Note: If the WebSphere Commerce instance was created after the installation of an interim fix, running the above commands against the WebSphere Commerce instance will not report such interim fixes. These fixes are not removed from the instance during the fix pack installation and do not need to be reinstalled on the instance.

Chapter 4. Installing the fix pack

Before applying the fix pack

Important:

- If you also use WebSphere Commerce Developer, ensure that WebSphere Commerce and WebSphere Commerce Developer are at the same fix pack level. WebSphere Commerce fix packs apply to both WebSphere Commerce Developer and WebSphere Commerce. For more information on installing the fix pack on WebSphere Commerce Developer, refer to the *WebSphere Commerce Developer version 5.6.0.7 fix pack installation guide*.
- If you are installing the fix pack to update the configuration files and database for an existing WebSphere Commerce instance, you cannot revert to previous configurations afterwards. Ensure that you back up your instance configuration files, and your database before applying this fix pack. The instance configuration files are located in the following location:
`WC_installdir/instances/instance_name/xml`
- If you have applied APAR IY76505, you must back up your scripts that use this functionality and restore them after applying the fix pack.
- If you have installed any APARs that are not listed in Chapter 2, “WebSphere Commerce updates,” on page 3, contact WebSphere Commerce support to ask whether the APARs are compatible with this fix pack. After applying the fix pack, you must reinstall the APARs.
- If you have modified your `WC_installdir/bin/setenv.sh` or `WC_installdir/bin/setenv.bat` file and wish to maintain your changes, you must backup the file. This file is replaced by the fix pack installation. After you have installed the fix pack, you must manually reapply your changes to the new `setenv` script.

Note: Do not overwrite the `setenv` script with your backup file.

- You must complete all steps that apply to your configuration to avoid problems such as performance or loader issues.

Multinode environments

If you have WebSphere Commerce components distributed in a multinode installation, the fix pack must be applied to each node that has a WebSphere Commerce component. For example, you have a custom 5-node installation that has a Web server node, a WebSphere Commerce Payments server node, a Configuration Manager client node, a WebSphere Commerce Server node, and a Database server node. Apply the fix pack to the Payments node, the Configuration Manager client node, and the WebSphere Commerce Server node. Do not apply the fix pack to the Web server node or the database node.”

If you are working in a clustered environment, you must apply the fix pack to each WebSphere Commerce Server node in the cluster. However, you do not need to run the `updatedb` script on a node if the following statements are true:

- The WebSphere Commerce instance’s database is remote.
- The WebSphere Commerce instance’s database is managed on another cluster member (node).

You must run the updatedb script on the node where the database is managed.

Installing the WebSphere Commerce fix pack on a vertical cluster

If you are installing the WebSphere Commerce fix pack on a vertical cluster, all nodes must be stopped before you start the database update. Ensure that the fix pack level for the database and the WebSphere Commerce application match at all times. To install on a cluster environment, you must designate a *reference node* that is updated first, then the WebSphere Commerce application that resides on the WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment node is updated. After the WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment node is updated the update is distributed to all other nodes automatically.

To install the WebSphere Commerce fix pack on the *reference node*, complete the following steps:

1. Complete the instructions in the Chapter 3, “Prerequisites” chapter.
2. Complete the Preparing your system for installation section.
3. Complete the steps in the appropriate section:
 - For a silent installation, complete the “Silent installation” on page 22 section.
 - For a graphical installation, complete the “GUI installation” on page 29 section.
4. Complete the Post installation steps section.
5. On the *reference node* you must collapse the WebSphere Commerce instance directory into a single EAR file. Use this EAR file to update the WebSphere Commerce application that resides on the WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment. For more information on updating the EAR file, refer to the WebSphere Application Server Network Deployment information center:

400 iSeries or System i5™ users will be required to download and apply the Windows fix pack to the WebSphere Commerce Configuration Manager client node. For the Windows fix pack installation on the Configuration Manager client node, you can choose to use either the silent installation method or the GUI installation method. This action is in addition to downloading and applying the OS/400 and i5/OS fix pack on the iSeries or System i5 system where WebSphere Commerce is installed.

Installing new components

If you install a new component from the base (5.6.0.0) CDs, you must reapply the fix pack to that component to bring it to the 5.6.0.7 level. For example, if the Configuration Manager client is loaded on a node using the base CDs the fix pack must be reapplied to the Configuration Manager client node.

Exporting instances

If you export an instance after applying the fix pack, you export it at the level at which you created the instance.

