## Introduction to IBM Sterling Web

After installing the IBM® Sterling Web application and performing the required configurations, you must deploy the application into production to make the application available for use. Deploying the Sterling Web application involves creating and deploying the Enterprise ARchive (EAR) package.

Sterling Web supports deployment on the following application servers:

- ◆ Oracle® WebLogic
- ◆ IBM® WebSphere
- ◆ JBoss

---

## Configure the Property Files for IBM Sterling Web

After the successful installation of the Sterling Web application, you must configure the appropriate property files. This enables you to perform customizations based on your requirements. For example, to add a new page, you must edit (and in some cases, create) certain property or .xml files. For more information about configuring properties, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Properties Guide*.

**Note:** To prevent API exceptions from being logged multiple times, you must set the `yfs.uifwkimpl.donotlog.apiexception` property to `Y` in the `customer_overrides.properties` file. Additionally, you must include the `customer_overrides.properties` file to the classpath of your application server.

You must perform the following configurations before you deploy the Sterling Web application:

1. Navigate to `<INSTALL_DIR>/bin/` and modify the `build.properties.in` file to configure the application server deployment dir property.

Here, `<INSTALL_DIR>` is the directory in which the Sterling Web application is installed.

**Note:** If you are using Web services, navigate to `<INSTALL_DIR>/repository/eardata/platform/webservices` and rename all the `.sample` files appropriately. For more information about building Web services, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Installation Guide*.

2. Navigate to `<INSTALL_DIR>/properties`.
3. Modify the `yfs.properties_ysc_ext.in` properties file to set the `yfs.searchIndex.rootDirectory=<INSTALL_DIR>/<user defined folder>` property. This property is set to configure the folder in which search index files must be placed after they are generated.
4. Configure the IBM® Sterling Sensitive Data Capture Server (SSDCS) files to enable Payment Application Data Security Standard (PA-DSS). For more information about configuring SSDCS, refer to the *Sterling Sensitive Data Capture Server: Configuration Guide*.

**Note:** If Sterling Web is deployed using HTTPS, ensure that the URL mentioned in the `ssdcs.smcfs.url` property file is set as `https://<host>:<port>/smcfs/accessTokenServlet`, and the `yfs.ssdcs.url` property in the `yfs.properties_ysc_ext.in` properties file is set appropriately. However, if Sterling Web is deployed using HTTP, ensure that the URL mentioned in the `ssdcs.smcfs.url` property file is `http://<host>:<port>/smcfs/accessTokenServlet`, and the `yfs.ssdcs.url` property in the `yfs.properties_ysc_ext.in` properties file is set appropriately. Also, the `context-param` must be set to `FALSE` in the `web.xml` file located on the application server as follows:

```
<context-param>
<param-name>scui-access-token-validation-secure</param-name>
<param-value>FALSE</param-value>
</context-param>
```

## Creating and Deploying the IBM Sterling Web EAR Package

To deploy the Sterling Web application, you must create the IBM® Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation EAR and the Sterling Web EAR. After configuring the appropriate property files pertaining to Sterling Web, the Enterprise ARchive (EAR) package must be deployed on the application servers. The Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation EAR server and the Sterling Web EAR packages are deployed on two different servers. Sterling Web supports deployment on the Oracle® WebLogic, IBM® WebSphere, and JBoss application servers. For information about creating and deploying EAR on Oracle WebLogic, IBM WebSphere, and JBoss, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Installation Guide*.

To make the Sterling Web application available for use, you must perform the following tasks:

1. Set up the application server appropriately for deploying the application. For more information about setting up the application server, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Installation Guide*.

2. Create the Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation EAR. To create the Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation EAR, run the following command:

```
.\buildear.sh (.cmd for Windows) -Dappserver=<application server>  
-Dwarfiles=smcfs, sbc -Dearfile=smcfs.ear
```

3. When Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation EAR is created, the EARs located in <INSTALL\_DIR>/external\_deployments are deleted. To avoid the deletion of EARs, ensure that you create a backup of the external\_deployments folder.
4. Create the Sterling Web EAR. To create the Sterling Web EAR, run the following command:

```
.\buildear.sh (.cmd for Windows) -Dappserver=<application server>  
-Dwarfiles=swc -Dearfile=swc.ear
```

After creating the EAR files, you must deploy the EAR files on the application servers so that the Sterling Web application is ready for use. For more information about deploying the EAR file, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Installation Guide*.

After deploying the Sterling Web application, a user must create an organization (also referred as storefront in Sterling Web application), create guest user, and generate catalog search index through Applications Manager to bring up the Sterling Web application. For more information about these tasks, refer to the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Application Platform Configuration Guide*.
