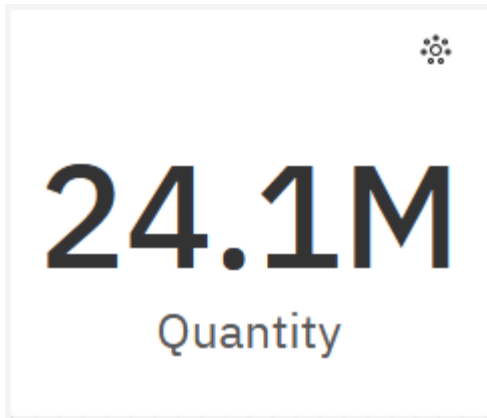




How to change the color of the number

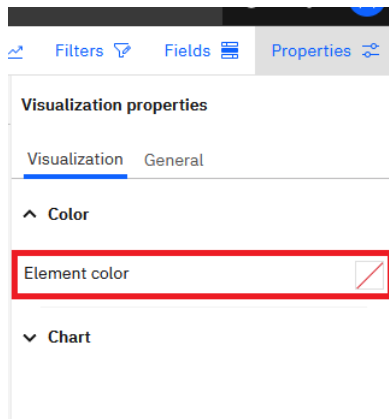
On a dashboard, we always want our key numbers to stand out more than the UI chrome around them. This number 24.1M in our Summary visualization should really stand out more:



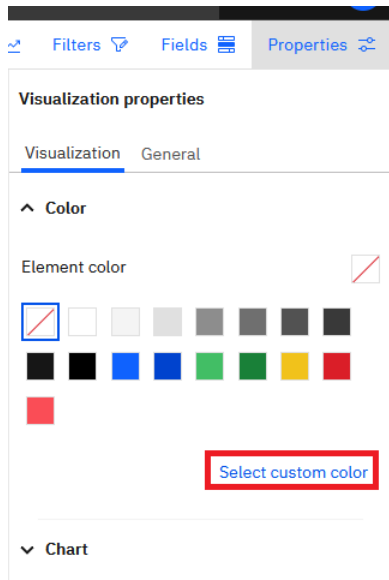
This chapter will show you how to change the color of the number...

Modify element color

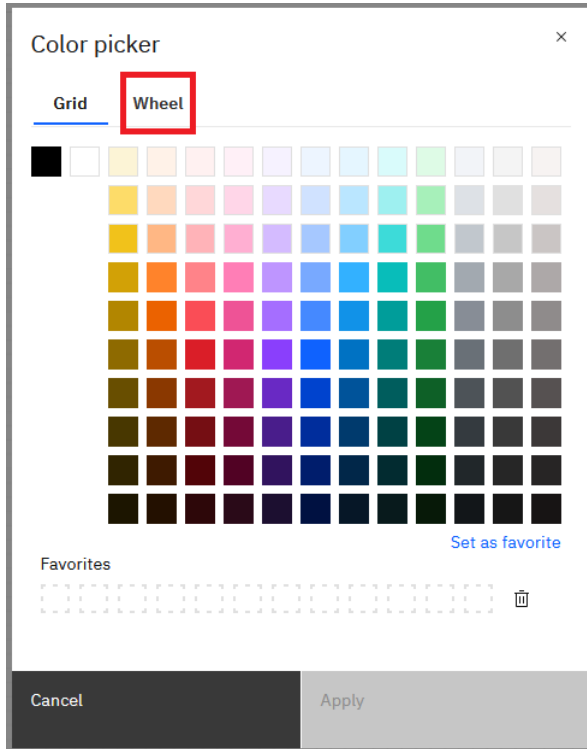
1. Start with the Summary visualization you recently created (see [How do I change the data format?](#)).
2. Select the Summary visualization and open the *Properties*  pane.
3. Click the swatch  beside *Element color*:



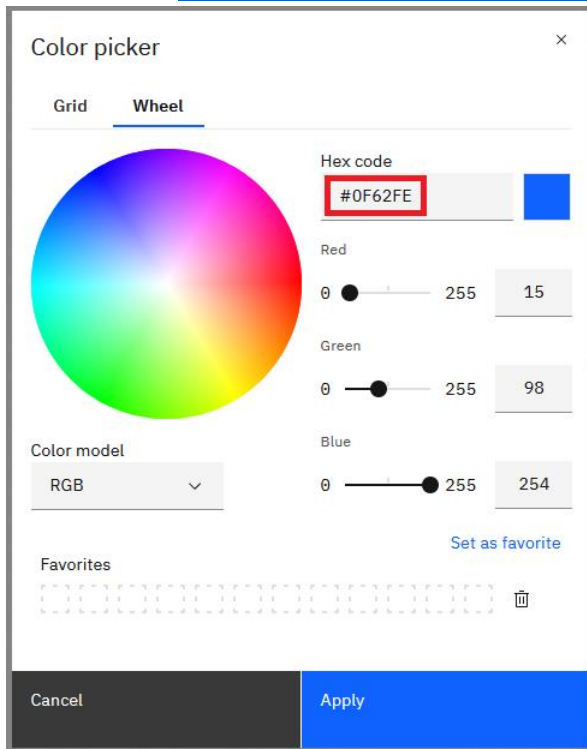
4. Click the *Select custom color* link:



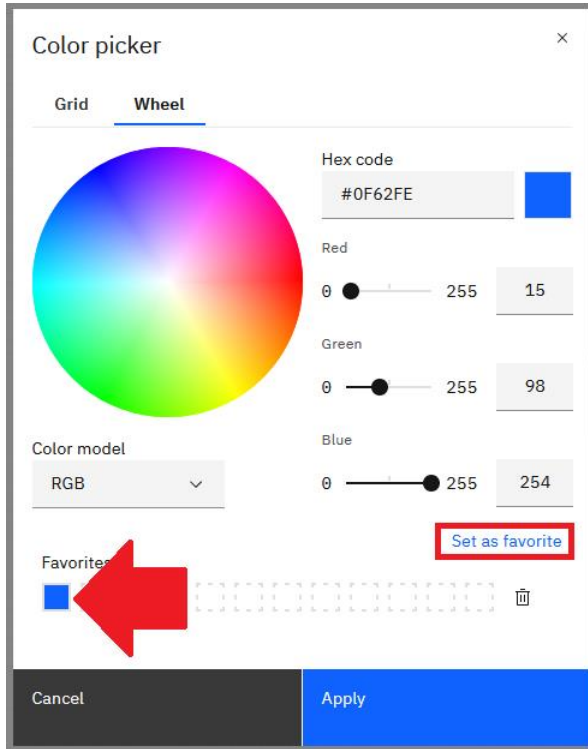
5. In the *Color picker* dialog, click the *Wheel* tab:



6. Type `#0f62FE` in the Hex code box. (Note: This is the same color that we used previously in our bar chart: [How do I change the color of the bars?](#), which enhances consistency):



7. Click the *Set as favorite* link so that you can easily reuse this color later:



8. Click *Apply*
9. Your dashboard now looks like this. Notice how your eye jumps immediately to the number 24.1, and then to the bars in the chart:
