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1.0 Introduction

If you are installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 with a SystemPac or ServerPac, this program directory is used for reference only. When using these offerings, use the jobs and documentation supplied with the offering, which may point you to specific sections of this program directory as required.

If you are installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 using the MVS Custom-Built Product Delivery Offering (CBPDO, 5751-CS3), a softcopy program directory is provided on the CBPDO tape which is identical to the printed copy shipped with your order. Your CBPDO contains a softcopy preventive service planning (PSP) upgrade for this product. All service and HOLDDATA for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 are included on the CBPDO tape.

This program directory is intended for the system programmer responsible for program installation and maintenance. It contains information concerning the material and procedures associated with the installation of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. You should read all of this program directory before installing the program, then keep it for future reference.

1.1 WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 Description

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 is an e-business application deployment environment built on open standards-based technology. It is the cornerstone of WebSphere application offerings and services, providing support for Servlets, JavaServer Pages (JSPs), and Enterprise Java Beans (EJB), in compliance with Java 2 Enterprise Edition (J2EE) specifications. Version 4 brought together the Standard Edition and Enterprise Edition into a single product, providing a single offering. WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 continues to support connector access to CICS, IMS, and DB2. It also provides support for

connections across applications running on Web servers with back-end systems such as DB2, CICS, and IMS. Included in this support is IBM Developer's Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition at the SDK 1.3.1 level, which supplies the base support for applications at the Java 2 API level.

A 'Reduced Function' version of WebSphere MQ for z/OS V5.3.1 is also included in this version of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. The 'Reduced Function' provides support to allow J2EE-compliant JMS applications to perform messaging within WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

- Customers who want JMS-enabled applications to be able to pass messages to other applications in an MQSeries network, or to use MQSeries messaging to communicate with legacy applications via the MQSeries IMS or CICS bridges, will need a separately installed, full function WebSphere MQSeries to provide this connectivity.
- Customers who have a pre-existing full function MQSeries, or who want their JMS applications to work with a full function MQSeries, should not install the 'reduced function' form of MQSeries provided with WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.
- Customers who install the 'reduced function' form of WebSphere MQSeries can choose to upgrade it to a 'full function' WebSphere MQSeries at a later time by installing the 'full function' feature provided by the WebSphere MQSeries for z/OS V5.3.1 product.

Note: WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 can operationally co-exist with WebSphere Application Server for OS/390 and z/OS V4.

1.2 WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 FMIDs

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 consists of the FMIDs listed in Figure 1. An explanation of the table headings is listed below.

2.0 Program Materials

An IBM program is identified by a program number and a feature number. The program number for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 is 5655-I35.

If the CBPDO is more than two weeks old when you install it, you should contact the IBM Support Center or use S/390 SoftwareXcel to obtain the current "PSP Bucket".

5.0 Installation Requirements and Considerations

The following sections identify the system requirements for installing and activating WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. The following terminology is used:

- *Driving system*: the system used to install the program
- *Target system*: the system on which the program is installed

In many cases, the same system can be used as both a driving system and a target system. However, you may want to set up a clone of your system to use as a target system by making a separate, IPL-able copy of the running system. The clone should include copies of all system libraries that SMP/E updates, copies of the SMP/E CSI data sets that describe the system libraries, and your PARMLIB and PROCLIB.

Some cases where two systems should be used include the following:

- When installing a new level of a product that is already installed, the new product will delete the old one. By installing onto a separate target system, you can test the new product while still keeping the old one in production.
- When installing a product that shares libraries or load modules with other products, the installation can disrupt the other products. Installing onto a test system or clone will allow you to assess these impacts without disrupting your production system.

Note: If your SMPLTS data set is currently a PDS, you must allocate a new PDSE, copy your existing SMPLTS into it, then change the SMPLTS DDDEF entry to indicate the new PDSE data set. For more information, see Figure 14 on page 20.

5.1 Driving System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the driving system required to install WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

5.1.1 Machine Requirements

The driving system can run in any hardware environment that supports the required software.

1. UNIX must be up in full function mode on your driving system so that the utilities are available for the Shell Script support.
2. Before installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, you must ensure that the target system's HFS is available (OMVS active and the target file systems mounted) for processing.
3. An SMP/E utility entry for the binder is required. You can specify any of these program names in the UTILITY entry: IEWBLINK, HEWL, IEWL, LINKEDIT, or HEWLH096. (The linkage editor which uses the names HEWLKED, HEWLF064, IEWLF440, IEWLF880, and IEWLF128 cannot be used.)
4. The following installation jobs, as well as the SMP/E APPLY job, must be run under a userid with UID(0), or with a userid with read access to the BPX.SUPERUSER resource in the RACF facility class. This installation userid must also have read access to the facility class resources BPX.FILEATTR.PROGCTL and BPX.FILEATTR.APF.

5.2 Target System Requirements

This section describes the environment of the target system required to install and use WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

5.2.1 Machine Requirements

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 will run on any hardware that supports the OS/390 (V2R10 and later), z/OS, and z/OS.e operating systems.

