## **Removable media device**

Replacing and installing this feature are customer tasks. When you use these instructions, you will perform some or all of the following tasks:

- Perform prerequisite tasks.
- Power down the system unit.
- Remove the system unit or expansion unit covers.
- Remove hardware.
- Install new hardware.
- Install covers.
- IPL your operating system.
- Verify your new hardware configuration.

It takes approximately one hour to install the hardware. You may need to allow additional time to complete your jobs, to back up your system, IPL your system, and verify your hardware configuration.

You can choose to perform these tasks yourself or contact IBM(R) or an authorized service provider to make arrangements for them to perform the tasks for a fee. Should you encounter difficulties when performing a task, contact your authorized dealer or service provider.

## Before you begin

Before you begin a replacement or installation task, follow these steps:

- \_\_\_\_\_1. For an installation and if possible, for a replacement, ensure that you have a current backup of your system (including operating system, licensed programs, and data). If you have backed up the operating system and licensed programs since the last time you applied PTFs, that backup is acceptable.
- \_\_\_\_2. Ensure that you take a few minutes to become familiar with these instructions.
- \_\_\_\_3. Ensure that you have access to a medium flat-bladed screwdriver.
- \_\_\_\_4. If there are incorrect, missing, or visibly damaged parts, contact one of the following:

# Replace removable media devices

To replace a removable media device, perform these tasks:

- \_\_\_\_1. Perform prerequisite tasks as described in "Before you begin" on page 1.
- \_\_\_\_2. Open the front cover A (Figure 3 on page 7, 5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870, or 890; Figure 4 on page 8, 5079 or 5294).
- **\_\_\_\_3**. Use the latch that is shown **B** to remove the cover.




Figure 1. Opening the front cover door (5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870, 890)




Figure 2. Opening the front cover door (5079)

Your system can either be powered off (nonconcurrent) or powered on (concurrent) when you replace the removable media device. Unless the system is already powered off, replacing the removable media with the system powered on is recommended. Select the preferred procedure from the following:

## Replace removable media devices with system powered on

Be sure you understand the steps in this procedure before you begin. If you do not feel comfortable using the concurrent procedure, go to "Replace removable media devices with system powered off" on page 5.

**Attention:** Failure to follow these instructions could result in damage to the removable media device or to the system unit and could result in loss of data.

To perform the concurrent replacement procedure, follow these steps:

 If possible, use a wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge from damaging your hardware. If you do not have a wrist strap, touch a metal surface of the system or expansion unit before installing or replacing hardware.


If you received the 2209 Disposable Wrist Strap, follow these steps:

- $\_$  a. Attach the disposable wrist strap.  $\square$  View video.
- \_\_\_\_b. When you unroll the strap, remove the liner from the copper foil at the end.
- **\_\_\_\_ c.** Attach the adhesive part of the copper foil to an **exposed**, **unpainted** metal surface on the frame of the unit.
- **Note:** Follow the same precautions you would use without the wrist strap. The 2209 Disposable Wrist Strap is for static control. It will not increase or decrease your risk of receiving electric shock when using or working on electrical equipment.
- \_\_\_\_ 2. Locate the removable media device to be replaced.

  - \_\_\_\_ Record the number of the Device Position for the removable media device to be replaced here:\_\_\_\_\_\_.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **3**. If you have not done so already, sign on with **service tools authority**.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 4. On an iSeries command line, type: **strsst**. Press Enter.
- \_\_\_\_ 5. Type your service tools user ID and service tools password on the *System Service Tools (SST) Sign On* display. Press Enter.
- 6. When the *System Service Tools (SST)* display appears, select the **Start a** service tool option.
  Press the Enter key.
- \_\_\_\_ 7. When the *Start a Service Tool* menu appears, select the **Hardware service manager** option.

Press the Enter key.

- At the *Hardware Service Manager* display, select the **Device Concurrent** Maintenance option.
   Press the Enter key.
- \_\_\_\_ 9. At the Specify either Physical Location or Resource Name field, type:
  - a. The number that you recorded for the Frame ID.
  - b. The number that you recorded for the physical location.
- \_\_\_\_10. Select option 1 (Remove device) for the action to be performed.
- \_\_\_\_ 11. Set the time delay for one minute—01. Do not press Enter at this time.
  - **Note:** Watch the light on the right side of the removable media devices. When you press Enter, after a one minute delay, this light comes on and begins to blink rapidly. You then have nine seconds to remove the device into place.
- \_\_\_\_12. Press Enter on the console.

**13**. When the light starts blinking, pull both handles on both sides of the device toward you.



\_\_\_\_14. Slide the device out.

Note: Do not hold the device by the handles.


- \_\_\_\_ 15. The light will stop blinking and remain off when the device is removed.
- \_\_\_\_16. Return to the console and wait until the *Concurrent Maintenance Results* display appears.

Press F12.

\_\_\_\_17. Follow the steps in "Details: Install removable media devices with system powered on" on page 10 to install the new removable media device.

## Replace removable media devices with system powered off

- \_\_\_\_1. If you have installed logical partitions on your system unit, refer to the *iSeries Information Center*. Go to Manage logical partitions in the *iSeries Information Center* to find instructions on powering down a system with logical partitions.
- \_\_\_\_2. Locate the device you want to replace.
- \_\_\_\_ **3**. Pull both handles on both sides of the device toward you.



\_\_\_\_\_4. Slide the device out.

Note: Do not hold the device by the handles.

\_\_\_\_5. Follow the instructions in "Details: Install removable media devices with system powered off" on page 12 to install the new removable media device.

