General improvements


- Application Center runs on production databases


In version 5.0.5, the Application Center can be configured to run on the same set of databases as the Worklight server. This includes DB2, MySQL, and Oracle, in addition to the Derby database. You are now able to deploy the Application Center as an enterprise application store for your organization using production databases.

In version 5.0, you can disable an application in order to hide it from the catalog. In version 5.0.5, it is now possible to completely remove an application from the catalog and the database.




Version 5.0.5 of the Application Center introduces two different user roles: administrators and regular users. Administrators can access the Application Center console to upload applications and define the access control list. A regular user can use the mobile client to install the applications from the catalog but cannot upload new applications.


The configuration of authentication and definition of access control lists can now be done through a user repository such as LDAP – the Lightweight Directory Access Protocol. The Application Center console helps you define access control lists based on LDAP groups and users.



Applications in the Worklight Application Center catalog can be marked as 'Ready for production' to indicate that they are in a production state. This new attribute allows those applications to be imported by other application stores, such as the one offered by IBM Endpoint Manager for Mobile Devices.



Version 5.0.5 also provides some improvements to the mobile clients. For example, the iOS version runs on iOS 6 and supports high-density screens, such as retina displays. Also, during the installation on iOS, credentials only need to be entered once.



All of the new features of the Application Center version 5.0.5 are described in the IBM Worklight information center.
