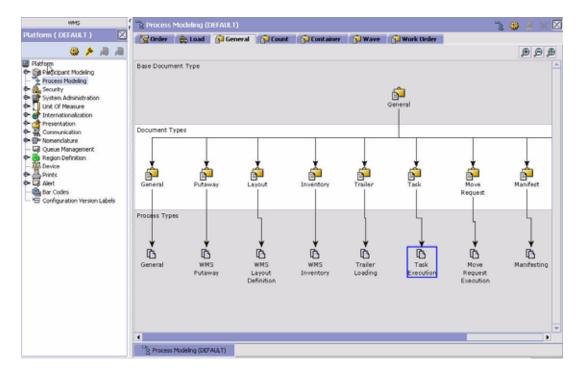
- ◆ YNW_ShipNodeDataExporter_85
- ♦ YNW_ZoneDataExporter_85
- ◆ YNW_LocationDataExporter_85
- ♦ YNW TaskTypeDataExporter 85
- ◆ YNW_ EquipmentDataExporter_85
- ◆ YNW_ExecutionExceptionDataExporter_85
- ♦ YNW_ItemDataExporter_85

To view these data upload services, perform these steps:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Application Platform.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, double-click Process Modeling.
- 3. The Process Modeling window (shown is the following figure) is displayed. Click the General tab. This displays the hierarchy of the document and process types.

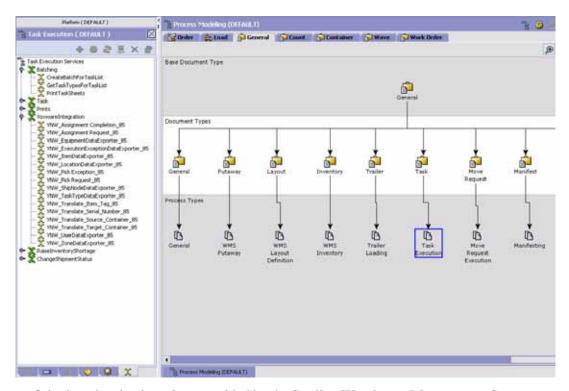
4. Double-click Task Execution.

This displays the transactions in the application rules side panel.



- 6. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click VoxwareIntegration.

7. The tree is expanded as shown in the following figure. Double-click the data upload service whose details you want to view.



The out-of-the-box data load services provided by the Sterling Warehouse Management System are system defined, and cannot be modified. Users must use these services as templates, and create new services using the Save As option. After the new service is created, associate it to the configured voice application instance. For more information about how to Save As a service, refer to the *Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Application Platform Configuration Guide*. To create the new services, set the following properties:

- → JMS Component This component has two sub-components, JMS Sender and JMS Receiver.
 Note: You can modify the integration server that is configured with the JMS Receiver (placed under the Server tab that is displayed when the JMS Receiver is selected).
- ♦ XSL Translator The XSL name is provided out-of-the-box. You should not modify this unless they intend to customize the data.
- ◆ Text Translator and File I/O Component These two components are connected by the File I/O Sender Component. Set the following properties for the File I/O Sender Component:
 - Working Directory The folder that is used by the data upload service while writing the XML file.
 - Completion Directory The completed XML files are placed in this directory. This directory should be the common, shared directory that is accessed by both the Sterling Warehouse Management System and VLP.

Note: These properties have to be set for all the data upload services.

Import XML Files to VoiceLogistics Pro

The data upload services of the Sterling Warehouse Management System write data in VLP-compatible XMLs. VLP provides data import events that read the XML files and load them into the VLP database, for example, VLP_ZONE_LOAD (Import Zone), that is used to import data pertaining to zones.

All the required VLP data import events are associated to the Sterling Local XML Reader transports, that are provided as part of the Sterling-VoiceLogistics Pro integration pack.

The underlying transport type imports the XML files to VLP in the following manner:

- 1. Reads the configuration data XML from the common shared folder.
- 2. Creates the VLPMessage Java object from these XMLs.
- 3. Uses this Java object to load the data into VLP tables.

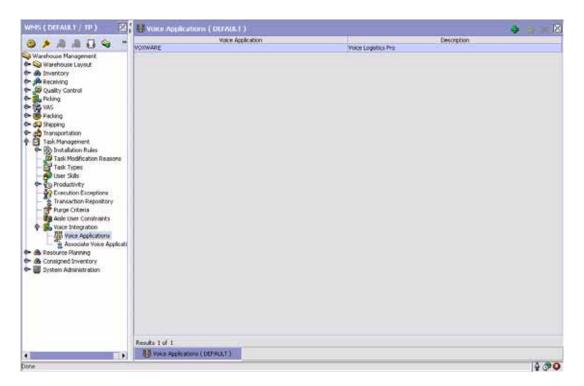
Configuring a Voice Application

Voice application refers to an external voice solution provider used for the voice pick operation.

Create a Voice Application

Perform the following steps to create a voice application:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. Click •





The following table describes the fields in the Voice Application Details dialog box.

Field	Description	
Voice Application	Mandatory. Enter the name of the external voice solution provider.	
Description	Enter a brief description of the voice application.	

