1.0 Introduction

This Program Directory is intended for the system programmer responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information concerning the material and procedures associated with the installation of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS, or one of the individually ordered components offered separately by WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS by Individual Components. The content of a specific component is identical regardless of the way it was ordered. The difference is that the former of the two contains all available components. The name WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS will be used in this program directory to refer to both offerings, except when differences in the two offerings are described.

The Program Directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, "Program Materials" on page 4 identifies the basic and optional program materials and documentation for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.
- 3.0, "Program Support" on page 7 describes the IBM support available for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.
- 4.0, "Program and Service Level Information" on page 9 lists the PTF (service level) incorporated into WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.
- 5.0, "Installation Requirements and Considerations" on page 10 identifies the resources and considerations required for installing and using WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.
- 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 18 provides detailed installation instructions for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. It also describes the procedures for activating the functions of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS, or refers to appropriate publications.

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS is an assembly of functions that when added to WebSphere Application Server for V6.1 for z/OS, plus the enabling service level, will extend its capabilities and manageability.

This product is shipped alone through CBPDO and as an additional feature to the WebSphere ServerPac. When shipped through CBPDO, it must be installed into an SMP/E environment that already contains WebSphere Application Server for V6.1 for z/OS.

Prerequisite WebSphere Application Server V6.1 for z/OS provides the entire runtime environment needed for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. There are no additional CDs or products shipped with WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

Before installing WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS, read the Memo to Users Extension that is supplied with this program in softcopy form as well as this Program Directory. Consider keeping them for future reference. Section 3.2, "Preventive Service Planning" on page 7 tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this Program Directory.

When WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS is supplied in a Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3), the Program Directory is provided in softcopy form on the CBPDO tape that is identical to the hardcopy form provided with your order. Your CBPDO contains a softcopy preventive service planning (PSP) upgrade for this product. All service and HOLDDATA for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS are included on the CBPDO tape.

1.1 WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS Description

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS offers enhanced quality of service focused exclusively on the Java 2 Enterprise Edition (J2EE) application layer by integrating with and extending the core functions of an existing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS installation. The qualities of service of your business-critical applications can be improved with the following new WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS capabilities:

- Flexible support for mixed application types: Batch-type processing has been enhanced with many new features affecting job management, execution and programming model options. Job management improvements include integration with popular workload scheduling systems such as Tivoli Workload Scheduler and others to enable WebSphere Extended Deployment jobs to be part of the overall work schedule. Also, a new console has been added providing essential job management functions. A new job type has been added to transactional batch and compute intensive, which were previously supported. Referred to as Native Execution, it supports a more flexible programming style. Also, you can now use a simplified, non-EJB programming model for transactional batch jobs. When combined, these features provide you with more flexibility for executing a broad mix of application types under WebSphere Extended Deployment.
- Dynamic operations: For environments where z/OS is the centralized platform, providing management
 across multiple distributed platforms including z/Linux, WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1 has
 added new workload management and health policy support for PHP servers and expanded support
 for other application servers. This new support can enable a more consistent approach to achieve
 service levels and health policies across a heterogeneous set of application servers.
- Extended manageability: To improve overall operations of complex systems a new centralized install manager has been added reducing installation and maintenance efforts. Also, customizable health monitoring policies are now available to allow you to determine which situations to monitor and the actions to take when a specific situation arises.
- Extreme Transaction Processing (XTP) capabilities: XTP capabilities ensure a smarter application infrastructure to support your most demanding business-critical applications. You can overcome traditional IT performance limitations to generate the levels of global scale, process efficiencies, and business intelligence needed for smarter outcomes and for sustainable competitive advantage for your business. Enhanced XTP capabilities include further simplification in building multi-tenant applications, improved memory density through the implementation of byte array maps, and query optimization and simplification of index usage with enhancements to the built-in HashIndex plug-in.

2.0 Program Materials

An IBM program is identified by a program number. WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1 was offered under two different program numbers in order to provide customers with pricing options. One of the features which was offered in V6.1 has been expanded to a separate product, so that now there are three program numbers. The program number for WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS is 5655-P28. Under this number customers can achieve a cost benefit from purchasing the entire suite. This program number also allows existing customers to continue their subscription support. The program number for WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS by Individual Components is 5655-S33. Under this number customers can purchase a portion of the product without having to purchase the entire product. The new product, WebSphere eXtreme Scale V7.0 for z/OS, is available on its own via program number 5655-V66 but is also provided as part of program number 5655-P28.

