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

Express Runtime Developer

- Express Runtime installs and uses Express Runtime Developer to allow end-customers to tie their application with the middleware components quickly and efficiently.



Express Runtime Developer: Overview of the wrapper

- Developing a solution with Express Runtime Developer involves the use of a [wrapper](#).
- A wrapper can be thought of as the “workflow” element responsible for controlling the flow of execution for deploying each component.
- For example, the wrapper can be used to:
 - Drive the installation of IBM Middleware components as well as the application of an end-customer
 - Execute DB2 scripts supplied by an end-customer to create tables required for application and populate the tables with data
 - Configure middleware components, such as WebSphere Application Server - Express, using Java Command Language (JACL) scripts supplied by an end-customer to access the newly created tables

A wrapper architecture

- A wrapper is a concept which is implemented with the following artifacts:
 - An XML file that defines the wrapper
 - One or more Java user programs: Express Runtime includes a set of support application programming interfaces (APIs) that your user program uses
 - Your application artifacts, such as an enterprise archive (EAR) file, GIF and HTML files, JACL scripts, and so on
 - Any additional Java archive (JAR) files used by your user programs, for example, jt400Native.jar for accessing IBM Eserver i5 or iSeries

Two types of wrappers

- Two types of wrappers are used in Express Runtime:
 - Application wrapper: Helps to integrate any application, such as an end-customer application or any middleware component, into a solution
 - Solution wrapper: Helps to seamlessly combine several applications into a complete solution
- Express Runtime comes with the pre-built wrappers for the IBM middleware and sample solutions. These wrappers, along with other required components, are installed as the sample projects in the Express Runtime Developer workspace.
- You use one solution wrapper for a given solution and one application wrapper for each application that solution contains.


Application wrapper

- An application wrapper must include an Extensible Markup Language (XML) file that is used to describe an application.
- One **application.axml** file is under the **src** folder in each application project in the Express Runtime Developer. The purpose of this XML file is to provide information specific to an application.




For example, for the IRU2_1DB2Express8_2Win application project, the application wrapper application.axml is placed under the src folder.

Letter "A" in the icon indicates an **Application** project




Solution wrapper

- A solution wrapper must include an XML file that is used to describe a solution.
- One **solution.sxml** file is under the **src** folder in each solution project in the Express Runtime Developer. The purpose of this XML file is to provide information specific to a solution.



Putting it all together

- For example, to deploy all middleware components along with an end-customer's application to a Windows system, your solution should contain:
 - Three pre-built applications, each with its wrapper: WebSphere Application Server-Express V6.0 on Windows, DB2 Universal Database (UDB) Express V8.2 on Windows and IBM HTTP Server 6.0 on Windows
 - An end-customer's application with its wrapper
- All of these applications are included in one solution. This solution is then used to deploy the middleware components and the end-customer's application to the Windows system.




Application wrapper

Sample application wrapper

- We demonstrate the components of an application wrapper using the sample application called [TradeWin](#).
- TradeWin is a Java 2 Platform, Enterprise Edition (J2EE) application for WebSphere Application Server - Express V6.0.



Components of an application wrapper

- This example shows the components of an application wrapper:
 - The application.axml file to describe the application
 - The user programs
 - Additional artifacts:
 - JACL script files for the application installation
 - DB2Script.bat and Table.ddl files to set up a database




Creating an application wrapper: Step 1

- Create the application project.
- Refer to the Cheat Sheet for a description of the steps.




Creating an application wrapper: Step 2

- Develop the user programs.
- There are four types of user programs:
 - Main
 - Predeployment Checker
 - Entry
 - Exit
- **Main** is a required program.
- In our sample application, we use only two user programs: Main and Predeployment Checker.




Creating an application wrapper: Step 3

- Develop or add to the application project any artifacts used by your application.
- For our TradeWin application, we add script files under the [Trade_ScriptDir](#) folder.
- If you need, include any external Jar files for your application.




Creating an application wrapper: Step 4

- Update the application.axml file.
- Edit it with the Application Wrapper Editor. It allows you to modify this file without knowing XML.




application.axml: General tab

- On this tab, you specify general information about your application, such as the name, supported languages, and supported platforms.




application.axml: Programs tab

- On this tab, you specify your user programs and their arguments.




application.axml: Variables tab

- On this tab, you define the variables for your application. The customer sets these variables when they deploy this application.




application.xml: Files tab

- On this tab, you specify all files for your application:
 - Class files of your user programs
 - Any additional artifacts, such as EAR file, script files, and so on




application.axml: Libraries tab

- Add any external JAR files on this tab.
- Our sample application doesn't need any.



Pre-built application wrappers

- You can find the following ready-to-use sample application wrappers in the Express Runtime Developer:
 - WebSphere Application Server - Express V6.0 on Windows, Linux, IBM POWER5 and IBM i5/OS
 - DB2 UDB Express Edition V8.2 and Console Management Extension on Windows, Linux and IBM POWER5 (DB2 is shipped with i5/OS, so there is no wrapper for deployment of DB2 to i5/OS.)
 - IBM HTTP Server 6.0 and WebSphere Plug-in on Windows, Linux, IBM POWER5 and i5/OS
 - Integrated Solution Console on Window, Linux and IBM POWER5




Solution wrapper

Sample solution wrapper

- We demonstrate the components of a solution wrapper using the sample solution called [TradeWinSolution](#).
- [TradeWinSolution](#) is a solution that includes:
 - WebSphere Application Server - Express V6.0 (Windows)
 - DB2 UDB Express V8.2 (Windows)
 - IBM HTTP Server V6.0 (Windows)
 - IBM WebSphere HTTP Plug-in
 - TradeWin application



Components of a solution wrapper

- This example shows the components of a solution wrapper:
 - The [solution.sxml](#) file describes the solution.
 - License information is available for supported languages.
 - The readme is available for supported languages.




Creating a solution wrapper: Step 1

- Create the solution project.
- Refer to the Cheat Sheet for a description of the steps.




Creating a solution wrapper: Step 2

- Open the solution.sxml file in Solution Wrapper Editor.




solution.sxml: General tab

- Specify general information about your solution on this tab, such as the name, version, supported languages, and so on.




solution.sxml: Tasks tab

- Add any application from the workspace that you want to include into this solution.
- Applications are grouped into the installation tasks. Each installation task can be deployed to a separate machine, supporting deployment of your solution to multiple systems.
- In our sample solution, we deploy:
 - WebSphere Application Server - Express, DB2 UDB Express, and TradeWin on one machine
 - IBM HTTP Server on another machine



solution.sxml: Validation tab

- On this tab, add any variable that you want to share between all applications in your solution. Also add any validation rules for each variable.
- For example, add a DB2 administrator's password as a shared variable. Then a customer enters it only once during the deployment, saving time on typing it in several places.



Summary

Developing an application wrapper

- **Developing a wrapper for an application is the main development activity in Express Runtime.**
- **Use the editors in Express Runtime Developer to modify the XML files.**
- **Application wrappers for all middleware components can be used as is.**

Developing a solution wrapper

- **Create a solution based on the application and supported platform for the middleware.**
- **Before you start development, have a good understanding of the deployment requirements for the solution:**
 - Single system versus multiple systems
 - All four platforms versus a few selected platforms
