## Chapter 3. Getting to know iSeries Navigator

iSeries Navigator is a powerful graphical interface for Windows clients. With iSeries Navigator, you can use your graphical interface skills to manage and administer your servers.



Here is an example of the iSeries Navigator main window:



From this example, you can see the iSeries Navigator hierarchical tree view



in the left pane of the window



. It provides a familiar user interface for those experienced in using graphical interfaces. It also decreases the need for users to learn the character-based interface. iSeries Navigator functionality includes system navigation, configuration, and planning capabilities. For step-by-step instructions on how to perform tasks in iSeries Navigator, see the iSeries Navigator online help.

### Requirements for installing iSeries Navigator

To install and use iSeries Navigator, your PC must be running one of the following Windows operating systems. The processor and memory requirements for each operating system are shown as well.



#### Microsoft Windows 98/Me/2000

Pentium 400 MHz minimum and at least 128 MB memory, 256 MB recommended

#### Microsoft Windows NT 4.0 with Microsoft Service Pack 5 or later

Pentium 400 MHz minimum and at least 128 MB memory, 256 MB recommended

#### **Microsoft Windows XP**

Pentium 400 MHz minimum and at least 256 MB memory



### **Installing iSeries Navigator**

All iSeries Navigator components are packaged with iSeries Access for Windows. Assuming that your PC meets the "Requirements for installing iSeries Navigator" on page 6, your first step is to install the iSeries Navigator components when you install iSeries Access for Windows on your PC. You can install iSeries Access for Windows with or without using iSeries NetServer.

To install iSeries Navigator, follow these steps:

#### 1. Install iSeries Access for Windows with or without iSeries NetServer.

The easiest way to install iSeries Access for Windows (and the iSeries Navigator components) on your PC is to use iSeries NetServer, iSeries NetServer is available with OS/400 Version 4 Release 2 and later releases.

#### With iSeries NetServer:

- a. Install iSeries NetServer on your PC.
- b. Follow the instructions in the Installing iSeries Access for Windows on Windows PCs with iSeries NetServer topic to complete the installation.

#### Without iSeries NetServer:

- a. On your PC, insert the iSeries Setup and Operations CD included with your order. You will not be able to install iSeries Navigator plug-ins, SSL, secondary languages, or add-ins with this install method.
- b. In order to install iSeries Navigator plug-ins and SSL, follow the instructions in the iSeries Access for Windows - Setup



to complete your iSeries Access for Windows installation.

#### 2. Follow the instructions in the iSeries Access for Windows setup wizard to install iSeries Navigator.

You need to have iSeries Access for Windows installed on the system from which you install iSeries Navigator. However, iSeries Access for Windows is not required on the systems that you connect to with iSeries Navigator. The only software requirement for these systems is the OS/400 host servers option (Option 12 when you install the OS/400 operating system).

#### For first time users:

- a. Select the **Custom** installation option during iSeries Access for Windows installation.
- b. Select iSeries Navigator in the Component Selection window of the wizard. This selects all of the individual iSeries Navigator components.
- c. Deselect any subcomponent that you do not want installed.

#### For upgrades:

a. If you are upgrading from a previous release of iSeries Navigator, choose the Selective Upgrade installation option to add additional components or to remove components that were previously installed.

#### 3. Installation tips:

- If you select the **Typical** installation option, only the following components will be installed:
  - iSeries Navigator base support
  - Basic operations (messages, printer output, printers, and jobs)
- To install additional components after you install iSeries Navigator, use iSeries Access **Selective Setup**.
- If you are having trouble reading the fonts on some windows, try using a screen resolution of 1024x768 or higher.

Once you have completed installing iSeries Navigator, you will need to add server connections. To add connections to iSeries Navigator:

- 1. Double-click the iSeries Navigator icon on your Windows desktop.
- 2. Click Yes to create a connection.
- 3. Follow the instructions in the Add Connection wizard.
- 4. To add another server connection, click File -> Connection to Servers -> Add Connection