Basic Machine-Readable Materials are materials that are supplied under the base license and feature numbers, and are required for the use of the product. Optional Machine-Readable Materials are orderable under separate feature numbers, and are not required for the product to function.

The program announcement material describes the features supported by WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Ask your IBM representative for this information if you have not already received a copy.

2.1 Basic Machine-Readable Material

The distribution medium for this program is magnetic tape or downloadable files. It is installed using SMP/E, and is in SMP/E RELFILE format. See 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 18 for more information about how to install the program.

4.0 Program and Service Level Information

This section identifies the program and any relevant service levels of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. The program level refers to the APAR fixes incorporated into the program. The service level refers to the PTFs incorporated into the program.

4.1 Program Level Information

This is the second release of WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS.

4.2 Service Level Information

A PTF containing APAR fixes against this release of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS has been incorporated into this product tape. For a list of included PTFs, examine the ++VER statement in the product's SMPMCS.

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. The following terminology is used:

- Driving system: the system used to install the program.
- Target system: the system on which the program is installed.

In many cases, the same system can be used as both a driving system and a target system. However, you may want to set up a clone of your system to use as a target system by making a separate IPL-able copy of the running system. The clone should include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Some cases where two systems should be used include the following:

- When installing a new level of a product that is already installed, the new product will delete the old
 one. By installing onto a separate target system, you can test the new product while still keeping the
 old one in production.
- When installing a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can
 disrupt the other products. Installing onto a test system or clone will allow you to assess these
 impacts without disrupting your production system.

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

5.1.2 Programming Requirements

Note: WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS installs in the z/OS (Z038) SREL.

- UNIX System Services must be up in full function mode on your driving system so that the utilities are available for the Shell Script support.
- Before installing WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS, you must ensure that the target system's HFS is available (OMVS active and the target file systems mounted) for processing.
- An SMP/E utility entry for the binder is required. You can specify any of these program names in the UTILITY entry: IEWLINK, HEWL, LINKEDIT, or HEWLH096.

5.2 Target System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the target system required to customize and use WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

5.2.1 Machine Requirements

The target system can run in any hardware environment that supports WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V6.1 plus service associated with PTF 6.0.1.8 for z/OS. Consider using binary floating point hardware, such as S/390 Parallel Enterprise Server Generation 5 systems, and later.

5.2.2 Programming Requirements

5.2.2.1 Installation Requisites

An installation requisite is defined as a product that is required and must be present or one that is not required but should be present on the system for the successful installation of this product.

A mandatory installation requisite identifies products that are required, without exception, or this product will not install on your system. This includes products specified as PREs or REQs.

A conditional installation requisite identifies products that are not required for successful install but may resolve such things as certain warning messages at installation time. They include products that are specified as IF REQs.

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS has no conditional installation requisites.

5.2.2.2 Operational Requisites

An operational requisite is defined as a product that is required and **must** be present or a product that is not required but **should** be present on the system in order for this product to operate all or some of its functions.

A mandatory operational requisite identifies products that are required, without exception, or this product **will not operate** its basic function unless the requisite is met. This includes products specified as PREs or REQs.

WebSphere Application Server V6.1 for z/OS is a requisite for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS

A conditional operational requisite identifies products that are **not required** for the basic function but are needed at run time for this product to utilize specific functions. They may include products specified as IF REQs.

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS has no conditional operational requisites.

5.2.2.3 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites

A toleration/coexistence requisite is defined as a product which must be present on a sharing system. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD at different time intervals.

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS has no toleration/coexistence requisites.

5.2.2.4 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites

A negative requisite identifies products which must not be installed on the same system as this product.

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS has no negative requisites.

5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS libraries can reside on all z/OS or z/OS.e supported DASD types.

Figure 10 on page 13 lists the total space required for each type of library.