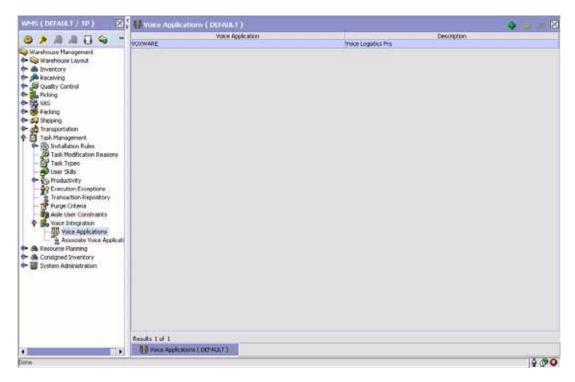
Note: An out-of-the-box voice application, VOXWARE, is provided in the Sterling Warehouse Management System Applications Manager. It is recommended that users use this voice application because all the integration parameters that are required for integration with the Sterling Warehouse Management System are provided with this out-of-the-box voice application.

View Voice Application Details

Perform the following steps to view the details pertaining to the voice application:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.

4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. From the list that is displayed in this panel, double-click the voice application whose details you want to view.



The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed.



The following table describes the fields in the Voice Application Details dialog box.

Field	Description
Voice Application	Displays the voiceapplication name.
Description	Displays the description of the voice application.

The following table describes the fields in the Voice Application Instance tab in the Voice Application Details dialog box.

Note: Multiple voice instances can be defined for a voice application.

Field	Description
Instance ID	Displays the identifier of the instance of the selected voice application.
Description	Displays the description of the voice application instance.

The following table describes the fields in the Voice Work Flow tab in the Voice Application Details dialog box.

Note: Multiple workflows can be defined for a voice application.

Field	Description
Workflow ID	Displays the identifier pertaining to the workflow of the selected voice application.
Description	Displays the description of the voice workflow.

Modify a Voice Application

Perform the following steps to modify a voice application:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. From the list that is displayed in this panel, select the voice application whose information you want to modify, and click.

Delete a Voice Application

Note that the VOXWARE voice application that is system defined cannot be deleted.

Perform the following steps to delete a voice application:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management System.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. From the list displayed in this panel, select the voice application that you want to delete, and click ...
- 5. A confirmation dialog box is displayed. Select OK to confirm the deletion of the voice application.

Configuring a Voice Application Instance

A voice application instance represents the server that hosts the external voice application. Multiple instances can be defined for a voice application. However, only one instance can be associated with a ship node.

Create a Voice Application Instance

Perform the following steps to create a voice application instance:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent to Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. From the list that is displayed in this panel, double-click the voice application for which you want to create an instance.
- 5. The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed. Click the Voice Application Instance tab.
- 6. In the Voice Application Instance panel, click .





The following table describes the fields in the Voice Application Instance Details dialog box.

Field	Description
Voice Application	Displays the identifier of the selected voice application for which you are creating a voice application instance.
Voice Application Instance	Mandatory. Enter a name for the voice application instance that you are creating.
Description	Enter a brief description of the voice application instance.

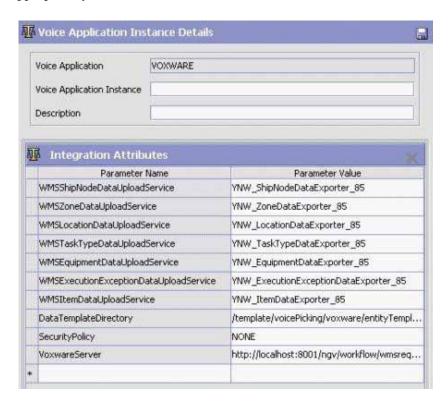
The Integration Attributes panel in the Voice Application Instance Details dialog box helps you to define the various parameters that are required for a voice instance to integrate with the external voice solution providers.

The following table describes the fields in the Integration Attributes panel of the Voice Application Instance Details dialog box.

Field	Description
Parameter Name	Enter a name for the integration parameter.
Parameter Value	Enter a value for the integration parameter.

Note: If you are setting instance attributes for the predefined VOXWARE voice application, note that all the data load services for VoiceLogistics Pro are provided out-of-the-box in this integration. However, a user can override the out-of-the-box data load service with custom service.

If you are working with the out-of-the-box VOXWARE voice application, the integration parameters, as displayed in the following figure, are provided. The values of these parameters should be configured appropriately.



The following table describes the fields in the Integration Attributes panel of the Voice Application Instance Details dialog box.

Note: When you select a Parameter Name field, the corresponding Parameter Value field gets activated. Continue this process of associating Parameter Names with Parameter Values depending on the number of integration attributes you want to set for a voice instance.

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications window is displayed. Double-click the voice application that contains the instance information that you want to modify.

- 5. The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed. Click the Voice Application Instance tab.
- 6. The Voice Application Instance panel is displayed. From the list displayed in this panel, select the instance whose information you want to modify, and click ...
- 7. The Voice Application Instance Details dialog box is displayed. Make the necessary changes, and click

Delete a Voice Application Instance

Perform the following steps to delete a voice application instance:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- The tree is expanded. Click adjacent Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. Double-click the voice application that contains the instance that you want to delete.
- 5. The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed. Click the Voice Application Instance tab.
- 6. The Voice Application Instance panel is displayed. Select the instance that you want to delete, and click ...

A voice workflow represents a series of activities and voice-based dialogs required to manage and control the business processes of an external voice application.

Note: A workflow can be associated to multiple activity groups and activity codes.