For example, if the instance is created at the 5.6.0.0 level then the fix pack is applied, the exported EAR file will be at the 5.6.0.0 level. In this case the fix pack must be applied to the exported EAR file to raise it to the appropriate fix pack level.

If the instance is created after the fix pack is applied, the exported EAR file will be at the 5.6.0.7 level.

Preparing your system for installation

1. Create a temporary directory to download the fix pack into. This temporary directory is denoted by *fp_installdir* in the remaining sections of this guide.
2. Download the fix pack from the WebSphere Commerce 5.6.0.7 fix pack Web site and save it to the *fp_installdir*:

The download is denoted by *WC_5607_file_name* in the remaining sections of this guide.

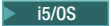

6.    Ensure that you are logged in as the root user.
  Ensure that you are logged in as a user that has QSECOFR authority.
 Ensure that you are logged in with a Windows user ID that is a member of the Administrator group.
7.  Open a new Command Prompt window for each section of the fix pack install process. For example, after completing the section "Updating WebSphere Commerce" close the Command Prompt window and open a new one in order to complete the section "Running the config_ant script". This will ensure that your PATH and CLASSPATH variables are reset.
8.    Before continuing for the installation, run the following script:

```
. WAS_installdir/bin/setupCmdLine.sh
```

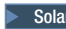

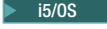

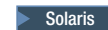

Creating 64-bit stored procedures on a remote DB2 database

Business Professional DB2 AIX Solaris

This section is optional. If you are using a remote DB2 64-bit database on AIX or Solaris you can now create 64-bit stored procedures. There are two scenarios where 64-bit stored procedures can be used:

- You have a remote DB2 64-bit database and have not yet created a WebSphere Commerce instance.
- You have a remote DB2 32-bit database and have an existing WebSphere Commerce instance.

If you have a remote DB2 64-bit database and have not yet created a WebSphere Commerce instance complete the following steps to use the 64-bit stored procedures.

1. On your WebSphere Commerce node, do the following:
 - a. Switch to the non-root user.
 - b. Copy all the files in the `WC_installdir/schema/db2/storedprocedure/64bit` directory to the `WC_installdir/schema/db2/storedprocedure` directory.
 - c. Solaris Ensure that the DB2 instance owner is part of the fenced user's primary group.
 - d. Create the WebSphere Commerce instance.
 - e. Check the stored procedure creation logs located in the `WC_installdir/instances/instance_name/logs` to see if the stored procedure creation was successful.

If you have a remote DB2 32-bit database and have an existing WebSphere Commerce instance complete the following steps to use the 64-bit stored procedures.

1. On your WebSphere Commerce node, stop the WebSphere Commerce instance.
2. On your database node, migrate the 32-bit instance to a 64-bit instance. Refer to your DB2 documentation for instructions.
3. On your WebSphere Commerce node, drop the current stored procedures.
 - a. Switch to the non-root user.

- b. Navigate to `WC_installdir/bin`.
- c. Run the following script:


```
./dropsp.db2.sh db_name db_user db_password
```

 Where `db_name` is your database name, `db_user` is the database user name and `db_password` is the database user name password.
4. On the database node, run the following command to set the permissions for stored procedure creation:


```
chmod -R 777 instance_home/sql1lib/function
```

 Where `instance_home` is the home directory of the instance owner. For example,


```
chmod -R 777 /home/db2inst1/sql1lib/function
```
5. On the WebSphere Commerce node, re-create 64-bit stored procedures.
 - a. Switch to the non-root user.
 - b. Copy all the files in the `WC_installdir/schema/db2/storedprocedure/64bit` directory to the `WC_installdir/schema/db2/storedprocedure` directory.
 - c. Navigate to `WC_installdir/bin`.
 - d. Run the following script:


```
./createsp.db2.sh db_name db_user db_password db_schema
```

 Where `db_name` is your database name, `db_user` is the database user name, `db_password` is the database user name password and `db_schema` is your database schema.
 - e. Check the stored procedure creation logs located in the `WC_installdir/instances/instance_name/logs` to see if the stored procedure creation was successful.
6. On the database node, run the following command to reset the correct permissions on the function directory:


```
chmod -R 777 instance_home/sql1lib/function
```

 Where `instance_home` is the home directory of the instance owner. For example,


```
chmod -R 777 /home/db2inst1/sql1lib/function
```