5.2.2 Programming Requirements

5.2.2.1 Mandatory Requisites

A mandatory requisite is defined as a product that is required without exception; this product either **will not install** or **will not function** unless this requisite is met. This includes products that are specified as REQs or PREs.

5.2.2.3 Toleration/Coexistence Requisites

A toleration/coexistence requisite is defined as a product or service which must be present on a sharing system. These systems can be other systems in a multisystem environment (not necessarily sysplex), a shared DASD environment (such as test and production), or systems that reuse the same DASD at different time intervals.

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 has no toleration/coexistence requisites.

5.2.2.4 Incompatibility (Negative) Requisites

A negative requisite identifies products which must *not* be installed on the same system as this product.

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 has no negative requisites.

5.2.3 DASD Storage Requirements

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 libraries can reside on any DASD device supported by OS/390, z/OS, or z/OS.e. Space requirements are given here in 3390 tracks.

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 will require additional space for data sets, HFS files, and DB2 tables used by customer applications. Space requirements will vary with the application.

5.3 FMIDs Deleted

Installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 may result in the deletion of other FMIDs. To see what FMIDs will be deleted, examine the ++VER statement in the product's SMPMCS.

If you do not wish to delete these FMIDs at this time, you must install WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 into separate SMP/E target and distribution zones.

Note: These FMIDs will not automatically be deleted from the Global Zone. Consult the SMP/E manuals for instructions on how to do this.

5.4 Special Considerations

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 is a functional successor to the following products:

- WebSphere Application Server Version 3.02 Standard Edition (5655-A98)
- WebSphere Application Server Version 3.02 Enterprise Edition (5655-A98)
- WebSphere Application Server Version 3.5 Standard Edition (5655-A98)
- WebSphere Application Server Version 4.0 for z/OS and OS/390 (5655-F31)

- WebSphere Application Server Version 4.0.1 for z/OS and OS/390 (5655-F31)

In addition, the Software Development Kit (SDK) included with WebSphere Application Server Version 5.0 is identical to the SDK contained in the following products, and is a functional successor to various old Java levels.

- IBM Developer Kit for OS/390™, Java 2 Technology Edition, V1.1 (5655-D35)
- WebSphere Application Server for OS/390 Version 3.5 Standard Edition (5665-F31)
- WebSphere Application Server V4.0 for z/OS and OS/390 (5655-F31)
- WebSphere Application Server Version 4.0.1 for z/OS and OS/390 (5655-F31)

If you have previously installed any of these products, you should take the following considerations into account when installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

5.4.1 SMP/E Considerations

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 will delete previous versions of WebSphere for OS/390 and WebSphere MQ for z/OS if installed into the same SMP/E zone. When installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 into the same SMP/E zones used for your OS/390 or z/OS operating system, you will either have to re-install WAS 5.0 in the new zones in which OS/390 or z/OS is installed when upgrading to a new release of OS/390 or z/OS, or use the SMP/E BUILD MCS command to get WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 in the same SMP/E zones as the new release of OS/390 or z/OS.

We recommend that you install WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 into a new set of SMP/E zones, including target, distribution, and HFS data sets, to allow easier and separate migrations of z/OS or OS/390, and WebSphere. This program directory provides sample jobs to create such an SMP/E environment.

5.4.2 Selecting Driving System Mountpoints

During installation of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 on the driving system, the target HFS file systems must be mounted at the following mountpoints:

- /-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/java
- /-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/zWebSphere/V5R0M0
- /-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1

where /-PathPrefix- is an HFS path prefix such as /SERVICE or /WAS50. Use of a path prefix allows maintenance to be applied to a copy of the WebSphere HFS data sets without disturbing the production HFS data sets. For more information on the use of an HFS path prefix during product maintenance, see the Unix System Services Planning book for your release of OS/390 or z/OS (see Figure 5 on page 7).

Care must be taken that maintenance is applied to the proper HFS. You may wish to use a separate HFS path prefix for each WebSphere release to prevent inadvertent modification of the wrong WebSphere level.

5.4.3 Selecting Target System Mountpoints

During customization and operation of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 on the target system, the target HFS file systems must be mounted at the following mountpoints:

- an SDK mountpoint, normally `/usr/lpp/java`
- a WebSphere mountpoint, normally `/usr/lpp/zWebSphere/V5R0M0`
- an MQSeries Java support mountpoint, normally `/usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1`

If the SDK mountpoint is in use on the target system by an identical version of the SDK that shipped in WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 (see list above), then the existing SDK HFS at this mountpoint can be replaced with the one installed as part of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, after ensuring that the maintenance level of the new SDK is at least as high as that of the old SDK. (This should normally be the case, as WebSphere Application Server code usually requires a very current SDK maintenance level.)

If the MQSeries Java support mountpoint is in use on the target system by an identical version of the MQSeries Java support to that shipped in WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, then the existing MQSeries Java support at this mountpoint can be replaced with the one installed as part of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, after ensuring that the maintenance level of the new MQSeries Java support is at least as high as that of the old MQSeries Java support. (This should normally be the case, as WebSphere Application Server code usually requires a very current MQSeries Java support maintenance level.)