- 4. The Voice Applications window is displayed. Double-click the voice application for which you want to create a workflow.
- 5. The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed. Click the Voice Work Flow tab.
- 6. The Voice Work Flow panel is displayed. Click <table-cell-rows>

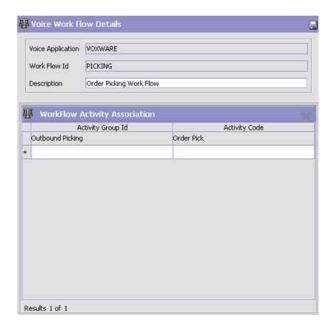

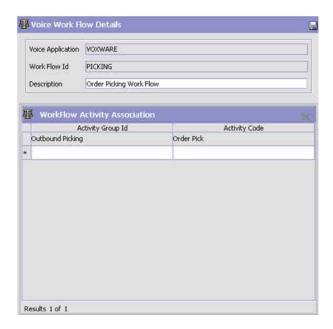

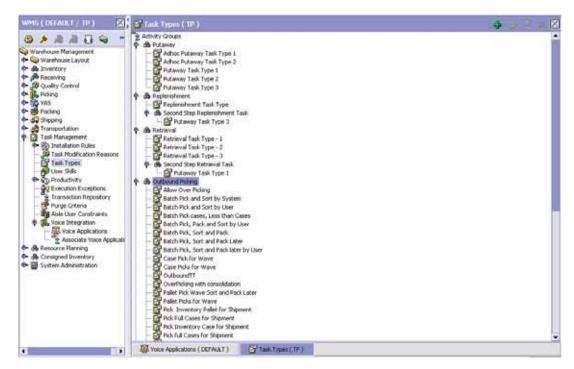

Associate a Task Type with a Voice Workflow

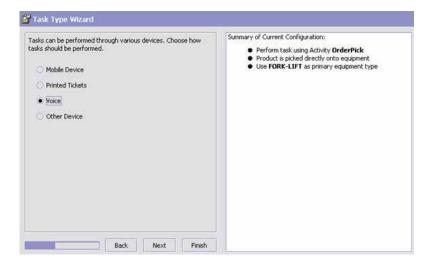

5. The Task Type wizard is displayed. In the Task Type field, enter a name for the task type. In the Description field, enter a description of the Task Type. (This description will be displayed in the Task Types tree.) From the Activity drop-down list, select an activity. (The items that are displayed in this list correspond to the activity group for which you are configuring a task type.) Click Next and configure all the screens by referring to the *Sterling Warehouse Management System: Configuration Guide* until you reach the screen where you can configure a device for performing the outbound picking task.

Note: When configuiring a task type, do not enter the value 00 for the Task Type because this value is treated as a dummy value.

6. In the screen that is displayed, select Voice. This configures the task type to use voice. Click Next. Note: Voice will be displayed as an option in the Task Type wizard only when a voice application instance is defined for the out-of-the-box VOXWARE voice application (at the Hub level (DEFAULT)), and is associated to the node.



7. In the screen that is displayed, select a workflow from the Voice Workflow drop-down list, based on which the tasks belonging to this task type will be performed.

Note: The Voice Workflow drop-down list contains only those workflows that are associated with the selected activity group and activity code, for example, if you select Outbound Picking as the activity group, only the workflows associated with Outbound Picking will be populated in the Voice Workflow drop-down list.

New Barcode Types for Task Execution

In order to translate check digits of different data such as Container ID, Serial Number, and Tag Attributes, the following barcode types have been introduced in the Sterling Warehouse Management System.

Target Container Input for Voice Picking

The Barcode Translation Sources that are provided out-of-the-box for the Target Container Input For Voice Picking barcode type are as follows:

- ◆ Target Container Check Digit Scan This translator looks for any Container ID whose last 5 digits is the input barcode data.
- ♦ Case ID The Case ID source validates if the scanned data is an existing Case SCM in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. If this case contains only a single item, the source returns item details such as Item ID, unit of measure, and quantity
- ◆ Pallet ID The Pallet ID source validates if the scanned data is an existing Pallet SCM in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. If this pallet contains only a single item, the source returns item details like Item ID, unit of measure, and quantity.
- ♦ UCC 128 Code This is a widely used barcode standard. UCC 128 Code source validates if the scanned data conforms to the UCC 128 standards.
- ♦ Generate 20-digit Container Number This source generates a 20-digit Container ID, with the last five digits being the barcode data passed. This source internally invokes the generateSCM API to generate the first 15 digits of the Container ID.

Source Container Input for Voice Picking

The Barcode Translation Sources that are provided out-of-the-box for the Source Container Input For Voice Picking barcode type are as follows:

- ♦ Source Container Check Digit Scan This translator looks for any Container ID whose last 5 digits is the input barcode data.
- ◆ Case ID The Case ID source validates if the scanned data is an existing Case SCM in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. If this case contains only a single item, the source returns item details such as Item ID, unit of measure, and quantity
- ◆ Pallet ID The Pallet ID source validates if the scanned data is an existing Pallet SCM in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. If this pallet contains only a single item, the source returns item details like Item ID, unit of measure, and quantity.
- ◆ UCC 128 Code This is a widely used barcode standard. UCC 128 Code source validates if the scanned data conforms to the UCC 128 standards.
- ♦ Generate 20-digit Container Number This source generates a 20-digit Container ID, with the last five digits being the barcode data passed. This source internally invokes the generateSCM API to generate the first 15 digits of the Container ID.

Serial Input for Voice Picking

The Barcode Translation Source that is provided out-of-the-box for the Serial Input For Voice Picking barcode type is as follows:

Serial Number for Voice Pick - This source validates whether the scanned data is the last five digits of a valid serial number in the Sterling Warehouse Management System.

Item Tag Input for Voice Picking

The Barcode Translation Source that is provided out-of-the-box for the Item Tag Input For Voice Picking barcode type is as follows:

Item Tag for Voice Pick - This source validates whether the scanned data is the last five digits of one of the tag attributes of the selected item.