WebSphere Commerce on OS/400 and i5/OS with a remote staging server database



When running WebSphere Commerce on OS/400 or i5/OS with a remote staging server database, you must use the toolbox JDBC driver. Three parameters for the staging scripts `stagingcopy.sh`, `stagingprop.sh` and `stagingcheck.sh` have been expanded to support the toolbox JDBC provider. These parameters are `sourcedb`, `destdb` and `dbtype`. See the WebSphere Commerce Information Center for the new values for the parameters:

Chapter 5. Uninstalling the fix pack

Before you uninstall

Uninstalling the fix pack restores the product to the level it was at before the installation of the fix pack. These instructions also remove the fix pack code from those WebSphere Commerce or WebSphere Commerce Payments instances that were updated at the same time the fix pack was applied to your system.

WebSphere Commerce instances or WebSphere Commerce Payments instances that were created after the installation of the fix pack, will remain at the current fix pack level. Following these instructions will not restore these instances to the previous level. If these instances are required to be at the previous level, contact IBM Support for further assistance.

1.    Ensure that you are logged in as the root user.
  Ensure that you are logged in as a user that has QSECOFR authority.
 Ensure that you are logged in with a Windows user ID that is a member of the Administrator group.
2. Ensure that the following servers and processes are stopped:
 - WebSphere Commerce Application Servers. For example, *WC_instance_name*.
 - WebSphere Commerce Configuration Manager server.
 - Web server and its respective administration processes. For example, the IBM HTTP Server and the IBM HTTP Administration Server.

There are two ways to uninstall this fix pack, depending on your operating system.

Silent uninstallation

Chapter 6. Troubleshooting

Exceptions occur when using massload with an Oracle database





When running massload commands with an Oracle 9.2.0.1 database, you may experience errors similar to the following example:

```
Io exception: SO Exception was generated
Exception in thread "main" java.sql.SQLException: Io exception: SO Exception
was generated
    at oracle.jdbc.dbaccess.DBError.throwSQLException(DBError.java:134)
    at oracle.jdbc.dbaccess.DBError.throwSQLException(DBError.java:179)
    at oracle.jdbc.dbaccess.DBError.throwSQLException(DBError.java:333)
    at oracle.jdbc.driver.OracleConnection.<init>(OracleConnection.java:404)
    at oracle.jdbc.driver.OracleDriver.getConnectionInstance(OracleDriver
.java:468)
    at oracle.jdbc.driver.OracleDriver.connect(OracleDriver.java:314)
    at java.sql.DriverManager.getConnection(DriverManager.java:512)
    at java.sql.DriverManager.getConnection(DriverManager.java:171)
    at com.ibm.wca.dbconnect.DbConnectionImpl.connect(Unknown Source)
    at com.ibm.wca.MassLoader.MassLoad.loadDbConnection(Unknown Source)
    at com.ibm.wca.MassLoader.MassLoad.<init>(Unknown Source)
    at com.ibm.wca.MassLoader.MassLoad.main(Unknown Source)
```

There is a known problem with Oracle 9.2.0.1. If you experience these errors, obtain the appropriate Oracle maintenance through Oracle support.

Compiler synchronization needed when using largebranch

If you experience a `javac.err.branch.too.big` JavaServer Pages compilation problem complete the following section:

1.     Download and apply the following interim fix:

If you have WebSphere Application Server Version 5.0.2.6 or higher installed, you do not need to download the PQ86604 interim fix. However, you must follow the instructions to enable the largebranch option.

2. After the code fix for APAR PQ86604 is applied, complete the following steps to enable the largebranch option:
 - a. Start the WebSphere Application Server server1.
 - b. Launch the WebSphere Application Server administration console.
 - c. Enter your user ID.
 - d. Expand **Servers** and select **Application Servers**.
 - e. Select **WC_instance_name**.
 - f. Under **Additional Properties** select **Process Definition**.
 - g. Select **Java Virtual Machine**.
 - h. Select **Custom Properties**.
 - i. Click **New**.
 - j. Under **General Properties**, in the **Name** field enter:
`com.sun.tools.javac.main.largebranch`
 - k. Enter **true** in the **Value** field.

- l. Click **OK**.
- m. Click **Save**.
- n. When asked to save to master configuration, click **Save** again.
- o. Log out of the WebSphere Application Server administration console.

For instructions on how to stop and start a WebSphere Application Server, refer to the *IBM WebSphere Commerce Version 5.6 Installation Guide*.