The WebSphere mountpoint is version-specific and new with Version 5.0; there should be no conflict with mountpoints for previous versions.

In the remainder of this program directory, it is assumed that the SDK mountpoint and WebSphere mountpoint used for WebSphere for z/OS and OS/390 have been chosen according to the above requirements.

5.4.4 Removal of Older Java and WebSphere Levels

Java applications written to use older versions of Java (i.e., those versions prior to SDK 1.3.0) may not run properly with the SDK contained in WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. Information on incompatibilities between older levels of JAVA and SDK 1.3.0 can be found on the Web at <http://www.ibm.com/s390/java>

The older Java level(s) should be maintained until all applications dependent on them have been migrated to the new SDK.

WebSphere Application Server versions prior to WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 should be maintained until all applications have been migrated to Version 5.0.

Older versions of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS and OS/390 can be removed from the target system as soon as the migration process to WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 is complete.

6.0 Installation Instructions

This section describes the installation method, and the step-by-step procedures to install, and activate the functions of, WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

Note:

- WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 should be installed into a separate SMP/E zone from OS/390 or z/OS. IBM strongly recommends that the product be installed in a new set of SMP/E zones and libraries. This includes SMP/E target and distribution zones, as well as the HFS data set. A sample job to create and initialize the SMP/CSI and SMP/E control data sets is provided below; consult the SMP/E documentation for more information.
- Sample jobs have been provided to help perform some, or all, of the installation tasks. The SMP/E jobs assume that all DDDEF entries required for SMP/E execution have been defined in the appropriate zones.

If you are not installing a new WebSphere MQ for z/OS, then you do not need to customize, or run any CSQ8xxxx jobs.

- The SMP/E dialogs may be used instead of the sample jobs to accomplish the SMP/E installation steps.

6.1 Installing WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

6.1.1 Create New SMP/E Zones for WebSphere Application Server V5.0

IBM strongly recommends that WebSphere Application Server V5.0 be installed in a new set of SMP/E zones and libraries. There are two sample jobs that follow. The first sample job provides an example of setting up a new SMP/E CSI (including a new GLOBAL zone) for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. You may use this sample if you wish to place this product in a new SMP/E GLOBAL zone - if you do use it, then you would also use the second sample job to set up the new target and distribution zones.

The second sample job provides an example of setting up new SMP/E target and distribution zones. You can use this job independent of the first sample job if you want to define new target and distribution zones in an existing SMP/E GLOBAL zone. By using your existing GLOBAL zone, you do not have to redefine many SMP/E GLOBAL data sets and the SMP/E OPTIONS entries. Please note that, if using just the second sample job, you will need to edit the job with the appropriate GLOBAL ZONEINDEX information, and any other information to reflect your SMP/E product environment.

6.1.2 Create a Cross-Zone Set

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 and OS/390 requires that products to be used with it be at fairly current maintenance levels. Much of this prerequisite maintenance can be checked automatically by SMP/E, if **cross-zone processing** is used to check associated SMP/E zones for installed PTF levels.

There are two different methods that can be used for cross-zone processing. A zone group can be defined and added to the install jobs, or the XZGROUP operand can be used. XZGROUP(value) contains a list of ZONESETs or zones that are used to establish the zone group. Each value in the list must be a valid ZONESET or zone name. XZGROUP(value) would be added to the install jobs instead of adding the XZREQCHK operand to one or more ZONESETs.

The operand XZREQ provides a method for a user to more easily install cross-zone requisites. SMP/E identifies the cross-zone requisites needed in the set-to zone by reading CIFREQ data in the secondary zones of the zone group in effect for the current APPLY/ACCEPT commands. Any CIFREQ data that is

for FMIDs installed, or being installed, into the set-to zone that are not yet in the set-to zone causes the required SYSMODs to become candidates for installation. If the FORFMID operand is also used, the FMID specified on the CIFREQ must match one of the FMIDs specified on the FORFMID operand for the SYSMOD to become a candidate.

By adding the new XZREQ operand, the CIFREQ SYSMODs are installed automatically into the set-to zone. However, XZREQ does not install the CIFREQs in the other cross-dependent zones. An APPLY XZREQ needs to be performed against the other zones to synchronize service.

Note: If SYSMODs being installed into the set-to zone have requirements against the other cross-zones, that service must be APPLY'd to those zones before installation can be completed into the set-to zone.

For more information on this operand, refer to *OS/390 SMP/E Commands*, SC28-1805. See Figure 18 on page 39 for an example of how to set up the ZONEINDEX, ZONESET, and XZREQCHK for use during the APPLY/ACCEPT. See Figure 24 on page 50 for an example of the APPLY using the XZREQ operand.

2. Update the STEPLIB DD statement (if necessary for your system).
3. Replace the CSI name on the SMPCSI DD statement with your CSI name.
4. Update cross-dependency zones and CSI names.

Successful processing issues a return code of 0.

6.1.3 RECEIVE WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

RECEIVE FMIDs and service for the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 elements by running the RCVPDO job. For more information, refer to *MVS CBPDO Memo to User Extension* included with the CBPDO.

