



Installation of the Communications Server for Linux® on System z®.

Installation overview

- CS Linux on System z V6.4.0 is shipped with three CDs
 - ▶ QuickStart CD
 - Provides links to CS Linux on System z on the Web
 - CS Linux Documentation
 - ▶ Server CD
 - Server installation file used by the s390, s390x Linux
 - Contains the CS Linux README and documentation
 - ▶ Remote API client CD
 - Installation package for Windows®, Win-64, AIX®, and Linux (i686, x86_64, ppc64 and s390x) clients

Communications Server for Linux has three CDs that make up the media package

- QuickStart for information and documentation
- Server CD containing the installation packages for the Linux server
- Remote API Client CD containing installation packages for the client platforms.

- CS Linux System z V6.4.0 supports:
 - ▶ S390, s390x Linux systems
 - ▶ Linux distributions supported:
 - RHEL4, RHEL5
 - SLES9, SLES10, SLES11

For Linux on System z, the `ibm-commserver` package file needs to be copied to the Linux on System z image in order to be installed.

Installation overview

- CS Linux on System z requires Linux Streams (LiS) open source
 - ▶ Must be installed before CS Linux on System z is installed
 - ▶ Refer to the README file for specific instructions
 - Where to obtain LiS
 - How to install LiS
- Server CD contains the TAR file: `ibm-commserver6.4.0.0-s390x.tgz`
 - ▶ Copy the package to the Linux on System z image
 - ▶ Un-TAR the file using the “tar” command (refer to README)
 - ▶ Complete the installation on the Linux for System z

- There are three installation scripts provided:
 - ▶ installibmcs
 - Installs Enterprise Host Access Class Libraries (ibm-commserver-ecl)
 - Installs the Communications Server (ibm-commserver)
 - Installs the SSL Toolkit (gsk7bas)
 - ▶ installibmcdocs
 - Installs the product documentation (ibm-commserver-docs)
 - ▶ installgskit
 - Installs the SSL Toolkit (gsk7bas)
- The install scripts are required for installation

There are three install scripts. The documentation install is optional. The gskit install is required if SSL is being configured.