If you currently have a previous release of this product installed in these libraries, the installation of this release will delete the old one and reclaim the space used by the old release and any service that had been installed. You can determine whether or not these libraries have enough space by deleting the old release with a dummy function, compressing the libraries, and comparing the space requirements with the free space in the libraries.

For more information on the names and sizes of the required data sets, refer to 6.1.6, "Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries" on page 21.

- 3. Abbreviations used for the HFS Path type are:
 - **N** New path, created by this product.
 - **X** Path created by this product, but may already exist from a previous release.

- P Previously existing path, created by another product.
- 4. All target and distribution libraries listed have the following attributes:
 - The default name of the data set may be changed.

Notes:

- 1. WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS will require several thousand additional tracks (3390) for run-time data sets; the amount of space depends on the application server structure to be used, the applications to be run and the amount of data storage the applications will require.
- 2. WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS requires significantly larger amounts of HFS storage for downloadable Application Server Client code. See 6.1.6, "Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries" on page 21 for more information.

5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Installing WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS may result in the deletion of other FMIDs. To see what FMIDs will be deleted, examine the ++VER statement in the product's SMPMCS.

If you do not want to delete these FMIDs at this time, you must install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS into separate SMP/E target and distribution zones.

Note: These FMIDs will not automatically be deleted from the Global Zone. Consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on how to do this.

5.4 Special Considerations

Install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS into a new set of SMP/E zones, including SMPCSI, target, distribution, and HFS data sets, to allow independent maintenance of WebSphere, z/OS, and other subsystems. This Program Directory provides sample jobs and instructions to create such an SMP/E environment. FMID JEJD128 must be installed into the SMP/E zones containing FMID HEJD700. HEJD700 install is covered in its own program directory.

During installation of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS on the driving system, the target filesystem must be mounted at the following mountpoint:

-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/zWebSphereXD/V6R1M1

where -PathPrefix- is a filesystem path prefix such as /SERVICE or /WXD61. Use of a filesystem path prefix allows maintenance to be applied to a copy of the WebSphere filesystem data sets without disturbing the production filesystem. For more information on the use of an filesystem path prefix during product maintenance, see the Unix System Services Planning book for your release of z/OS.

Care must be taken that maintenance is applied to the proper filesystem. Be sure to verify that the correct filesystem is mounted at your service mountpoint(s) whenever maintenance is applied.

5.4.1 Target System Mountpoint

During customization and operation of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS on the target system, the target filesystem must be mounted at the following mountpoint:

 A WebSphere Extended Deployment for V6.1.1 for z/OS mountpoint, normally usr/lpp/zWebSphereXD/V6R1M1

6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the installation method and the step-by-step procedures to install and activate the functions of WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS V6.1, or specific features if you ordered WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS v6.1.1 by Individual Components.

Please note the following:

- If you received WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. through CBPDO or ServerPac, follow the instructions in the Program Directory for that package.
- If you want to install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. into its own SMP/E environment, consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on creating and initializing the SMPCSI and the SMP/E control data sets.
- Sample jobs have been provided to help perform some or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries required for SMP/E execution have been defined in the appropriate zones.
- The SMP/E dialogs may be used instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation tasks.

For brevity, these instructions will refer only to WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS V6.1.1 unless an explanation is necessary to desribe a specific difference in the installation instructions for WebSphere Extended Deployment for z/OS V6.1.1 Individual Components.

Note: WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS can be installed into new or existing SMP/E zones.

6.1 Installing WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS

Run all installation steps from a user ID that is defined to Unix Systems Services, and has the following attributes:

- UID(0) or READ access or higher to the BPX.SUPERUSER facility class.
- READ access or higher to the BPX.FILEATTR.PROGCTL and BPX.FILEATTR.APF and BPX.FILEATTR.SHARELIB facility classes.

6.1.1 SMP/E Considerations for Installing WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS

This release of WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS is installed using the SMP/E RECEIVE, APPLY, and ACCEPT commands. The SMP/E dialogs may be used instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E install tasks. This program directory provides sample jobs and instructions to create such an SMP/E environment.

We recommend that you install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS into a new set of SMP/E zones, including target, distribution, and HFS data sets. This allows separate maintenance of z/OS and WebSphere software. You can customize sample jobs EEXCSICR and EEXZNCRT for your system and use these to create a new CSI and SMP/E TARGET and DLIB zones. You can find these jobs in the product relfile IBM.HEEX611.F3 which is loaded during SMP/E processing; see Figure 16 for a list of sample jobs.

Note: If you choose to install WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS into existing SMP/E target and distribution zones, be sure to remove any previous versions of WebSphere Extended Deployment from the zones and remove the previous version's DDDEFs **before** installing the new version. See 5.4, "Special Considerations" on page 16 for more information.

6.1.2 Sample Jobs

Sample jobs to allocate the target and distribution libraries, set up HFS directories, and create DDDEF entries for the WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS elements have been provided.

Figure 16 lists the sample jobs for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

Note: The jobs beginning with EEXXS are intended for use with WebSphere eXtreme Scale V7.0 for z/OS when purchased as a part of program number 5655-P28. See the program directory for WebSphere eXtreme Scale V7.0 for information on installing that product. If you have previously installed that product refer to section 6.1.10 for information on switching to the registration FMID which allows you to take advantage of the special pricing available with the purchase of program 5655-P28.

You can access the sample installation jobs by performing an SMP/E RECEIVE and then copying the jobs from the relfiles to a work data set for editing and submission. See Figure 16 on page 19 to find the appropriate relfile data set.

Each sample job contains comments with specific instructions for customization.

You may also choose to copy the jobs from the tape or product files by submitting the job below. Use either the //TAPEIN or the //FILEIN DD statement, depending on your distribution medium, and comment out or delete the other statement. Add a job card and change the lowercase parameters to uppercase values to meet your site's requirements before submitting.

6.1.3 Allocate SMP/E CSI (Optional)

If you are using an existing CSI, do not execute this job.

If you are allocating a new SMP/E CSI data set for this install, edit and submit sample job EEXCSICR to allocate the SMP/E CSI data set for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.4 Define New SMP/E TARGET and DLIB Zones (Optional)

Edit and submit sample job EEXZNCRT to define new SMP/E Target and Distribution zones. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.5 Perform SMP/E RECEIVE

Receive function SYSMODs and service for the WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS elements by running the RCVPDO job. For more information, refer to *MVS CBPDO Memo to User Extension* included with the CBPDO.

The CBPDO contains all non-integrated PTFs for every WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS FMID. (Cumulative service is included in CBPDO orders, so there is no separate cumulative service tape.) Depending on the options selected when you ordered the CBPDO, your order may contain service for other products in your profile.

To receive service for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS select the FMIDs for the components you purchased based on the list in section 1.2.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.6 Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries

Edit and submit sample job EEXALLOC to allocate the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.7 Allocate HFS Paths

Edit and submit sample job EEXISMKD to allocate the HFS paths for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

If you plan to create a new HFS for this product, you should consider updating the BPXPRMxxx PARMLIB member to mount the new HFS at IPL time. This may be helpful if an IPL occurs before the installation is complete.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

Important!

• The EEXISMKD and EEXDDDEF jobs use -PathPrefix- to represent a service directory on your driving system. It is assumed that you will be mounting WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS HFS data sets under a service directory that already contains the /usr and /usr/lpp directories. If you specify a -PathPrefix- directory which does not contain /usr and usr/lpp subdirectories, you must manually create these subdirectories before running the EEXISMKD job. If -PathPrefix-/usr/lpp is not a read/write HFS, you will need to manually create some additional subdirectories as well. See the comments in the EEXISMKD job for further information.

Check the job output to verify that all directories have been created.

Verify that the product filesystem is mounted at

-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/zWebSphereXD/V6R1M1

6.1.8 Create DDDEF Entries

Edit and submit sample job EEXDDDEF to create DDDEF entries for the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.9 Add Target Zones for Cross-Zone Prerequisite Checking

Because the WebSphere Extended Deployment component has a number of maintenance requirements for the target z/OS systems, we recommend that you add the appropriate SMP/E target zones (z/OS, DB2, CICS, and IMS for z/OS) to the WebSphere Extended Deployment SMP/E global zone. This will allow SMP/E to check each zone for maintenance required by WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

Customize and run the EEXXZDEF job to add target zones to the global zone which will be used for the SMP/E APPLY and ACCEPT steps in the following section.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.1.10 Special Case - Updating The Registration FMID

If this is your first install of all of the products in this suite at this release you should skip this section.

If you previously purchased the stand alone offering of any of the software included in this suite then you will have installed a registration FMID with that product. If you do not wish to do a full install of the product you will need to replace the installed registration FMID with one which reflects that you now own the suite. This does not impact operation of the products and does not require reconfiguration.

Edit and submit one or both of the following sample jobs as needed.

EEXREREG - If you previously installed either:

WebSphere Virtual Enterprise

WebSphere Compute Grid

EEXXSREG - If you previously installed WebSphere eXtreme Scale

Expected Return Codes and Messages from these jobs: You may receive a return code of 4 if this job runs correctly because you may not have any HOLDDATA to REJECT.

Once you have removed the old registration FMID you may use the install samples included in this package to install **only the new registration FMID.** Use job EEXREGRR to RECEIVE the new FMID or FMIDs and the APPLY and ACCEPT samples listed for the product or products that you are updating.

6.1.11 Perform SMP/E APPLY

Edit and submit sample job EEXAPPLY to perform an SMP/E APPLY CHECK for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

SMP/E apply processing for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS uses the Java SDK JAR command to extract certain HFS files. In order for the JAR command to run correctly, SMP/E must be running with a fix for APAR IR54653. If either SMP/E APAR IO04924 or IO05943 is installed, then SMP/E will NOT run /etc/profile or \$HOME/.profile and the PATH environment variable will not be set. A new DDDEF entry named SMPJHOME in the target zone is required. For example: //SMPJHOME DD PATH=//usr/lpp/java/J5.0'

Test the availability of the JAR command by logging into the OMVS Shell with the user ID that will be used to run the EEXAPPLY job and entering the following command: /usr/lpp/java/J5.0/jar

The JAR command should print its usage information.

If neither SMP/E APAR IO04924 nor IO05943 is installed, then SMP/E will run /etc/profile or \$HOME/.profile and the PATH environment variable will be set. The DDDEF entry named SMPJHOME in the target zone (set in samples job EEXZNCRT) is not required and can be removed if you choose. The

user ID used to run the EEXAPPLY job must have the SDK bin directory in its Unix System Services PATH. This can be accomplished in one of two ways:

1. Add an SDK bin directory containing the JAR command (such as /usr/lpp/java/IBM/J1.3/bin) to the PATH variable in /etc/profile before running the EEXAPPLY job. For example:

PATH=/usr/lpp/java/IBM/J1.3/bin:<rest of PATH>

2. Add an SDK bin directory to the PATH variable in a file named .profile in the HOME directory for the user ID used in running the EEXAPPLY job.

Test the availability of the JAR command by logging in to the OMVS shell with the user ID that will be used to run the EEXAPPLY job and entering the command "jar"; the JAR command should print its usage information. See the z/OS Unix System Services User's Guide for information about using /etc/profile and &HOME/.profile scripts.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the APPLY CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Enhanced HOLDDATA introduced ERROR HOLDs against FMIDs for HIPER APARS. Prior to installing, you should ensure you have the latest enhanced HOLDDATA (available at url http://service.software.ibm.com/holdata/390holddata.html). The FMID(s) should be installed regardless of the status of unresolved HIPERS, however, the software should not be deployed until the unresolved HIPERs have been analyzed to determine applicability.

There are two methods to complete an FMID installation where ++HOLDS for HIPERs exist for the FMID(s) being installed:

1. To ensure that all recommended and critical service is installed with the FMID(s), add the SOURCEIDs of PRP, HIPER, and RSU* to the APPLY command. There may be PE or HIPER APARs that do not have resolving PTFs available yet. You need to analyze the symptom flags to determine if you want to BYPASS the specific ERROR HOLDs and continue the FMID installation.

APPLY S(fmid,fmid,...)
FORFMID(fmid,fmid,...)
SOURCEID(PRP,HIPER,RSU*,...)
GROUPEXTEND .

This method requires more initial research, but will provide resolution for all HIPERs that have fixes available and are not in a PE chain. There may still be unresolved PEs or HIPERs which will require the use of BYPASS.

2. To install the FMID(s) as it would have been installed prior to Enhanced HOLDDATA, you can add a BYPASS(HOLDCLASS(HIPER)) operand to the APPLY command. This will allow the FMID to be installed even though there are HIPER ERROR HOLDs against it. Note that not all ERROR HOLDs were bypassed, only the HIPER ERROR HOLDs. After the FMID(s) are installed, the SMP/E REPORT ERRSYSMODS command should be run to identify any missing HIPER maintenance.

APPLY S(fmid,fmid,...)
FORFMID(fmid,fmid,...)
SOURCEID(RSU*)
GROUPEXTEND
BYPASS(HOLDCLASS(HIPER)) .
other parameters documented in the program directory...

This method is the quicker of the two, but requires subsequent review of the REPORT ERRSYSMODS to investigate any HIPERs.

If you bypass any HOLDs during the installation of the FMID(s) because fixing PTFs were not yet available you can use the APAR Status Tracking (AST) function of ServiceLink or the APAR Tracking function of ResourceLink to be notified when the fixing PTF is available.

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the APPLY CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the APPLY.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY CHECK: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

- Note!

Using GROUPEXTEND in APPLY with maintenance with HOLDDATA may cause a return code other than 0.

6.1.12 Perform SMP/E ACCEPT

Edit and submit sample job EEXACCEP to perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS.

To receive the full benefit of the SMP/E Causer SYSMOD Summary Report, do *not* bypass the following on the ACCEPT CHECK: PRE, ID, REQ, and IFREQ. This is because the SMP/E root cause analysis identifies the cause only of **ERRORS** and not of **WARNINGS** (SYSMODs that are bypassed are treated as warnings, not errors, by SMP/E).

Before using SMP/E to load new distribution libraries, it is recommended that you set the ACCJCLIN indicator in the distribution zone. This will cause entries produced from JCLIN to be saved in the distribution zone whenever a SYSMOD containing inline JCLIN is ACCEPTed. For more information on the ACCJCLIN indicator, see the description of inline JCLIN in the SMP/E manuals.

Once you have taken any actions indicated by the ACCEPT CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the ACCEPT.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E accept all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT CHECK: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

If PTFs containing replacement modules are being ACCEPTed, SMP/E ACCEPT processing will link-edit/bind the modules into the distribution libraries. During this processing, the Linkage Editor or Binder may issue messages documenting unresolved external references, resulting in a return code of 4 from the ACCEPT step. These messages can be ignored, because the distribution libraries are not executable and the unresolved external references will not affect the executable system libraries.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E should ACCEPT all requisite SYSMODS. The requisite SYSMODS may be part of other products; review the ACCEPT CHECK output carefully before proceeding.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT: You will receive a return code of 0 if this job runs correctly.

6.2 Activating WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS

WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS must be configured after SMP/E installation is complete. See the WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS Customization Guide for more information at: http://www.ibm.com/software/webservers/appserv/extend/library

6.2.1 HFS Execution

If you choose to have the HFS in which you have installed WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS mounted in read-only mode during execution, see the following section.

6.2.2 Mount the HFS Data Set on the Target System

Before proceeding with activation, unmount WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS datasets on the driving system and mount them on the target system at the target system mount points. See 5.4.1, "Target System Mountpoint" on page 17, for assistance in selecting the mountpoint.

If you have selected the default mountpoints, you can use the following TSO command on your target system to mount the HFS data set:

MOUNT FILESYSTEM('hlq.SEEXHFS')
MOUNTPOINT('/usr/lpp/zWebSphereXD/V6R1M1') TYPE(HFS) MODE(READ)

You will probably want to add these mounts to your BPXPRMxx members in parmlib to ensure that these data sets are always mounted. When, at a later date, you need to perform service on the WebSphere Extended Deployment V6.1.1 for z/OS product:

- Temporarily unmount the HFS data sets.
- Mount HFS data sets to be serviced at the service (-PathPrefix-) mountpoint you created for installation.
- Apply the service.
- Unmount the HFS data sets from the service mountpoint.
- Remount at the production mountpoint.
