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## 1.0 Introduction

This program directory is intended for the system programmer responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information concerning the material and procedures associated with the installation of IBM Merge Tool for z/OS and OS/390. This publication refers to IBM Merge Tool for z/OS and OS/390 as Merge Tool. You should read all of this program directory before installing the program and then keep it for future reference.

The program directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, “Program Materials” on page 3 identifies the basic and optional program materials and documentation for Merge Tool.
- 3.0, “Program Support” on page 6 describes the IBM support available for Merge Tool.
- 4.0, “Program and Service Level Information” on page 8 lists the APARs (program level) and PTFs (service level) incorporated into Merge Tool.
- 5.0, “Installation Requirements and Considerations” on page 9 identifies the resources and considerations for installing and using Merge Tool.
- 6.0, “Installation Instructions” on page 15 provides detailed installation instructions for Merge Tool. It also describes the procedures for activating the functions of Merge Tool, or refers to appropriate publications.

Before installing Merge Tool, read 3.2, “Preventive Service Planning” on page 6. This section tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this program directory.

Do not use this program directory if you are installing Merge Tool with a SystemPac or ServerPac. When using these offerings, use the jobs and documentation supplied with the offering. This documentation may point you to specific sections of the program directory as required.

If you are installing Merge Tool using the Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3), a softcopy program directory is provided on the CBPDO tape which is identical to the printed copy shipped with your order. Your CBPDO contains a softcopy preventive service planning (PSP) upgrade for this product. All service and HOLDDATA for Merge Tool are included on the CBPDO tape.

### 1.1 Merge Tool Description

This product is a source code merging utility that automatically merges up to two versions of source code with the original or base version of source.

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## 1.2 Merge Tool FMIDs

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## 2.0 Program Materials

An IBM program is identified by a program number and a feature number. The program number for Merge Tool is 5697-H70.

Basic Machine-Readable Materials are materials that are supplied under the base license and feature code, and are required for the use of the product. Optional Machine-Readable Materials are orderable under separate feature codes, and are not required for the product to function.

The program announcement material describes the features supported by Merge Tool. Ask your IBM representative for this information if you have not already received a copy.

### 2.1 Basic Machine-Readable Material

The distribution medium for this program is magnetic tape or downloadable files. It is installed using SMP/E, and is in SMP/E RELFILE format. See 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 15 for more information about how to install the program.

Figure 1 describes the physical tape. Figure 2 describes the file content.

#### Notes:

1. The data set attributes in these tables should be used in the JCL of jobs reading the data sets, but since the data sets are in IEBCOPY unloaded format, their actual attributes may be different.
2. If you are installing Merge Tool using the Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO) (5751-CS3), some of the information in these figures may not be valid. Consult the CBPDO documentation for actual values.
3. If any RELFILEs are identified as PDSEs, ensure that SMPTLIB data sets are allocated as PDSEs.

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## **4.0 Program and Service Level Information**

This section identifies the program and any relevant service levels of Merge Tool. The program level refers to the APAR fixes incorporated into the program. The service level refers to the PTFs integrated.

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## 5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating Merge Tool. The following terminology is used:

- *Driving system*: the system used to install the program.
- *Target system*: the system on which the program is installed.

In many cases, the same system can be used as both a driving system and a target system. However, you may want to set up a clone of your system to use as a target system by making a separate IPL-able copy of the running system. The clone should include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Some cases where two systems should be used include the following:

- When installing a new level of a product that is already installed, the new product will delete the old one. By installing onto a separate target system, you can test the new product while still keeping the old one in production.
- When installing a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. Installing onto a test system or clone will allow you to assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

---

### 5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install Merge Tool.

#### 5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

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## 5.2 Target System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the target system required to install and use Merge Tool.

Merge Tool installs in the MVS (Z038) SREL.

### 5.2.1 Machine Requirements

The target system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

### 5.2.2 Programming Requirements

**5.2.2.1 Mandatory Requisites:** A mandatory requisite is defined as a product that is required without exception; this product either **will not install** or **will not function** unless this requisite is met. This includes products that are specified as REQs or PREs.

