Business Events Glossary

- **Business event dispatch adapter**
 - Transport mechanism that sends data to the business event consumer.
- **Business event specification**
 - An XML file that contains the function descriptor for a single business event.
- **Business event dispatch adapter specification**
 - An XML file that contains the function descriptor for a single business event dispatch adapter.

WODM Glossary

- **Rule set**
 - A set of rules that can be executed by the rule engine.
- **RuleApp**
 - A deployment and management unit containing one or more rule sets.
- **Endpoint**
 - A system, such as a remote server, that hosts a RuleApp