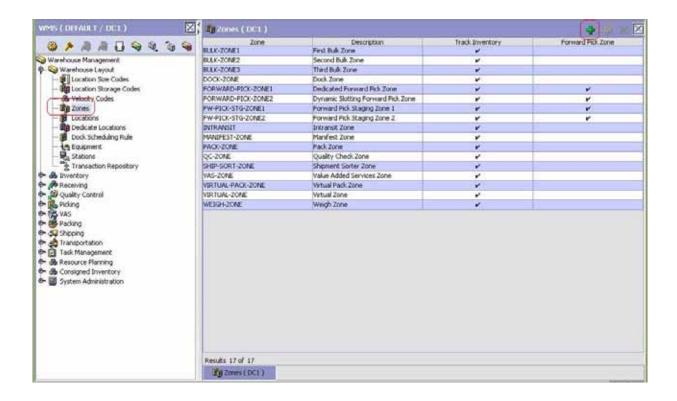

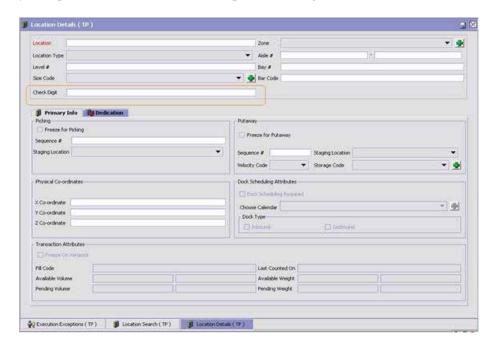

Note: Out-of-the-box, the grammar file supports only numeric strings or digits for Case ID, Pallet ID, Serial No, Tag Attributes, Zone Check Digit, Equipment Check, and Task Type ID. The grammar file can be customized to support alphanumeric values. If you want to do so, please contact Sterling Customer Support.

Location Mass Maintenance

Warehouse managers can use the Sterling Warehouse Management System to update the attributes of a set of locations simultaneously. Location mass maintenance supports a mass maintenance mechanism to compute and maintain the Location Check Digits.

Perform the following steps to configure the check digits for computing locations:

1. Log in to the Sterling Multi-Channel Fulfillment Solution Consoles, and from the menu bar, navigate to Inventory > Location Mass Maintenance.

2. The Location Mass Maintenance window is displayed, as shown here. Select the Compute Check Digit check box, and click Save.

Location check digit computation is a customized solution, and the

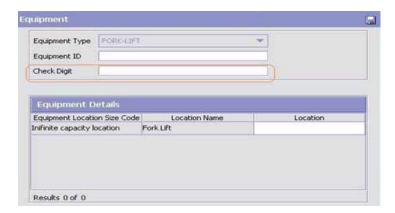

Perform the following steps to configure an equipment check digit:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Warehouse Layout.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Double-click Equipment.
- 4. The Equipment window is displayed. From the list, select the Equipment Type for which the equipment is to be created, and click .
- 5. The Equipment dialog box is displayed. Enter a check digit for the equipment in the Check Digit field. Enter information in the applicable fields, and click . For field value descriptions, refer to the *Sterling Warehouse Management System Configuration Guide*.

Configure Pick Execution Exception Reason Code Check Digit

The pick execution exception codes, which are used in a warehouse to identify a particular execution exception reason, are usually long, and contain alphanumeric strings. Long strings such as these are not recommended in voice-based systems because the chances of an error occurring are high. In order to avoid such errors, a shorter version of the code, known as a check digit, is used. Check digits are usually 2-5 digits long, easy to read, and are used to identify a given execution exception reason code.

For more information about check digits, refer to the *VLP Bookshelf Guide*. Use the instructions provided in this guide to configure the pick execution exception codes check digits to upload records in VLP.

Perform the following steps to configure a pick execution exception reason code check digit:

- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management System.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Double-click Execution Exceptions.
- 4. The Execution Exception window is displayed. By default, the Pick tab is selected. If this tab is not selected, click the Pick tab.
- 5. The Execution Exception panel for Pick tasks is displayed. Click 📌.
- 6. The Execution Exception Code Details dialog box is displayed. Enter a check digit for the pick execution exception reason code in the Check Digit field. Enter information in the applicable fields,
 - and click . For field value descriptions, see the *Sterling Warehouse Management System Configuration Guide*.



Note: Out-of-the-box, the grammar file supports only numeric responses for pick execution exception codes (short or skip reason) check-digits. The grammar file can be customized to support alphanumeric values. If you want to do so, please contact Sterling Customer Support.

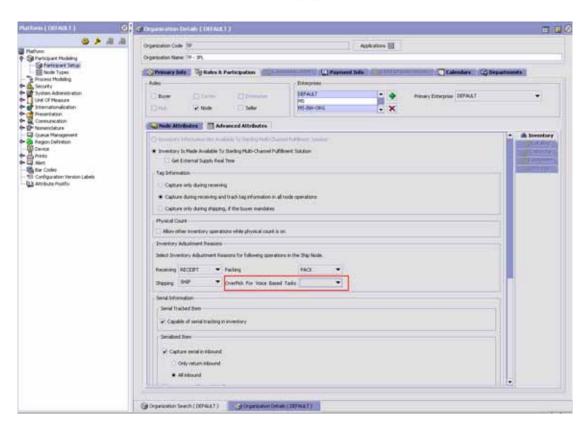
The pick execution exception codes are unique across warehouses in VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP). Incase multiple warehouses are implemented for the same VLP instance, ensure that for a particular pick execution exception code, the check digit is the same across these warehouses.

Configure the Inventory Adjustment Reason Code

Pick Confirmation Notification and Assignment Completion Notification are asynchronous events in VLP. When there is an inventory mismatch between the system quantity and the quantity that is physically present in a location, task completion in the Sterling Warehouse Management System may fail. Because task completion is in the offline mode, its failure is not communicated to the user during voice task execution. In order to avoid errors arising out of such scenarios, an option has been provided for performing negative adjustment of inventory in a bin location, and a corresponding positive adjustment of inventory in the pick location. This adjustment is done by associating a reason code to the bin location, and associating the same reason code to the default OverPick for Voice-Based Tasks operation.

Perform the following steps to associate a reason code to the OverPick for Voice-Based Tasks operation:

- 1. Open the Applications Manager, and navigate to Applications > Application Platform.
- 2. The application rules side panel is displayed. Select Participant Modeling > Participant Setup.
- The Organization Search window is displayed. Search for organizations and double-click the node whose details you want to view.



Note: This feature will not work for serial-tracked inventory.

Manual Data Loading

Manual data loading, or initial one-time data loading is, as its name suggests, a one-time process that loads all the necessary configuration data. This task must be performed for each node separately.

Note: Prior to loading data, ensure that all the services are configured as mentioned in the topic *Configure Data Upload and Import Services*.

Perform the following steps to carry out one-time data loading:

- 1. Run the integration server or servers associated with the Sterling Warehouse Management System data upload services.
- 2. Set the values for the following environment variables as specified in this list:
 - YFS_RT must point to the installation directory of the Sterling Warehouse Management System.
 - ANT_HOME must point to the ANT installation directory.
 - JAVA_HOME must point to the Java installation directory.
- 3. Run the following ant script from the <INSTALL_DIR>/bin directory:

```
ant -f ynw_entity_uploader.xml -Dnode=Node
```

Here, Node refers to the ship node.

Notes:

- For each entity that is uploaded, the entity uploader utility creates a restart file. The restart file has the key of the last entity record processed. This key is used for subsequent data uploads when the records that are already uploaded have to be ignored. The restart files are created in the <INSTALL_DIR>/bin folder.
- Install the following third party jars for the Websphere application server:

```
- j2ee.jar
- com.ibm.ws.sib.client.thin.jms_7.0.0.jar
- com.ibm.ws.ejb.thinclient_7.0.0.jar
- com.ibm.ws.orb_7.0.0.jar
- com.ibm.ws.wccm.jar
```

After the installation is complete, the AGENTDynamicclasspath.cfg file will be updated.

- 4. Run the readSterlingDataLoadFiles.bat file from the <Voxware Install Folder>/vlp_core/voxconnect_build/bin/ directory. This file invokes the following VLP Data Import events:
 - VLP_WAREHOUSE_LOAD
 - VLP_ZONE_LOAD
 - VLP_LOCATION_LOAD
 - VLP_EQUIPMENT_LOAD
 - VLP REASON LOAD

- VLP_WORKTYPE_LOAD
- VLP_PRODUCT_LOAD

Notes:

- Sterling Warehouse Management System provides only one batch file for all the events. However, it is recommended that the user create separate batch files for individual events.
- The user must manually verify the log files to keep track of data load failures, if any.

Automatic Data Loading

After initial one-time data loading is performed for the configuration data, if changes are made to the Sterling Warehouse Management System configuration later, VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP) must import these changes to facilitate data synchronization. Data loading is thus an automatic and continuous process.

Note: Prior to loading data, ensure that all the services are configured as mentioned in the topic *Configure Data Upload and Import Services*.

Perform the following steps to carry out continuous data loading:

- 1. Ensure that the integration server or servers associated with the Sterling Warehouse Management System data upload services are always running.
- 2. Ensure that the readSterlingDataLoadFiles.bat file that is located under the <Voxware Install Folder>/vlp_core/voxconnect_build/bin/ directory is invoked by a scheduler regularly. This scheduler is, however, not provided out-of-the-box. This batch file invokes the following VLP Data Import events:
 - VLP_WAREHOUSE_LOAD
 - VLP_ZONE_LOAD
 - VLP LOCATION LOAD
 - VLP_EQUIPMENT_LOAD
 - VLP REASON LOAD
 - VLP_WORKTYPE_LOAD
 - VLP_PRODUCT_LOAD

Notes:

- Sterling Warehouse Management System provides only one batch file for all the events. However, it is recommended that the user create separate batch files for individual events. For more information about how to run data import events, refer to the *VLP Bookshelf Guide*.
- The user must manually verify the log files to keep track of data load failures, if any.

Manage VoiceLogistics Pro Users

All the users of VoxStudio, VoxConnect, and VoxConsole, which are a part of the VoiceLogistics Pro suit of tools, must, along with the workers in a warehouse, be defined as VLP users. Users can be associated with applications, customers, shifts, work types, and work places.

A user must be assigned a role in order to determine the level of access to the application. By default, VLP provides the following user roles - Administrator, Supervisor, and User. You can create a user, search for a user, edit information pertaining to a user, and assign a user to an application workflow. Every workflow has its own set of grammar definitions. Therefore, a new user assigned to a workflow must be trained in grammar definition.

A worker must be added and configured as a user in the VoxConsole before being able to perform voice training, which allows VoxConsole to adapt to a user's voice and speech pattern.

Voice personalization adapts a user's speech pattern by carrying out voice training with sample phrases which that user uses when performing a task. Users speak naturally as they would to another person without significant pauses between words. During voice training, users speak at a conversational volume level and speed.

