1.0 Introduction

This program directory is intended for system programmers who are responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information about the material and procedures associated with the installation of IBM Installation Manager for z/OS Version 1.4.3. This publication refers to IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.

The Program Directory contains the following sections:

- 2.0, "Program Materials" on page 3 identifies the basic and optional program materials and documentation for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.
- 3.0, "Program Support" on page 6 describes the IBM support available for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.
- 4.0, "Program and Service Level Information" on page 8 lists the APARs (program level) and PTFs (service level) that have been incorporated into IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.
- 5.0, "Installation Requirements and Considerations" on page 9 identifies the resources and considerations that are required for installing and using IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.
- 6.0, "Installation Instructions" on page 17 provides detailed installation instructions for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. It also describes the procedures for activating the functions of IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4, or refers to appropriate publications.

Before installing IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4, read the *CBPDO Memo To Users* and the *CBPDO Memo To Users Extension* that are supplied with this program in softcopy format and this Program Directory; then keep them for future reference. Section 3.2, "Preventive Service Planning" on page 6 tells you how to find any updates to the information and procedures in this Program Directory.

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 is supplied in a Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3). The Program Directory that is provided in softcopy format on the CBPDO tape is identical to the hardcopy format that is provided with your order. All service and HOLDDATA for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 are included on the CBPDO tape.

Do not use this program directory if you install IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 with a SystemPac or ServerPac. When you use these offerings, use the jobs and documentation supplied with the offering. This documentation may point you to specific sections of this Program Director as required.

1.1 IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 Description

The IBM Installation Manager is a tool that you can use to install and maintain your software packages. On z/OS, the IBM Installation Manager runs as a Unix System Services application, and can be invoked from the Unix System Services shell, shell scripts, or from MVS batch jobs.

The IBM Installation Manager allows you to Simplify installation and maintenance and achieve faster

value through a simplified product installation, update, and uninstallation with integrated prerequisite and interdependency checking.

- The Installation Manager is a single installation program that loads and installs product components from a structured collection of files that is called a repository.
- The Installation Manager allows you to easily determine available product and maintenance packages, easily install selected packages after prerequisite and interdependency checking, and uninstall and roll back previously installed packages.
- Use remote or local repositories to install, modify, or update WebSphere Application Server, Version 8.0 products and related components such as:
 - IBM HTTP Server Version 8.0

For installing products on the z/OS, platform, command line invocation is supported. You can also create response files for silent mode invocation of the IBM Installation Manager

2.0 Program Materials

An IBM program is identified by a program number. The program number for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 is 5655-W65.

Before you install IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4, make sure that you have reviewed the current Preventive Service Planning (PSP) information. The PSP Buckets maintain current lists (which have been identified since the package was created) of any recommended or required service for the installation of this package. This service includes software PSP information that contains HIPER and required PTFs against the base release.

If you obtained IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 as part of a CBPDO, HOLDDATA is included.

If the CBPDO for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 is older than two weeks old by the time you install the product materials, you should contact the IBM Support Center or use S/390 Software Xcel to obtain the latest PSP Bucket information. 4.0 Program and Service Level Information

4.1 Program Level Information

This is the initial release of the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. There are no APAR fixes that apply.

4.2 Service Level Information

This is the initial release of the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.

There are no PTFs against this release of IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. The following terminology is used:

- Driving system: the system used to install the program; where SMP/E executes.
 The program might have specific operating system or product level requirements for using processes, such as binder or assembly utilities during the installation.
- Target system: the system on which the program is configured and run.

The program might have specific product level requirements, such as needing access to the library of another product for link-edits. These requirements, either mandatory or optional, might directly affect the element during the installation or in its basic or enhanced operation.

In many cases, you can use a system as both a driving system and a target system. However, you can make a separate IPL-able clone of the running system to use as a target system. The clone must include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Use separate driving and target systems in the following situations:

- When you install a new level of a product that is already installed, the new level of the product will replace the old one. By installing the new level onto a separate target system, you can test the new level and keep the old one in production at the same time.
- When you install a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. By installing the product onto a separate target system, you can assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system that is required to install IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.

5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

Mandatory installation requisites identify products that are required on the system for the successful installation of this product. These products are specified as PREs or REQs.