The CBPDO contains all non-integrated PTFs for every WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 FMID. (Cumulative service is included in CBPDO orders, so there is no separate cumulative service tape.) Depending on the options selected when you ordered the CBPDO, your order may contain service for other products in your profile, or for just the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 FMIDs. As a result, maintenance may be delivered that is already APPLY'd and ACCEPT'd.

If you are installing MQ Series V5.3.1, you may need to update the RCVPDO job to reflect the appropriate information of what CSI you wish to use. If using the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 CSI, please refer to 6.1.4.1, "SMP/E Global Zone" on page 41. This section will help you determine what information is needed to update the RCVPDO job with.

If you are not installing WebSphere MQ for z/OS at this time, do not receive FMIDs HMS5310, JMS5311, JMS5314, JMS5318, JMS5312, or JMS5313.

Successful RECEIVE processing issues a return code of 0.

6.1.4 Customizing the MQ Support Installation Jobs

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 uses elements of WebSphere MQ for z/OS to provide integrated messaging support. You can choose either a pre-existing installation of WebSphere MQ for z/OS to provide this support, or to install the WebSphere MQ for z/OS provided with WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

If you choose to install the WebSphere MQ for z/OS provided with WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, there are two methods for customizing the sample install jobs found in 6.1.5, "Sample Jobs" on page 41.

- Batch update method - read Appendix A, "Customizing the WebSphere MQ for z/OS Installation jobs" on page 59, and perform the steps described to customize the "CSQ8xxxx" jobs mentioned in the following sections before proceeding with the installation.
- Manual update method - When you get to 6.1.5, "Sample Jobs" on page 41, customize the "CSQ8xxxx" jobs by following the comments in the job. You will need to add a job card.

6.1.4.1 SMP/E Global Zone

WebSphere MQ for z/OS can be installed using the global zone just defined for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

To use the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 global zone, ensure that GZONECSI and SHLQUAL are set to the values used in the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 CSI. (refer to Appendix A, “Customizing the WebSphere MQ for z/OS Installation jobs” on page 59).

6.1.4.2 Target and distribution zones

If you need to create new target and distribution zones for WebSphere MQ, run the following jobs:

- CSQ8TZON to create a target zone
- CSQ8DZON to create a distribution zone

Expected Return Codes and Messages:

Both jobs consist of a number of steps, all of which should complete with a return code of 0.

If any of the return codes is not 0, inspect the job output to determine what caused the problem, correct it, and then rerun the job from the step that failed.

6.1.5 Sample Jobs

Sample jobs to allocate the target and distribution libraries, set up HFS directories, and create DDDEF entries for the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 elements have been provided. After RECEIVE processing, the jobs can be found in the SMPTLIB data sets. Copy the sample jobs to a work data set and customize them. For specific instructions on customizing, see the comments in the sample jobs.

Figure 19 lists the locations of the sample ALLOCATE, MKDIR, and DDDEF jobs for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

4. Expected Return Code for sample jobs is RC 0.

The DDDEFs belong to the Internet Gateway feature (FMID JMS5316), which is not shipped with WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

6.1.6 Define Target and Distribution Libraries for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

Submit the customized AJVALLOC and BBOALLOC jobs to define target and distribution libraries.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: RC=0

If you are installing WebSphere MQ for z/OS at this time, submit the customized CSQ8ALOE and CSQ8JALO jobs. Although you can modify the jobs to install into your root HFS, IBM strongly suggests that you allocate a new HFS for this product. Check the allocation and deallocation messages to be certain the data sets were allocated and cataloged correctly.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: RC=0

If you are installing WebSphere MQ with national language support (Chinese, Japanese, or Uppercase English), run the appropriate customization allocation jobs listed in Figure 19 on page 41 for the language(s) you choose.

Expected Return Codes and Messages: RC=0

6.1.7 Set Up HFS Directories for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

At this time, you need to make the HFS data sets which will contain the HFS target directories available to install WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. (Remember, although you can install WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 into your existing root HFS data set, IBM strongly recommends that they be separate.) There are three HFS data sets which are required for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0. For Application Server, sample job BBOALLOC, which you ran in the previous section, allocated the Application Server HFS data sets. For IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition, you must manually create the Java HFS. The following JCL can be used:

EXPECTED RETURN CODES AND MESSAGES: RC=0

Important!

During the creation of the mountpoints and the mounting of the HFS data sets, the convention `-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/mountpoint` is used. `-PathPrefix-` allows you to specify a service directory on your driving system. It is assumed that you will be mounting the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 HFS data sets under a service directory that already contains the `/usr` and `/usr/lpp` directories. If this is not the case, you must create the `/usr` and `/usr/lpp` directories manually under your `-PathPrefix-` directory **prior** to running the sample commands to create the mountpoint, and mount the HFS for IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition, since the commands shown are UNIX and TSO commands.