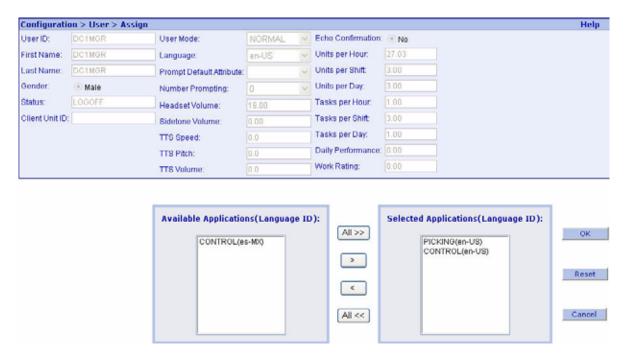
There are certain requisites for voice training, which can be performed in the following ways:

- ◆ Control Training
- **♦** Personalization
- **♦** Advanced Personalization

Note: All warehouse users must be manually created in VLP. Ensure that the User ID created in VLP is same as the Login ID for the user in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. For more information about user management and voice training, refer to the *VLP Bookshelf Guide*.

After a user is created in VoxConsole, the following configuration must be carried out for individual users for successful implementation of the Picking application at runtime:

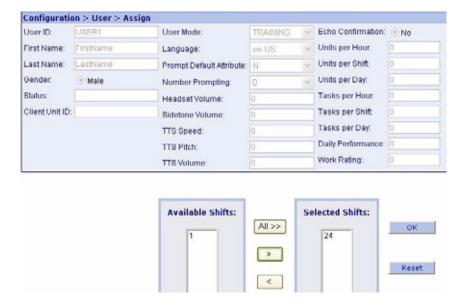

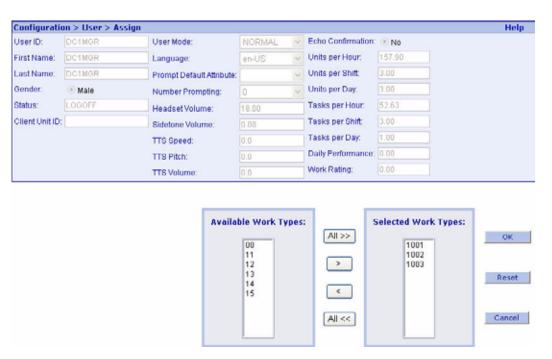

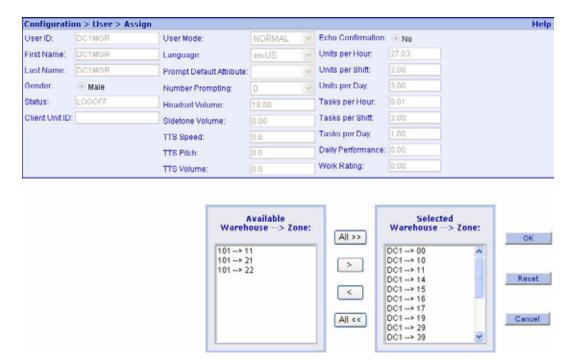

4. Assign the user to Work Places, as shown in the following figure. It is recommended that you associate all the available zones of the warehouse to the user. For more information about assigning a user to work places, refer to the *VLP Bookshelf Guide*.



Supported Voice Pick Use Cases

The Sterling Warehouse Management System has provided an out-of-the-box PICKING workflow to support order picking in a warehouse. This out-of-the-box workflow does not, however, support other warehouse execution processes, such as retrieval, replenishment, putaway, batch pick, item pick, and more. The PICKING workflow supports the use cases described in the subsequent tables in this section. The use cases are classified based on the following governing factors:

- ◆ Task Type
- **♦** Item Attributes
- **♦** Inventory
- **♦** Exception

Pick into Pallet	Yes	Inventory can be picked into a pallet. It can either be a new pallet, or an existing one.
		Note: A pallet is identified by the last five digits. For a new pallet, an out-of-the-box YNWTargetContainerForVoicePick barcode type converts those 5 digits into a valid Pallet ID.
Apply License Plate while Picking	No	A user can not apply reprinted license plates when picking.
Allow Over Picking	Yes	A user can pick more than the suggested task quantity. Note: Over Picking is not allowed for serial-tracked inventory.

Use Case	Supported	Description
Pack while Pick	No	A user cannot perform packing activity while picking.
System Driven	Yes	The system will suggest one task at a time.
		However, the user is given the option to filter the tasks by Task Type and Zone criteria.
User Driven	No	The system will not allow the user to select a task from a set of tasks. However, tasks can be filtered by Task Type and Zone criteria.
Multi-Step Execution	No	After the task is completed at the staging location, the Sterling Warehouse Management System creates a subsequent putaway task type. The PICKING workflow does not support execution of the putaway tasks.

- ♦ Voice picking cannot be performed using a radio frequency device.