Error running `acpload.cmd` - The input line is too long

▶ Windows

You may encounter an error claiming "The input line is too long" when executing the `acpload.cmd` post-installation step. The commands called in the `acpload.cmd` script are too long for the Windows command line because of large variables used. This is usually caused by a large `CLASSPATH` variable.

To resolve the problem, you must redefine the `CLASSPATH` variable in your command (DOS) environment to reduce its size. Ensure that you do not remove entries for your database software. In your command prompt, you can reset the `CLASSPATH` variable with the `set` command.

For example:

```
set CLASSPATH='...'
```

Where `'...'` represents the path entries you choose to use in your class path. After the `CLASSPATH` variable is redefined, run the `acpload.cmd` again as documented in "Post installation steps" on page 32.

Store pages do not display completely; parts of pages are missing

If you see one of the following error messages in the `SystemOut.log` file, follow the instructions for the corresponding solution.

WebSphere Commerce Payments instance creation fails to create an entry in the Digital Certificate Manager

400 i5/OS

During WebSphere Commerce Payments instance creation, the QIBM_HTTP_SERVER_pay_instance entry might not be created within Digital Certificate Manager. This problem is seen only when SSL is configured for the WebSphere Commerce Payments instance. To correct the problem, review this section.

- The cause of this problem may originate in the QBATCH subsystem. On the machine where you have installed WebSphere Commerce Payments, check the settings in the QBATCH subsystem:

1. Ensure that the QBATCH subsystem is running. Use the following command:
WRKACTJOB
2. The WebSphere Commerce Configuration Manager submits a job to the QBATCH subsystem in order to add an entry into Digital Certificate Manager. The job may be held or may not be able to run. Use the following OS/400 commands to increase the entries:

```
CHGSBSD QBATCH
```

This command allows you to alter the MAXJOBS parameter.

```
CHGJOBQE QBATCH
```

This command allows you to alter the MAXACT parameter.

Note: Increasing one or both of these entries should release the job that creates the entry in the Digital Certificate Manager.

- The cause of the problem may originate in the user profile settings. On the machine where you have installed WebSphere Commerce Payments, complete the following:
 1. Run the following command:
DSPUSRPRF <F4>
 2. In the User Profile field, enter the profile ID that starts the Configuration Manager server.

3. Record the value of the Job Description and Library fields and return to the command line.
4. Run the following command:
CHGJOB <F4>
5. Enter the values recorded in 3.
6. Press the F9 and F10 keys to display additional parameters.
7. Change the HOLD field to *NO.
8. Ensure that the user profile that starts the Configuration Manager logs off and then logs back onto the system.
9. If needed, restart the Configuration Manager server and create a new WebSphere Commerce Payments instance.

Troubleshooting for Linux

StackOverflowError when publishing a store on Linux

If you are using WebSphere Application Server version 5.1.1 on Linux for iSeries or Linux for pSeries and receive a StackOverflowError when publishing a store, complete the following steps:

1. Open the WebSphere Application Server Administration Console:
`http://hostname:9090/admin`
2. Expand **Servers > Application Servers > *server_name* > process definition > Java Virtual Machine > Generic JVM arguments**.
3. Add `-Xss5m` at the end of **Generic JVM arguments** field.

Problem installing the WebSphere Commerce fix pack 7 on WebSphere Commerce fix pack 2

If you are using WebSphere Commerce 5.6.0.2, with a WebSphere Application Server version greater than 5.1.1 on zLinux using SUSE Enterprise Linux Version 9, complete the following steps:

1. Back up your configuration.
2. Open the `WC_installdir/bin/updatedb.sh` file in a text editor.
3. Search for the following lines:

```
if [ "$PLATFORM" = "ws" ]; then
${JAVA_HOME?}/bin/java -Dcom.ibm.wca.logging.configFile=
$WCALOGGERCONFIGFILE
-Dcom.ibm.wcm.ErrorReporterDir=$WCLOGDIR -classpath
```

Edit the section to add `-Xss5m` to the command. For example:

```
if [ "$PLATFORM" = "ws" ]; then
${JAVA_HOME?}/bin/java -Xss5m -Dcom.ibm.wca.logging.configFile=
$WCALOGGERCONFIGFILE
-Dcom.ibm.wcm.ErrorReporterDir=$WCLOGDIR -classpath
```

Problem installing WebSphere Application Server Version 5.0.2 Cumulative Fix 3 on Red Hat Enterprise Linux AS or ES, Version 3.0 for Linux on Intel based systems
