

Notes / Domino - a history of innovation





2006 highlights for Notes / Domino

- User base announced as 127 million
 - Up 3 million on last year
- 913 competitive wins during 2006
- 30% year-on-year growth for Q4
 - 23% growth for the full year
- 15% increase in active Notes / Domino customers
- Released 7.0.2 in Q3




Notes / Domino 7.0.2

- SmartUpgrade 'Run as Admin' also available for version 6.5
- Support for 32-bit Domino running on Windows x64 Server and 64bit Intel Linux OS (SUSE 9, RHEL4)
- New native Notes client for Apple Mac
- 'Nomad'
 - Roaming Notes user support on a USB drive
- Domino content as RSS news feeds
- Blog template
 - Get business folks on-line
- iCal support


- Domino server release to accompany Notes 8
- Messaging enhancements
 - SPAM Guru
 - Message recall
 - Immediate 'Out of Office' reply
- Continued focus on reducing the cost of ownership
 - Lots of new and improved admin capabilities
- Further performance and scalability improvements
 - Stream cluster replication
- 64-bit versions
 - But we're keeping the 32-bit versions too
 - ▶ Availability planned for 8.0.1 (Windows and pSeries)... Linux to follow later
 - Customer choice as to when to make the move
- Further focus on web services and Services Orientated Architecture
- DB2 integration made generally available
- Updated Domino Web Access





Ease of deployment: provisioning Eclipse update sites in Domino 8








Domino Web Access 8

- Updated 'Notes 8' user interface
- More performance enhancements
 - Further to huge leaps made in version 7
- Single, merged mail template
 - Domino Web Access and Notes users served from the same template (Mail8.ntf)
- Preview pane
- Portal integration improvements
- Integrated instant messaging contacts list user interface
- Feed enabled mail files (RSS / ATOM)
- Enhanced spell check engine and dictionary integration
- Customisation logos, colours, branding
- LTPA2 token support








Our customers have told us...

How have we gone about improving Notes?

- More usability testing than ever before
 - User feedback labs at Lotusphere 2006 and 2007
- Elected customer design partners to provide input throughout design and development cycles
- Hired some professional design consultants and artists
- Head user interface developer (Mary Beth Raven) has publicly blogged on issues and ideas and requested feedback
- Taken advantage of the Eclipse framework
 - Advanced tools for building user interface elements
 - Offers better integration with operating system
 - Windows, Linux, Mac





What else has driven the Notes 8 development?

- Greater demand for converging technologies
 - Instant messaging, presence awareness, Voice over IP, telephony integration
 - Unified user experience
 - Composite applications
 - Role-based dynamic workplaces
 - Server-managed clients with minimal desktop touch
- Embracing innovations and open standards [Web 2.0]
 - Contextual collaboration
 - New ways of working ... activity-centric computing
 - Extensibility ... mash-ups
- Lowering cost of ownership while allowing people to be more productive
- Providing choice and flexibility

- Oh, and did I mention it looks great?






Some key points - Sametime

Integrated Sametime

- Now a single-client experience
- Sametime is embedded into the side-bar, drives presence-awareness and instant messaging for the Notes client
- It's essentially the Sametime 7.5 code base
- You get a base level of functionality
 - Which is much better than you get in Notes 7
 - Paying for Sametime 7.5 allows you to switch on all the features









Some key points - Activities


- Integration with 'Activities'
 - Activities are part of Lotus Connections (due Q2 2007)
 - Activities plug-in provides integration with Notes 8
 - Drag and drop of Notes content and file attachments
 - Activities [Connections] server is NOT Domino-based







The search bar


- Search e-mail, calendar, contacts and the Internet directly from the search bar
- Browse through search history













Composite applications


- What are composite applications?
 - Collection of user-facing components brought together for a specific business purpose
- Programming model supported in Portal and Notes
 - Surface content from multiple systems
 - Aggregate and integrate different component types
- Support business flexibility
 - Mix-n-match and loose coupling
 - User effectiveness
 - Remove silos of information








Integrated productivity editors

- Spreadsheet / word processor / presentations
- Notes 8 will support
 - ▶ Microsoft Office format documents, Open Document Format, SmartSuite
- Potential for reduced cost of ownership

























Notes 8 FAQ

- When will Notes 8 ship?
 - Q2 2007 ... no firm date, but late in that quarter (subject to possible change)
- How much will Notes cost?
 - Pricing / packaging / licensing has not been announced
 - Unlikely to change from current model
- Are the productivity editors free?
 - Yes
- Is Sametime 7.5 included for free?
 - No, but there will be free integrated presence awareness and instant messaging as there is today
 - More functionality than in Notes 7, but less than Sametime 7.5

Lotus Domino

- Platforms: native 64-bit support
- Further reduce I/O footprint
- FIPS 140 Compliance for Lotus Notes mail

'Next-Generation' Lotus Domino Web Access

- Continued exploitation of AJAX for enhanced UI
- Adaptive client, optimized for low bandwidth connections





Plans beyond Lotus Notes and Domino 8.x



- Boring consistency
- Releases every 12-18 months
 - ▶ No waiting for 'mega' release every 4 years
- Alternating between client and server focus
- Release-to-release compatibility
- No rip-and-replace overhauls

 - Notes ID optional
- Quality of service improvements
 - Better Notes failover
- Modernise Web / HTML programming

...but ongoing client work

Lotus Notes

- Integration of 'traditional PIM apps' with social software and doc management
- Calendaring enhancements
- Extended client provisioning
- Deeper RSS / Atom integration
- Extended search capabilities

Domino Web Access

- Activities integration
- Domino administration policy integration
- Improved mobile device support