VoxBlocks Used in the Picking Workflow

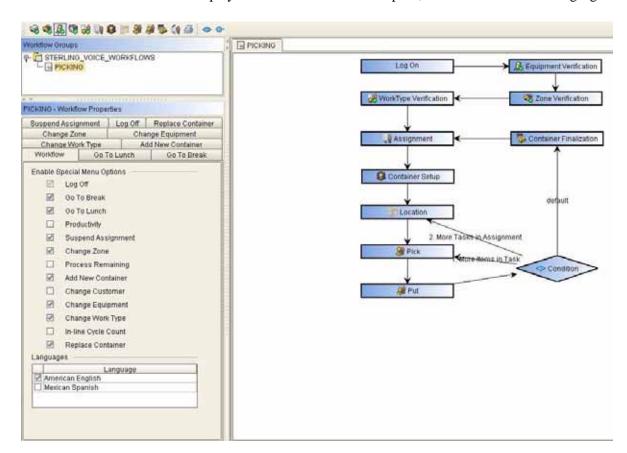
VoxBlocks are the fundamental building blocks of a workflow, and represents a process or a function. It is essential to understand what each VoxBlock does, the voice prompts pertaining to each VoxBlock, the events that must be activated to help the process of transferring data from VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP) to the Sterling Warehouse Management System, and vice versa, and the user exits that should be called to extend the standard VLP product functionality.

Based on the order in which the VoxBlocks are arranged in the PICKING workflow, this topic explains one VoxBlock at a time, the prompts that are used for that VoxBlock, and the properties of that VoxBlock.

Perform the following steps to view the VoxBlocks pertaining to the PICKING workflow:

- 1. Open VoxStudio using the default user name SUPERVISOR and default password voxware. The VoxStudio user interface is displayed.
- 2. From the VoxStudio menu bar, navigate to File > Open Workflow Group.
- 3. The Create dialog box is displayed. Browse to <voxhome>/SterlingPickingWorkflow\workflow\STERLING_VOICE_WORKFLOWS, select

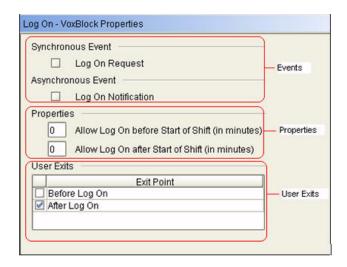

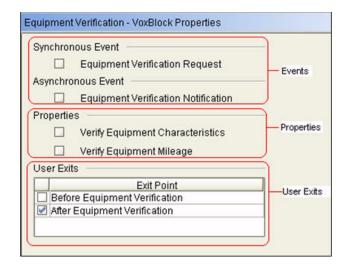

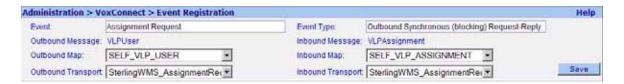

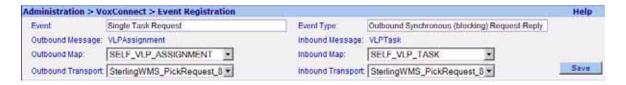

- If the previous task is skipped, it returns the task for the next available location in sequence.
- If the previous task was cut, the Sterling Warehouse Management System will not suggest any more tasks. A cut made in VLP is mapped as a deposit request in the Sterling Warehouse Management System.
- If none of these behaviors hold true, the service assigns the next available task to the user.

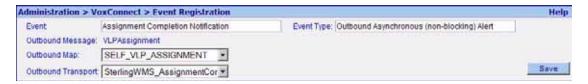
Sterling WMS_Assignment Completion_85 transport associated to the Assignment Completion Notification event. An assignment consists of multiple tasks. The

YNW_AssignmentCompletion_85 service puts the task completion message for the following:

- Tasks against which at least one unit was picked.
- Tasks against which pick exception is logged.
- Tasks against which ship exception is logged.

This event puts a message for the asynchronous agent. Thus, this agent should be running in order to complete the corresponding task in the Sterling Warehouse Management System. The assignment completion message for the asynchronous agent will be lost if the Sterling Warehouse Management System server is down as VLP does not have a backup or restart capability for event messages.

Note: It may take some time for the message to be picked up by the asynchronous agent. In order to avoid conflict with the Reopen Task agent, the voice-based tasks that are in the SUGGESTED status will not be reopened.

The Before Assignment user exit has been implemented to clear the attributes of previous assignments contained in the user container. This user exit also marks the task availability for the user as Y.

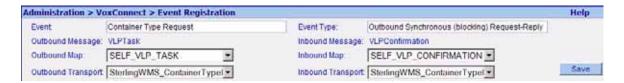

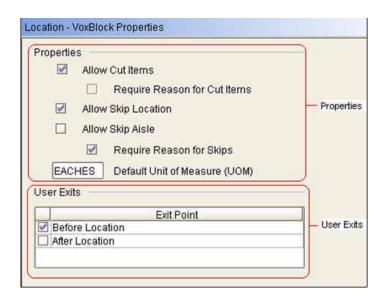

Condition

When a condition block is encountered during workflow execution, the system evaluates the condition. Each connection between a condition block and a VoxBlock specifies a conditional result.

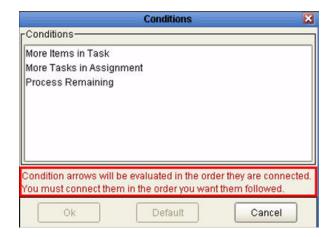

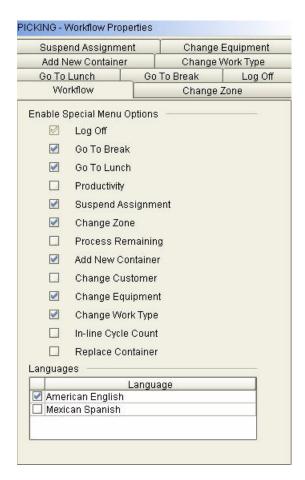

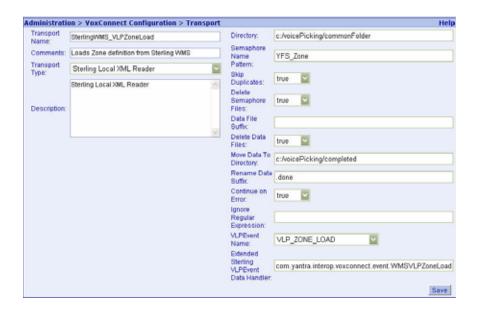

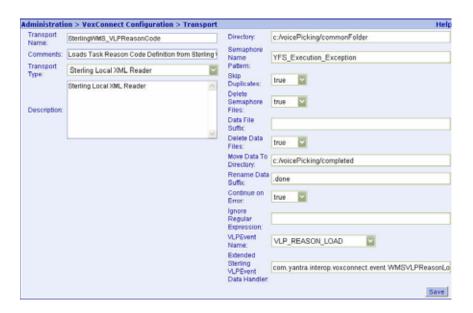

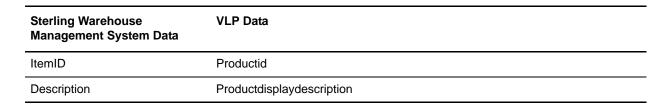

Security for Voice Integration

The communication between the Sterling Warehouse Management System and VoiceLogistics Pro (VLP) can be made secure by using the CALLBACK Mechanism

CALLBACK Mechanism

A voice user requesting a Sterling Warehouse Management System API is authenticated by the Sterling Warehouse Management System, which places a callback request with VLP to verify if the user is logged into VLP. The Sterling Warehouse Management System also validates the user by ensuring that the node to which the user belongs has voice integration enabled.

To implement the CALLBACK mechanism, perform the following tasks in any order:

- ◆ Configure the Voice Application Instance
- ♦ Configure the yifclient.properties file

Configure the Voice Application Instance

Configure the Voice Application Instance in the Voice Application Details dialog box.

To open the Voice Application Details dialog box, perform the following steps:

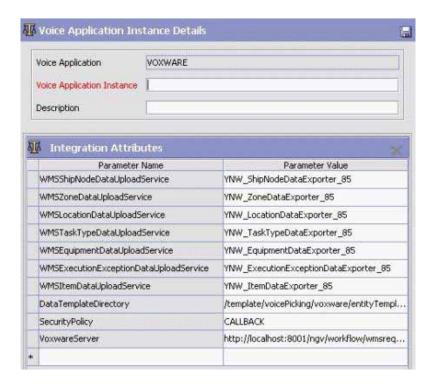
- 1. Launch the Applications Manager. From the menu bar, navigate to Applications > Warehouse Management.
- 2. From the tree in the application rules side panel, click or double-click Task Management.
- 3. The tree is expanded. Click adjacent to Voice Integration, and double-click Voice Applications.
- 4. The Voice Applications panel is displayed. From the list that is displayed in this panel, double-click the voice application for which you want to create an instance.
- 5. The Voice Application Details dialog box is displayed. Click the Voice Application Instance tab.

6. In the Voice Application Instance panel, click .



- 7. The Voice Application Instance Details dialog box is displayed. Configure the Voice Application Instance by specifying the values for following parameters provided under the Integration Attributes panel:
 - SecurityPolicy=CALLBACK

• VoxwareServer= http://<*VLP hostname*>:<*VLP portnumber*>/ngv/workflow/wmsrequest

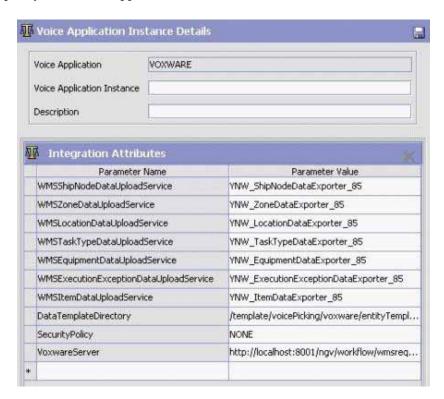


Configure the yifclient.properties file

Configure the yifclient.properties file by performing the following tasks:

- 1. Browse to the folder where the SterlingVoxwareIntegrationPack.zip was unzipped.
- 2. Open the /resources/yifclient.properties file and set the following values for the properties:
 - yif.apifactory.protocol=HTTP
 - yif.httpapi.url=http://<hostname>:<portnumber>/smcfs/interop/VoiceInteropHttpServlet

Note: If you want to bypass the authentication validation, select NONE as the parameter value for the SecurityPolicy parameter, as displayed in the following figure. However, note that the API access policy will still be applicable.



Troubleshooting

This topic describes the issue that users may encounter when integrating Sterling Warehouse Management System with VoiceLogistics Pro.

Problem

Tasks are not suggested to the users using voice unit even when there are open tasks in the Sterling Warehouse Management System.

Cause

The Sterling Warehouse Management System does not prompt users about open tasks under the following circumstances:

- ♦ No tasks are associated for the work type entered by the user.
- ♦ Inventory shortage exists at the pick location for the task and the Sterling Warehouse Management System could not determine an alternate pick location.
- ♦ The open pick task cannot be executed by the equipment entered by the user.
- ◆ If the task is for a specified serial number.
- ♦ If the task is for a specified tag identifier.
- ◆ If inventories with multiple ship-by-dates are present at the pick location.
- ◆ The aisle corresponding to the pick location is already occupied by the maximum number of users allowed.

Resolution

- ◆ Try to change the work type by using the Special Menu option.
- ◆ Try to change the equipment type by using the Special Menu option.