**5.2.2.2 Functional Requisites:** A functional requisite is defined as a product that is **not** required for the successful installation of this product or for the basic function of the product, but **is** needed at run time for a specific function of this product to work. This includes products that are specified as IF REQs.

Merge Tool has no functional requisites.

**Note:** Merge Tool requires the REXX Library or the REXX Alternate Library in the execution environment. The REXX Alternate Library is supplied with Merge Tool. See 6.1.4, “When to Install The REXX Alternate Library” on page 17 for information about when you need to install the REXX Alternate Library as part of this install.

**5.2.2.3 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites:** A toleration/coexistence requisite is defined as a product which must be present on a sharing system. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD at different time intervals.

Merge Tool has no toleration/coexistence requisites.



**5.2.2.4 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites:** A negative requisite identifies products which must *not* be installed on the same system as this product.

Merge Tool has no negative requisites.

## 5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

Merge Tool libraries can reside on all supported DASD types.

Figure 9 lists the total space required for each type of library.

### Notes:

1. IBM recommends use of system determined block sizes for efficient DASD utilization for all non-RECFM U data sets. For RECFM U data sets, IBM recommends a block size of 32760, which is the most efficient from a performance and DASD utilization perspective.
2. Abbreviations used for the data set type are:
  - U** Unique data set, allocated by this product and used only by this product. To determine the correct storage needed for this data set, this table provides all required information; no other tables (or program directories) need to be referenced for the data set size.
  - S** Shared data set, allocated by this product and used by this product and others. To determine the correct storage needed for this data set, the storage size given in this table needs to be added to other tables (perhaps in other program directories). If the data set already exists, it must have enough free space to accommodate the storage size given in this table.
  - E** Existing shared data set, used by this product and others. This data set is NOT allocated by this product. To determine the correct storage needed for this data set, the storage size given in this table needs to be added to other tables (perhaps in other program directories). This existing data set must have enough free space to accommodate the storage size given in this table.

If you currently have a previous release of this product installed in these libraries, the installation of this release will delete the old one and reclaim the space used by the old release and any service that had been installed. You can determine whether or not these libraries have enough space by deleting the old release with a dummy function, compressing the libraries, and comparing the space requirements with the free space in the libraries.

For more information on the names and sizes of the required data sets, please refer to 6.1.6, "Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries" on page 17.

3. All target and distribution libraries listed have the following attributes:
  - The default name of the data set may be changed
  - The default block size of the data set may be changed
  - The data set may be merged with another data set that has equivalent characteristics
  - The data set may be either a PDS or a PDSE
4. All target libraries listed have the following attributes:
  - The data set may be SMS managed
  - It is not required for the data set to be SMS managed
  - It is not required for the data set to reside on the IPL volume
  - The values in the "Member Type" column are not necessarily the actual SMP/E element types identified in the SMPMCS.
5. All target libraries listed which contain load modules have the following attributes:
  - It is not required for the data set to be in the LPA
  - It is not required for the data set to be APF authorized

The following figures describe the target and distribution libraries required to install Merge Tool. The storage requirements of Merge Tool must be added to the storage required by other programs having data in the same library.

**Note:** The data in these tables should be used when determining which libraries can be merged into common data sets. In addition, since some ALIAS names may not be unique, ensure that no naming conflicts will be introduced before merging libraries.

## 5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Installing Merge Tool may result in the deletion of other FMIDs. To see what FMIDs will be deleted, examine the ++VER statement in the product's SMPMCS.

If you do not wish to delete these FMIDs at this time, you must install Merge Tool into separate SMP/E target and distribution zones.

**Note:** These FMIDs will not automatically be deleted from the Global Zone. Consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on how to do this.

---

## 6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the installation method and the step-by-step procedures to install and to activate the functions of Merge Tool.