5.2.2.2 Operational Requisites: Operational requisites are products that are required by and must be present on the system or products that are not required by but should be present on the system for this product to operate all or part of its functions.

Mandatory operational requisites identify products that are required for this product to operate its basic functions. These products are specified as PREs or REQs.

5.2.2.3 Conditional operational requisites: Conditional operational requisites identify products that are required at run time for this product to operate specific functions. These products are specified as IF REQs.

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 has no conditional operational requisites.

5.2.2.4 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites: Toleration/coexistence requisites identify products that must be present on sharing systems. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD environment at different time intervals.

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 has no toleration/coexistence requisites.

5.2.2.5 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites: IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 has no negative requisites.

5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 libraries can reside on all supported DASD types.

Figure 11 lists the total space that is required for each type of library.

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 will require several hundred additional tracks (3390 tracks) for run-time data sets. The amount of space that is required depends on the characteristics of the products being installed.

5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Installing IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 might result in the deletion of other FMIDs. To see which FMIDs will be deleted, examine the ++VER statement in the SMPMCS of the product.

If you do not want to delete these FMIDs at this time, install IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 into separate SMP/E target and distribution zones.

Note: These FMIDs are not automatically deleted from the Global Zone. If you want to delete these FMIDs from the Global Zone, see the SMP/E manuals for instructions.

5.4 Special Considerations

IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 has no special considerations for the target system.

6.0 Installation Instructions

This chapter describes the installation method and the step-by-step procedures to install and to activate the functions of IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4.

Please note the following:

- If you want to install IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 into its own SMP/E environment, consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on creating and initializing the SMPCSI and the SMP/E control data sets.
- You can use the sample jobs that are provided to perform part or all of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries that are required for SMP/E execution have been defined in appropriate zones.
- You can use the SMP/E dialogs instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

You can access the sample installation jobs by performing an SMP/E RECEIVE and then copying the jobs from the relfiles to a work data set for editing and submission. See Figure 17 to find the appropriate relfile data set.

You can also copy the sample installation jobs from the tape or product files by submitting the following job. Depending on your distribution medium, use either the //TAPEIN or the //FILEIN DD statement and comment out or delete the other statement. Before you submit the job, add a job card and change the lowercase parameters to uppercase values to meet the requirements of your site.

See the following information to update the statements in the previous sample:

TAPEIN:

tunit is the unit value that matches the product tape.

volser is the volume serial that matches the product tape.

x is the tape file number that indicates the location of the data set name on the tape.

See the documentation that is provided by CBPDO for the location of IBM.fmid.Fy on the tape.

FILEIN:

filevol is the volume serial of the DASD device where the downloaded files reside.

OUT:

icl-library-name is the name of the output data set where the sample jobs are stored.

dasdvol is the volume serial of the DASD device where the output data set resides.

XXXXIN is either TAPEIN or FILEIN depending on your input DD statement.

6.1.2 Create SMP/E Zones (optional)

You can install the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 using an existing SMP/E global zone or create a new one. To create a new SMP/E global zone, edit and submit sample job GINCSICR.

You can install the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 into existing target and distribution zones or create new ones. To create a new SMP/E target and distribution zones, edit and submit sample job GINZNCRT.

6.1.3 Perform SMP/E RECEIVE

If you have obtained IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 as part of a CBPDO, use the RCVPDO job in the CBPDO RIMLIB data set to receive the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 FMIDs, service, and HOLDDATA that are included on the CBPDO tape. For more information, see the documentation that is included in the CBPDO.

The FMID for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 is HGIN140.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if the job runs correctly.

6.1.4 Allocate SMP/E Target and Distribution Libraries

Edit and submit sample job GINALLOC to allocate SMP/E target and distribution libraries for the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if the job runs correctly.

6.1.5 Allocate File System Paths

Edit and submit sample job GINISMKD to mount the file system for the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 at mountpoint:

-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/InstallationManager/V1R4

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if the job runs correctly. unless some of the required directories already exist, in which case you will receive a return code of 4.

