


This presentation provides an overview of the new features in V7.5 for Business Space powered by WebSphere.



The goal of this presentation is to introduce you to the new features in V7.5 for Business Space powered by WebSphere. You will learn about new customization capabilities that will help you achieve the behavior and appearance that you want for your spaces, a new widget called Page Navigator and widget personalization persistence abilities.



This section describes the customization feature in business space version 7.5.

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

Your business space can be customized in various ways, from small changes like hiding banner actions for certain user roles to large changes like creating an entirely new theme. The areas that can be customized in Business Space version 7.5 are the login page, theme, banner, space styles and the page layout. Business Space uses Web-based Distributed Authoring and Versioning commonly referred to as WebDAV to store and deploy the artifacts used for customization.




WebDAV is a set of extensions to the Hypertext Transfer Protocol commonly referred to as HTTP. HTTP provides read access whereas WebDAV provides read and write access to files on remote web servers. This allows collaborative management and editing of files on remote web servers. Most operating systems provide built-in support for WebDAV. Various third-party tools are also available for connecting to WebDAV folders.

A WebDAV folder that contains Business Space artifacts is identified by the URL specified here.

The product information center link that describes how to connect to a WebDAV folder using Windows is provided on the slide for reference.

Note that connecting to a WebDAV folder is not supported by Windows Server 2003. If you have Business Space installed on a Windows Server 2003 machine and you want to customize your business spaces, you need to connect using a different machine with a supported operating system. Alternatively, you can use a third-party tool to interact with WebDAV.



This slide talks about steps that you need to follow in order to customize business space artifacts. You must be an administrator and have access rights to the business space WebDAV folder.


The WebDAV folder shows the structure before any customization is represented by the screen capture at the center of the slide. The login folder contains artifacts used for rendering the login page and the themes folder contains artifacts that comprise an entire theme. Under the theme, the banner folder contains elements that make up a banner and spaceStyles folder contains all the styles that can be applied to a space. Each style has a corresponding sub folder under the spaceStyles folder with artifacts that form that style. For example, the banking folder under spaceStyles folder represents Banking style that you see in the style selection list when creating a space.

For customization, you need to connect to the WebDAV folder. This is described on the previous slide. Once you connect to the WebDAV folder, copy the artifacts that you want to customize along with the containing folders to a local drive. For example, to customize the login page, copy bspace folder under login folder to a local drive. Rename the copied folder on a local drive, for example, customLogin. The next step is to modify artifacts, for example, css file, html file. Add new images if required.

Once you are done making all the updates, upload the local folder to the WebDAV folder at the same level as the original folder. For example, upload customLogin folder under the login folder thus bspace and customLogin folder are at the same level. The screen capture on the right is an example of WebDAV folder structure after customized artifacts have been uploaded. There are new sub folders under login, themes, banner and spaceStyles folders.


After you upload the artifacts, modify affected properties or the path information to point to the new folders by logging onto administrative console where applicable. In some cases, you have to restart the server before the customization takes into affect. The last step is to clear browser cache.

Note that it is important to make copies of the artifacts and modify them thus maintaining the original artifacts installed with business space.



You can make superficial changes to the login page. You can change the image used as an overall background to represent your company's logo and color. You can adjust the minimum space above the login fields. You can change the look of the labels for User ID and Password login fields, but, you cannot change the look of the login fields text boxes and the Login button. You can also change color and location of the copyright text. Note that for legal reasons, copyright information and the IBM and WebSphere logos should not be customized or hidden.




Business space comes with a default theme. All spaces are based on this theme by default. You can create new themes to get the structure and behavior that you want for your spaces. However, most customization can be achieved by changing banner, creating new space style in the default theme. These topics are covered in the subsequent slides.

If you create a new theme, you will see a combo box to choose a theme from when creating a new space. This combo box is not presented when only the default theme exists. The new theme can also be applied to spaces created before version 7.5 using the Space Manager -> Edit Settings dialog.

Customized themes must be maintained and updated manually. IBM® updates to the default theme artifacts are not applied during regular service or maintenance activities to customized themes.

Themes are implemented using HTML, CSS, JavaScript, the iWidget specification, and the Dojo widget library. Instructions on theme customization are in the product information center. The link under reference takes you to the information center.




The banner is located at the top of a business space. By default, the banner displays the name of the space, menus, current user name and links to documentation and log out from Business Space.

You can remove or hide the entire banner. You can modify the banner structure by adding/removing elements from the banner. You can also modify what documentation the Help link should open. These updates are done by modifying the banner.html file.

You can change the appearance of the banner with different colors, icons and font by modifying the style sheet banner.css.

You can update the behavior of the Logout link.


The link under reference takes you to the information center for details on customizing the banner.



The default link points to the welcome page in the information center. You can customize the help link as mentioned in the previous slide by editing the banner.html file. The screen capture here shows the default and the modified help links


The default logout from a business space launches the login page of the business space. In the example in this slide, logout from a business space takes you to the IBM website.




A style in business space defines overall and background color, image, header, footer, look of a menu and menu items, look of a dialog, page navigation tabs and widget toolbar. Business space provides many styles to choose from. You can create new styles in addition to these. If you create a new style, you can apply it to an existing business space using the Space Manager -> Edit Settings dialog.

When creating a new style, look at the existing styles and find one that is the closest match to what you want to do. The style artifacts are located in the themes/bspaceTheme/spaceStyles WebDAV folder with a name that corresponds to the style. For example, artifacts for the style Health are located under themes/bspaceTheme/spaceStyles/health folder. Once you have determined the closest style, copy it's artifacts to a local folder as a starting point and customize those to suit your needs.




Customized header, footer, menu and menu items are shown in the example here.



Business Space provides a set of page layouts that can be applied to your spaces. You can create a new page layout per your requirement. This new layout is added to the layout selection list. Instructions on creating a new page layout can be found on the product information center.



This section describes other enhancements.



Page Navigator widget is new to version 7.5. This widget allows automatic navigation from one page to another. The target page can be a page in the current business space or a page from a different business space. If you are an editor of a page, you can use this widget to define the page navigation behavior. You can specify one of the three actions namely switch, open or close in the widget's settings to change the page that you can see.

The page navigator can switch to the target page in the current space or in a different space. If the target page is in the current space, then the behavior is as if the tab for that page is selected. If the target page is in a different space, then the current space is closed and the target page's parent space is opened.

The page navigator can open the target page from a different space in the current space temporarily. The temporary page tab has an orange line at the top to indicate that it belongs to a different space.

The page navigator can close the temporarily opened page. The last visited page is then seen.

Once you are done specifying the settings, you can hide this widget from the page to reduce the clutter. Hiding the widget does not affect it's function.

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In the versions before 7.5, you can customize widget content, for example, set list filters, set table sort order, set column widths, and so on in view mode. However, when you return to Business Space, these changes are lost. Widget personalization persistence feature in version 7.5 allows widget attributes to be modified and persisted per user basis.


When you configure widget content when the page is in view mode, all aspects of your configuration apply only to you and not to any other user of the page. When you return to Business Space, you see widget content as last configured in view mode.

When you configure widget content when the page is in edit mode, all aspects of your configuration apply to all users of the page.

Changes made in the view mode overwrite the changes made in the edit mode.

An explicit Personalize option is available for some widgets, for example, Feed widget. Some widgets use implicit personalization. These widgets remember previous settings without requiring any explicit user action.

Business space stores a limited number of personalization per user. When the limit is reached, it replaces the oldest settings with the most recent ones.