Please note the following:

- If you want to install Merge Tool into its own SMP/E environment, consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on creating and initializing the SMP/CSI and the SMP/E control data sets.
- Sample jobs have been provided to help perform some or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries required for SMP/E execution have been defined in the appropriate zones.
- The SMP/E dialogs may be used instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

---

### 6.1 Installing Merge Tool

#### 6.1.1 SMP/E Considerations for Installing Merge Tool

This release of Merge Tool is installed using the SMP/E RECEIVE, APPLY, and ACCEPT commands. The SMP/E dialogs may be used to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

#### 6.1.2 SMP/E Options Subentry Values

The recommended values for some SMP/E CSI subentries are shown in Figure 13. Use of values lower than these may result in failures in the installation process. DSSPACE is a subentry in the GLOBAL options entry. PEMAX is a subentry of the GENERAL entry in the GLOBAL options entry. Refer to the SMP/E manuals for instructions on updating the global zone.

where **tunit** is the unit value matching the product tape, **2** is the tape file number where the data set name is on the tape (if you have received this product via CBPDO refer to the documentation provided by CBPDO to see where IBM.H27H110.F1 is on the tape), **filevol** is the volume serial of the DASD device where the downloaded files reside, **jcl-library-name** is the name of the output data set where the sample jobs will be stored, **dasdvol** is the volume serial of the DASD device where the output data set will reside and set **xxxxIN** on the SYSIN DD to either TAPEIN or FILEIN depending on your input DD statement.

You can also access the sample installation jobs by performing an SMP/E RECEIVE and then copying the jobs from the SMPTLIBs to a work data set for editing and submission. See Figure 14 to find the appropriate SMPTLIB (RELFILE) data set.

## 6.1.4 When to Install The REXX Alternate Library

Merge Tool requires either the REXX Library or the REXX Alternate Library in the execution environment. You may have previously installed the REXX Library in conjunction with the REXX Compiler and Library or you may have previously installed the REXX Alternate Library as part of the installation of another product. The REXX Library is program number 5695-014. The REXX Library is FMID HWJ9130. The REXX Alternate Library is FMID HWJ9133.

If you have the REXX Library or the REXX Alternate Library already installed you do not need to install the REXX Alternate Library.

If you do not have either the REXX Library or the REXX Alternate Library installed you will need to install the REXX Alternate Library as part of installing Merge Tool.

## 6.1.5 Perform SMP/E RECEIVE

Perform an SMP/E RECEIVE for Merge Tool.

NOTE: If you obtained Merge Tool as part of a CBPDO, you can use the RCVPDO job found in the CBPDO RIMLIB data set to RECEIVE the Merge Tool FMIDs as well as any service, HOLDDATA, or preventive service planning (PSP) information included on the CBPDO tape. For more information, refer to the documentation included with the CBPDO.

## 6.1.7 Create DDDEF Entries

## 6.1.8 Perform SMP/E APPLY

Perform an SMP/E APPLY CHECK for Merge Tool.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the APPLY CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the APPLY CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the APPLY.

**Note:** The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E apply all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

### 6.1.9 Perform SMP/E ACCEPT

Perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for Merge Tool.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the ACCEPT CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Before using SMP/E to load new distribution libraries, it is recommended that you set the ACCJCLIN indicator in the distribution zone. This will cause entries produced from JCLIN to be saved in the distribution zone whenever a SYSMOD containing inline JCLIN is ACCEPTed. For more information on the ACCJCLIN indicator, see the description of inline JCLIN in the SMP/E manuals.

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the ACCEPT CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the ACCEPT.

**Note:** The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E accept all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

If you are not installing the REXX Alternate Library ACCEPT CHECK only FMID H27H110.

If you are installing the REXX Alternate Library ACCEPT CHECK FMIDs H27H110 and HWJ9133.

If PTFs containing replacement modules are being ACCEPTed, SMP/E ACCEPT processing will linkedit/bind the modules into the distribution libraries. During this processing, the Linkage Editor or Binder may issue messages documenting unresolved external references, resulting in a return code of 4 from the ACCEPT step. These messages can be ignored, because the distribution libraries are not executable and the unresolved external references will not affect the executable system libraries.

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## 6.2 Activating Merge Tool

The publication *IBM Merge Tool for z/OS and OS/390 User's Guide, SC27-1694* contains the step-by-step procedures to activate the functions of Merge Tool. It is covered in Appendix B, 'The Merge Tool Customization Process' of that manual. This publication can be found in the SAZZPDF target library. It can be downloaded to a workstation as a binary file and viewed or printed as a PDF document.