6.1.6 Create DDDEF Entries

Edit and submit sample job GINDDDEF to create DDDEF entries for the SMP/E target and distribution libraries for the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: You will receive a return code of 0 if the job runs correctly

6.1.7 Perform SMP/E APPLY

Edit and submit sample job GINAPPLY to perform an SMP/E APPLY CHECK for IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

After you take actions that are indicated by the APPLY CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the APPLY.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E applies all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY CHECK: You will receive a return code of 0 or 4 if this job runs correctly, unless one or more HOLDs was bypassed, in which case you will receive a return code of 4.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from APPLY: You will a receive a return code of 0 or 4 if this job runs correctly, unless one or more HOLDs was bypassed, in which case you will receive a return code of 4.

6.1.8 Perform SMP/E ACCEPT

Edit and submit sample job GINACCEP to perform an SMP/E ACCEPT CHECK for the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4. Consult the instructions in the sample job for more information.

After you take actions that are indicated by the ACCEPT CHECK, remove the CHECK operand and run the job again to perform the ACCEPT.

Note: The GROUPEXTEND operand indicates that SMP/E accepts all requisite SYSMODs. The requisite SYSMODS might be applicable to other functions.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT CHECK: You will receive a return code of 0 or 4 if this job runs correctly, unless one or more HOLDs was bypassed, in which case you will receive a return code of 4.

Expected Return Codes and Messages from ACCEPT: You will receive a return code of 0 or 4 if this job runs correctly, unless one or more HOLDs was bypassed, in which case you will receive a return code of 4.

Mount the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 6.1.9

The SGINKIT file system now contains the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 installation kit, which can be used to create one or more Installation Managers.

Unmount the SGINKIT file system and remount it read-only at a location of your choice on the z/OS system where the Installation Manager will be created. The default mountpoint is

/usr/lpp/InstallationManager/V1R4

6.2 Activating IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4

An Installation Manager instance consists of a set of Installation Manager binaries together with a set of runtime data (appdata) and a cache location for shared resources. You can use the GIN2xxxx sample jobs to set up an Installation Manager instance ("Installation Manager" for short).

Each Installation Manager can install any number of products. You may only need one Installation manager per system or data center.

Complete instructions can be found in the IBM Installation Manager for z/OS V1.4 information center.

Here is a summary of the steps to create an Installation Manager.

- 1. Mount the Installation Manager installation kit (SGINKIT) on your z/OS system. The default path is /usr/lpp/InstallationManager/V1R4
- 2. Decide whether the Installation Manager will be used by a single superuser (uid=0), a single non-superuser, or by a number of user IDs connected to a single SAF group. Edit and submit sample job GIN2ADMN to create the "owning" user ID and group for the Installation Manager and add the required SAF permissions.
- 3. Edit and submit sample job GIN2CFS to allocate and mount a file system to contain the Installation Manager's binaries, run-time data, and shared data.
- 4. Edit and submit sample job GIN2INST to create the Installation Manager.

Run this job under the user ID that will "own" the Installation Manager.

You can now invoke the Installation Manager from the Unix System Services shell, or from a batch job.

If you created the Installation Manager in "admin" or "nonAdmin" mode, you must invoke the Installation Manager under the owning user ID.

If you created the Installation Manager in "group" mode, you can invoke the Installation Manager from the owning user ID, or from any user ID that is connected to the Installation Manager's owning group and has the permissions granted by sample job, GIN2ADMN.

See the following sample jobs for examples of invoking an Installation Manager in "batch" mode:

- GIN3CMD Issue any Installation Manager command.
- GIN3INST Install a product using the Installation Manager.
- GIN3UNIN Uninstall a product using the Installation Manager.

The IBM Installation Manager installation kit is only used when creating or updating an Installation Manager.

6.3 Updating an Installation Manager

The IBM Installation Manager installation kit is updated through normal service processes. Applying PTFs or APAR fixes for FMID HGIN140, updates the installation kit, but results in no changes to any Installation Managers that have already been created.

To update an Installation Manager:

- 1. Mount the IBM Installation Manager installation kit at the desired level. This file system should be mounted **read-only**.
- 2. Log on the Unix System Services shell under the owning user ID for the Installation Manager.
- 3. From the Installation installation kit directory, re-issue the **installc, userinstc, or groupinst** command that was originally used to create the Installation Manager. This will update the Installation Manager's binaries to the new level.
- 4. Issue the imcl -version command to verify that the Installation Manager has been updated.

cd <Installation Manager binaries>/eclipse/tools

imcl -version
