

2) The registration screen is fairly straightforward. Note that it contains three very important items that you need to make sure you record for future use:

- The first is your email address. By the way this is set up, what you enter here becomes your “IBM login ID” which you will need to use each time you login in the future.
- The second is your password. This combines with your “IBM login ID” to secure entry each time you login.
- The final item is your display name. Your display name is what everyone will see and know you as while you are participating in developerWorks. You’ll probably want to select something that is recognizable, for you and/or your company, as well as the other Ace Independent Grocer & Retailer members.

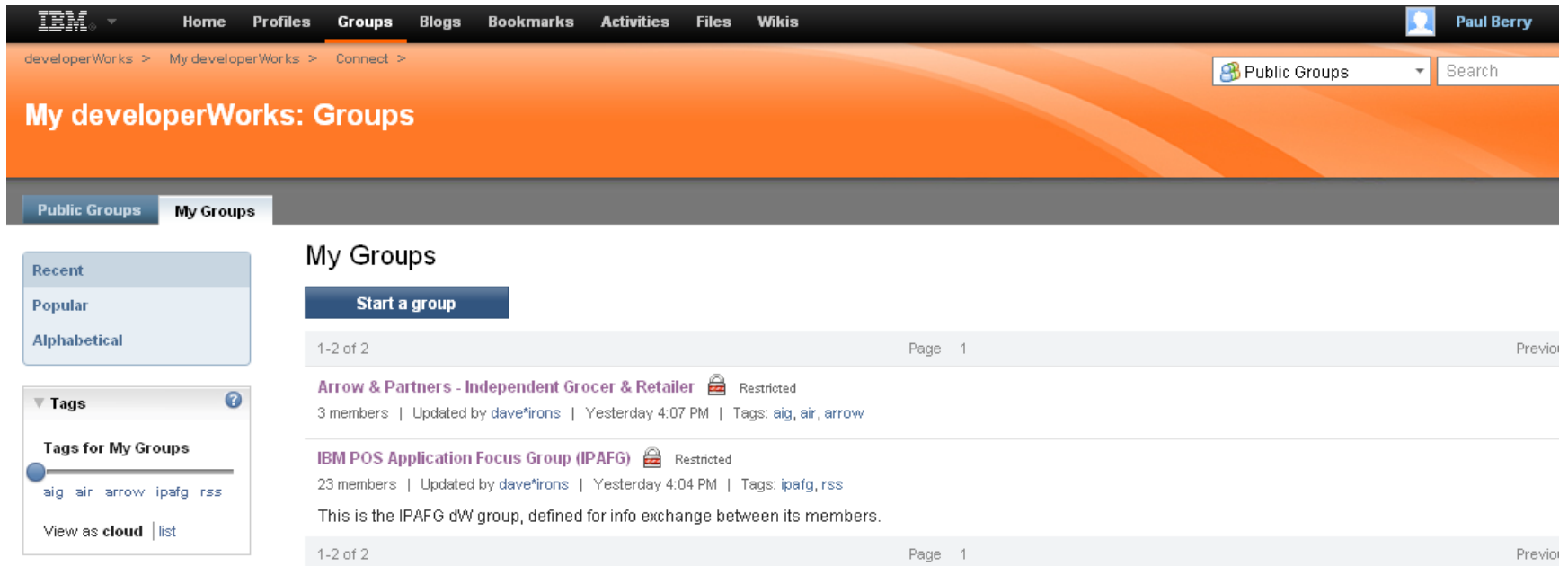