If you have allocated the optional HFS data sets for WAS temp text, you must make them available on your driving system for installation. For IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition, use the following sample commands to create the mountpoint and mount the IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition HFS data set:

From the Unix shell:

Once the Java Development Kit HFS has been mounted, run the customized sample jobs `AJVISMKD` and `BBOISMKD`, listed in Figure 19 on page 41, from a userid that is `UID(0)`, or that has read access to the `BPX.SUPERUSER` resource in the RACF facility class. The userid also needs read access to the `BPX.FILEATTR.PROGCTL` and `BPX.FILEATTR.APF` facility class resources. You will receive a return code of 0 for each step, if it is successful.

If WebSphere MQ for z/OS is being installed at this time, mount the HFS using:

From the Unix shell:

EXPECTED RETURN CODES AND MESSAGES: RC=0

Once the customized sample jobs AJVISMKD, BBOISMKD, and CSQ8JMKJ provided in Figure 19 on page 41, have been run, and before continuing with the installation of WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0, you must verify the following:

1. You have allocated three HFS data sets for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 - one for each element (Application Server, IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition, and WebSphere MQ).
2. You have defined a mountpoint for each of the three HFS data sets (for instance: -PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/zWebSphere/V5R0M0, -PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/java, and -PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1).
3. You have mounted the three HFS data sets, one for each element (Application Server, IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition, and WebSphere MQ), to your driving system.

Note:

If you are not installing MQ at this time, there is no requirement for the MQ HFS (-PathPrefix-/usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1) to be defined or mounted on the driving system.

After you have verified the above items, continue with the installation in defining the DDDEFS for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

6.1.8 SMP/E CALLLIBS Processing and Side Decks Processing

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 uses the CALLLIBS function provided in SMP/E and definition side decks to resolve external references during installation. When WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 is installed, ensure that DDDEFS exist in the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 target zone for libraries listed in Figure 22.

The DDDEFs should point to the appropriate data sets used by the target OS/390 or z/OS system; that is, the version of OS/390 or z/OS on which the Application Server will be run, if different from that of the system being used to install the product.

Figure 21 lists the common DDDEFs needed by WebSphere and MQSeries for CALLLIBs processing.

6.1.9 Define DDDEFs for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

Run the customized sample jobs AJVDDDEF and BBODDDEF.

EXPECTED RETURN CODES AND MESSAGES: RC=0

If WebSphere MQ for z/OS is being installed at this time, run the customized sample jobs CSQ8DDDF and CSQ8JDDD to create SMP/E DDDEFs for target and distribution data sets. Remove the ADD DDDEF statements for CSSLIB, SCEECPP, SCEELKED, SCEESPC and SGSKHFS from the CSQ8DDDF job before running it, since these DDDEFs are also created by job BBODDDEF. You should receive a return code of 0. If any of the DDDEF entries exist, you will get a non-zero return code. Check the output to see what caused the non-zero return code.

Figure 19 on page 41 lists the locations of the sample jobs.

EXPECTED RETURN CODES AND MESSAGES: RC=0

6.1.10 Perform SMP/E APPLY CHECK for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 FMIDs and Service

Run an APPLY CHECK to identify any requisite service and additional holds. Resolve any holds and receive any requisite service identified by the APPLY CHECK before the next step.

Figure 23 shows a sample APPLY CHECK for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0.

where aaaaaaa--SYSMOD ID

- “GIM35966I SYSTEM HOLD aaaaaaa ORIGINATED BY SYSMOD bbbbbbb WAS BYPASSED.”

where: aaaaaaa--system hold reason ID and bbbbbbb--SYSMOD ID

Otherwise, RC=0

Notes:

1. The XZREQ operand needs to be specified only when cross-zone processing is required. If this operand is specified when there is no zone group set up, the following message will be received, which is acceptable:

6.1.11 Perform SMP/E APPLY for WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 FMIDs and Service

Once all exceptions reported by the APPLY CHECK have been resolved, run the SMP/E APPLY step to install the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 products. This job must be run under a userid with either UID(0), or with a userid with read access to the BPX.SUPERUSER RACF Facility class. Also, the userid must have read access to the BPX.FILEATTR.PROGCTL and BPX.FILEATTR.APF resources in the RACF Facility class. **In addition, you must remove the LISTPRIV parameter from your GLOBAL zone linkedit utility in your SMP/E CSI.**

Note: Using NOLIST in the SMP/E UTILITY entry for the binder will allow APPLY processing to complete faster, as well as reduce the amount of output generated by more than half (without using NOLIST, approximately 10 million lines of output are created).

Figure 24 shows a sample APPLY for the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 functions, plus RECEIVE'd PTFs for these functions.

Otherwise RC=0

6.2 Activating WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0

6.2.1 Migrating from Previous Releases of WebSphere Application Server

For information on migration, see the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS InfoCenter, which is accessible through the library Web site http://www.ibm.com/software/webservers/appserv/zos_os390/library.html.

6.2.2 Mount the HFS Data Sets on the Target System

Before proceeding with activation, unmount the WebSphere Application Server HFS data sets on the driving system, and mount them on the target system at the target system mountpoints. See 5.4.3, “Selecting Target System Mountpoints” on page 27, for assistance in selecting these mountpoints. If you have selected the default mountpoints, you can use the following TSO commands on your target system to mount the HFS data sets:

```
MOUNT FILESYSTEM('your.java.hfs') MOUNTPOINT('/usr/lpp/java') TYPE(HFS) MODE(READ)
MOUNT FILESYSTEM('hlq.SBBOHFS') MOUNTPOINT('/usr/lpp/zWebSphere/V5R0M0') TYPE(HFS) MODE(READ)
MOUNT FILESYSTEM('your.mqjms.hfs') MOUNTPOINT('/usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1') TYPE(HFS) MODE(READ)
```

You will probably want to add these mounts to your BPXPRMxx members in parmlib to ensure that these data sets are always mounted. When, at a later date, you need to perform service on the WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0 product:

- Temporarily unmount the HFS data sets.
- Mount HFS data sets to be serviced (-pathprefix-) mountpoints you created for installation.
- Apply the service.
- Unmount both data sets from the service mountpoint.
- Remount them at the production mountpoints given above.

6.2.3 Activating Application Server

WebSphere Application Server for z/OS V5.0: Installation and Customization, GA22-7834, contains the step-by-step procedures to activate the functions of Application Server.

6.2.4 Activating IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition

There are no further actions required to activate IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition other than the actions documented in this program directory.

6.2.4.1 Update the Environment Path

IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition is invoked as a command under the UNIX System Services shell. The path environment variable must be updated to point to the Java executables so that the command will be found. This can be done with the following shell command:

```
export PATH=/usr/lpp/java/IBM/J1.3/bin:$PATH
```

The export command references the default path into which IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition was installed. If you changed the default path, change the export command accordingly.

Alternatively, you can add the IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition path to the system path variable contained in `/etc/profile`.

Once the path environment variable has been set, you can enter the following shell commands:

```
java
```

```
java -version
```

IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition is successfully installed if the `java` command responds with a summary of available options, and the `version` option responds with the current version of the IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition code.

6.2.4.2 Using the Just-In-Time Compiler

IBM Developer Kit for OS/390, Java 2 Technology Edition contains a Just-In-Time (JIT) compiler built specifically for OS/390. The JIT compiler provides execution time improvements over the interpreter. By default, the JIT compiler is activated, but can be deactivated by setting an environment variable.

To deactivate usage of the JIT, issue the following shell command prior to invoking Java:

```
export JAVA_COMPILER=
```

To activate usage of the JIT after it has been deactivated, issue the following shell command prior to invoking Java:

```
unset JAVA_COMPILER
```

Note that the environment variable names and values are case sensitive and should be entered exactly as shown.

6.2.4.3 Using Windowing Support

To use the Java Windowing Support (AWT), the X/Windows feature of TCP/IP must be installed on the OS/390 or z/OS host. Your workstation must also have the appropriate X/Windows server software to communicate with the host.

The DISPLAY environment variable must be set to the IP address or name of the X server (the workstation) on which the window is to be displayed. For example,

```
export DISPLAY=myhost.hursley.ibm.com:0.0
```

defines myhost.hursley.ibm.com as the workstation running the X server.

The DISPLAY variable must be set prior to invoking Java.

6.2.4.4 Audio Support

Audio is not supported when running applets. An applet that attempts to use audio will function, but no audio will be produced.

For general information about running Java applications and compiling Java source, visit the Web site <http://www.ibm.com/java>.

6.2.5 Activating WebSphere MQ for z/OS

Before you can start to use WebSphere MQ for z/OS, it must be customized. This is described in the *WebSphere MQ for z/OS System Setup Guide, SC34-6052*.

The customization steps require changes to system parmlibs, and may need an IPL to activate the changes.

Installation verification programs are provided with WebSphere MQ for z/OS. These cannot be run until WebSphere MQ for z/OS has been customized and a WebSphere MQ for z/OS subsystem has been activated.

6.2.5.1 Preparing LPA data sets

By default, two WebSphere MQ data sets have to be added to the LPA; SCSQLINK, and one of the following:

- SCSQSNLE
- SCSQSNLC
- SCSQSNLK
- SCSQSNLU

A user modification is provided in CSQ8ERLY, in data set THQ.TCSQINST that moves the contents of the SCSQSNLx data set into SCSQLINK so that only one data set needs to be added to the LPA. Customize job CSQ8ERLY and run it; it should complete with return code 4.

The return code of 4 should be accompanied by the following message:


```
GIM61901W LMOD CSQNL28x WAS NOT MOVED BY SYSMOD CSQ8RLY BECAUSE  
CSQNL28x IS NOT IN THE dist ZONE
```

where "**dist**" is the name you allocated for the distribution zone and "**x**" is the language suffix used in customizing the job.

Appendix A. Customizing the WebSphere MQ for z/OS Installation jobs

The following sections lead you through customizing the WebSphere MQ for z/OS installation jobs which have names like CSQ8xxxx.

The process is to:

- Choose values for data set names appropriate for your site's standards.
- Edit CSQ8SYSW, the global customization job, filling in the values you have chosen.
- Submit CSQ8SYSW, which will perform the customizing of all the other CSQ8xxxx jobs you will need to complete your installation of WebSphere MQ for z/OS.

A.1.1 Choosing values

A.1.1.1 High-level qualifiers

Use Figure 27 to plan the high-level qualifiers for the WebSphere MQ for z/OS data sets.

If these high-level qualifiers do not already exist, you must define them to RACF, or any other security product you are using, and have ALIAS definitions in the master catalog.

The TSO userid used to install or service WebSphere MQ for z/OS requires RACF ALTER access to these high-level qualifiers. See the *WebSphere MQ for z/OS System Setup Guide* (Figure 5 on page 7) for details of the security authorization required for running WebSphere MQ for z/OS.

If you are going to use the Spool Display and Search Facility (SDSF) to look at the output from the installation jobs, you must have authorization to use the prefix CSQ8* to view them, or you must customize the names of the jobs to use a prefix to which you are authorized. This can be done using the JCPREF option in CSQ8SYSJ as described in A.1.3, "Customize the sample installation JCL" on page 63.

A.1.1.2 Volume and unit names

Plan the volume and unit names shown in Figure 28. These are used by the supplied sample JCL during the installation of WebSphere MQ for z/OS. You must decide where you are going to install the product, taking into account the space requirements (see Figure 17 on page 23 and Figure 13 on page 20), and how frequently the data sets are going to be accessed.

A.1.1.3 SMP/E Environment

You must also decide whether to install WebSphere MQ for z/OS into a new or existing SMP/E environment. Remember that installing a new release of WebSphere MQ for z/OS into the same SMP/E zones as an existing release will cause the earlier level to be deleted from both the SMP/E zones and the existing release data sets.

If you are going to install into the same SMP/E zones, then to preserve your current release while you install and test the new release, you should copy the existing release data sets into data sets with different names. Do not rename or delete the current data sets because they need to be available to SMP/E for delete processing during the installation of the new release. If they are not available, the APPLY and ACCEPT steps will fail with a return code of 12. After running a successful ACCEPT of the WebSphere MQ for z/OS products, the previous release data sets are no longer required and can be deleted when testing of the new release has been completed.

If you use existing SMP/E data sets, you need to know the names of your target zone and distribution zone, and the data set name of your global CSI.

You must also decide upon the names for the SMP/E zones.

A.1.1.4 HFS

The IBM WebSphere MQ for z/OS Java Support installs into the HFS in Unix System Services. By default, code is installed under the path /usr/lpp/mqm/V5R3M1.

If you choose to change this default behavior, then modify the **PATHPREFIX** value in CSQ8SYSW.

A.1.2 Create the installation JCL

This section describes how to customize the **CSQ8xxxx** jobs for your environment.

A.1.2.1 Read in the sample installation JCL

Copy the installation jobs from the SMPTLIB into a work data set, DHQ.UCSQINST, by submitting the job below:

1. Type in the following JCL as DHQ.XCSQINST, a sequential dataset, substituting the values you have chosen for **dqh**, **dasdvol**, and **filevol** into the JCL, and adding job statement information if required. **IBM** is the high-level qualifier specified as the DSPREFIX value in the SMPTLIB DDDEF or the OPTIONS entry of the global zone.

```

2. Run the above job to load the samples. The job should finish with a return code of 0.

If the return code is not 0, check the job output carefully to ensure that the sample jobs have been copied correctly. If the sample jobs have not been copied correctly, correct any errors found, and re-submit the job.

You have now read all the sample jobs into the data set `DHQ.UCSQINST`.

The next step is to customize the sample jobs for your system.

A.1.3 Customize the sample installation JCL

To customize the sample installation JCL, use the customization job `CSQ8SYSW` provided with WebSphere MQ for z/OS.

'Reduced Function' form

You are installing a 'reduced function' form of the WebSphere MQ supplied as part of a WebSphere Application Server, so you will need to edit the customization job `CSQ8SYSW`.

`CSQ8SYSW` is set up to customize only those jobs required for the installation of a 'reduced function' form of WebSphere MQ.

If you use `CSQ8SYSW`, you can customize the sample jobs by adding the names you chose in section A.1.1.1, "High-level qualifiers" on page 59, to `CSQ8SYSW` in `DHQ.UCSQINST` and running this job.

We recommend that you customize all the installation jobs together, although you might not need some of them until later.

CSQ8SYSW calls a CLIST to copy and edit the sample jobs from DHQ.UCSQINST to THQ.TCSQINST. If THQ.TCSQINST does not exist, it is created by CSQ8SYSW. Full instructions for modifying CSQ8SYSW are included in its comments. Where selections are to be made, this is usually done by removing the leading asterisk.

The following rules apply when updating CSQ8SYSW:

- Enter values in the correct case (uppercase for everything except SLLPREFIX, THFSPATH, and PATHPREFIX, which can contain lowercase letters).
- The keywords in the JCL can appear in any order and start in any column, as long as they are the first non-blank characters on a line and are within columns 1 through 72.
- If you place a non-blank character before a keyword, the line is treated as a comment. Use an asterisk as the non-blank character to avoid accidentally forming a valid keyword.
- Do not delete lines in CSQ8SYSW because you might need them in the future. If they do not apply, comment them out by placing an asterisk at the beginning of the unwanted lines.

Use your usual editor to update CSQ8SYSW in DHQ.UCSQINST as follows:

1. Change the job statement at the top of CSQ8SYSW to match the requirements of your enterprise. If you need to code a 'TIME=' parameter on your JCL, a value of 10 minutes CPU time is enough to run CSQ8SYSW.
2. Customize the JCL statements in Section 2 of CSQ8SYSW with the names you have chosen for DHQ and THQ. Replace the variable DHQ for the SYSPROC and MINPUT lines, and the variable THQ for the MOUTPUT line.
3. Select the features you want (none of the features are mutually exclusive):
 - a. Since you are installing a 'reduced function' form of WebSphere MQ, some features are not available for installation and the leading asterisk should not be removed from the corresponding feature in CSQ8SYSW.
 - b. Both the base and U.S. English (mixed case) FMIDS must always be installed; do **not** change this.

The following tokens are used in CSQ8SYSW:

MQM

Base product

MQMNL US ENGLISH

U.S. English (mixed case) language feature

MQMNL JAPANESE

Optional Japanese language feature

MQMNL SIMPLIFIED CHINESE

Optional simplified Chinese language feature

MQMNL UPPERCASE ENGLISH

Optional U.S. English (uppercase) language feature

JMS Java Support

IBM WebSphere MQ for z/OS Java Support

4. Choose which sample jobs you want to customize. CSQ8SYSW is supplied with only those jobs selected which are appropriate for the features supplied with WebSphere Application Server.

You can change this default behavior, if required, by 'commenting out' the select statements with an asterisk in column 1.

5. Type job statement information for the sample jobs. You must leave the characters

```
JOB //xxxxxxx JOB
```

intact and insert your parameters after the second 'JOB' on this line. If your enterprise does not require any additional information on the job statement, you must still leave this line intact. You can also add lines such as /*ROUTE or /*JOBPARM by using the JOB keyword.

You can enter more than one line for your JOB statement. Begin each line with the keyword JOB, followed by at least one blank, and type the text as you would expect to see it in the resulting JCL, including all punctuation such as start of line '/' and end of line commas.

If your enterprise needs a 'TIME=' parameter, you must specify a value large enough to run the SMP/E APPLY step. This can take up to 120 minutes for WebSphere MQ for z/OS.

Below is an example of a JOB statement with some additional information:

```
JOB //XXXXXXXX JOB (ACCOUNT),CLASS=A,MSGLEVEL=(1,1)
```

The following lines show a case where there is so much information added that a continuation statement has been created:

```
JOB //XXXXXXXX JOB (ACCOUNT),CLASS=A,MSGLEVEL=(1,1),  
JOB // USER=USERID,NOTIFY=USERID
```

6. You can change the default value of the prefix, 'CSQ8', next to the 'JCPREF' keyword. If you change it to a value that is one to four characters long, the prefix will be concatenated with the last four characters of the JCL member name to form the job name. If you change the prefix to a value that is five to eight characters long, the prefix alone will form the job name.
7. Type the values you have chosen for the WebSphere MQ product high-level qualifiers, where they are different from the defaults.

8. Type the values you have chosen for your system high-level qualifiers, where they are different from the defaults.
9. Type the values you have chosen for your volume serial numbers and unit types, where they are different from the defaults.

To let the system choose the volumes for the target and distribution libraries (TARVOL and DISVOL), change 'VOLSER' to a '.'. (Quotes should not be used in the JCL.) The SMP/E volume and unit type must be changed to an existing volume name and its actual unit type.

10. Type the SMP/E zone names you have chosen if they are different from the defaults. If you use your existing SMP/E data sets, you must customize the names of your target zone, distribution zone, and global CSI data set.

If you intend to let WebSphere MQ for z/OS create a new SMP/E environment, leave the SMP/E information as it is.

Specifying NEW for GZONECSI means that the customization step will add the name SHLQUAL.GLOBAL.CSI for the global zone CSI. If you wish to use a different global zone CSI, you must specify the fully qualified name for GZONECSI.

11. Type the HFS install path for the IBM WebSphere MQ for z/OS Java Support, if it is different from the default.
12. Run CSQ8SYSW. It should finish with a return code of 0.

If the return code is not 0, inspect the output to discover what caused the problem. CSQ8SYSW can be run again when the error has been corrected, but running it many times might cause the output data set THQ.TCSQINST to need compressing.
13. To continue the installation, return to 6.1.4.1, "SMP/E Global Zone" on page 41. You can use the customized versions of the "CSQ8xxxx" jobs from the "THQ.TCSQINST" data set to perform the steps, noted in 6.1.5, "Sample Jobs" on page 41.

Notes:

1. The customization process may cause some JCL and data to extend beyond column 71. This may result in truncation of data in some pages, especially if a user-selected value such as an HFS path or data set name is much longer than the default. All customized jobs should be inspected before they are run.