## Install removable media devices

This procedure gives you the steps you need to install removable media devices in your expansion unit. It will help you to decide between a concurrent removable media device installation and a power down removable media device installation. During a concurrent installation, you do not power down your expansion unit.

If you encounter difficulties during the installation, contact your authorized dealer or service provider.

- \_\_\_\_1. Is your system unit powered off?
  - **No**: Continue with the next step.
  - \_ Yes: Go to step 4 on page 15.




Figure 3. Opening the front cover door (5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870, 890)




Figure 4. Opening the front cover door (5079)

- 2. Open the front cover A (Figure 3 on page 7, 5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870, or 890; Figure 4 on page 8, 5079 or 5294).
- **\_\_\_\_3**. Use the latch that is shown **B** to remove the cover.

To perform the concurrent installation, follow these steps:

- \_\_\_\_\_1. If you have not done so already, sign on with service tools authority.
- \_\_\_\_ 2. On an iSeries command line, type: **strsst**. Press Enter.
- \_\_\_\_ 3. Type your service tools user ID and service tools password on the System Service Tools (SST) Sign On display. Press Enter.
- 4. When the *System Service Tools (SST)* display appears, select the **Start a** service tool option.

Press the Enter key.

\_\_\_\_ 5. When the *Start a Service Tool* menu appears, select the **Hardware service manager** option.

Press the Enter key.

\_\_\_\_\_6. When the *Hardware Service Manager* menu appears, select the **Packaging** hardware resources (system, frames, cards...) option.

Press the Enter key.

- \_\_\_\_ 7. On the *Packaging Hardware Resources* menu, locate the expansion unit in which you are installing the removable media device.
- **8**. Once you locate your expansion unit, look at the *Frame ID* field. (The Frame ID is also displayed on the front of each expansion unit.)
- \_\_\_\_ 9. Write the number that appears in the *Frame ID* field here:\_\_\_\_\_\_
- 10. Look at the label on the inside of the front cover of the expansion unit indicated in step 9. Find the position where you will be installing your removable media device.
- \_\_\_\_11. Write the number that appears in the *Phys* column for your device here:\_\_\_\_\_\_. This number is the Device Position.
- \_\_\_\_12. Return to the *Hardware Service Manager* menu by pressing F3 once.
- \_\_\_\_13. At the *Hardware Service Manager* display, select the **Device Concurrent** Maintenance option.

Press the Enter key.

- \_\_\_\_14. At the Specify either Physical Location or Resource Name field, type:
  - a. The number you determined in step 9 for Frame ID.
  - b. The physical location you determined in step 11 for Position.
- \_\_\_\_15. Pull out the removable media filler bezel from the location in which you are installing the new device.

\_\_\_\_\_16. If possible, use a wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge from damaging your hardware. If you do not have a wrist strap, touch a metal surface of the system or expansion unit before installing or replacing hardware.

If you received the 2209 Disposable Wrist Strap, follow these steps:

- $\_$  a. Attach the disposable wrist strap.  $\square$  View video.
- \_\_\_\_b. When you unroll the strap, remove the liner from the copper foil at the end.
- \_\_\_\_ c. Attach the adhesive part of the copper foil to an **exposed**, **unpainted** metal surface on the frame of the unit.

# Details: Install removable media devices with system powered on

To install the removable media device, follow these steps:

**Attention:** Failure to follow these instructions could result in damage to the removable media device or to the system unit and could result in loss of data.

\_\_\_\_ 1. Find the package that contains the new removable media device and remove it from the static-protective package.

Attention: Removable media devices are fragile. Handle with care.

- 2. Pull the handles out toward you before you install the removable media device into the system or expansion unit.
- \_\_\_\_ 3. Hold the device with the button in the upper right for tape units or lower right for CD-ROMs. Do not hold the removable media device by the handle.




Figure 5. Installing removable media device

- 4. Refer to Figure 5 on page 11 and support the bottom of the removable media device as you slide it half way into the selected position. Do not push it any further.
- \_\_\_\_ 5. At the *Specify action as* field, select option **Install device**.
- 6. At the *Enter a time value between 00 and 19* field, type **01** for one minute. Do not press Enter at this time.
  - **Note:** Watch the light on the right side of the removable media devices. When you press Enter, after a one-minute delay, this light comes on and begins to blink rapidly. You then have nine seconds to slide the removable media device into place.
- \_\_\_\_ 7. Press the Enter key.
- **8**. When the light starts blinking, slide the removable media device in until it seats properly. Push both handles in at the same time to lock the removable media device into place.

- \_\_\_\_ 9. The green light will stop blinking and remain on solid when you properly installed the removable media device.
- \_\_\_\_10. Return to the console and wait until the *Concurrent Maintenance Results* display appears.

Press the Enter key.

\_\_\_\_ 11. When the Hardware Service Manager menu appears, select the Packaging hardware resources (system, frames, cards...) option.

Press the Enter key.

- 12. On the *Packaging Hardware Resources* menu, enter a **9** in the *Opt* column next to the expansion unit with the new removable media device. Press the Enter key.
- **13.** The *Description* and *Device Type-Model* will be displayed along with the position where your new removable media device was installed.
- \_\_\_\_14. Press F3 once to return to the *Hardware Service Manager* display.
- **\_\_\_\_\_15.** At the *Hardware Service Manager* display, press **F6** to print the configuration list if you have a printer. You or a service representative may refer to the configuration list in the future.
- \_\_\_\_16. Install the front cover for the system or expansion unit.
- \_\_\_\_ 17. Press F12 twice and press the Enter key to return to the Main menu.
- \_\_\_\_ **18**. Your feature installation is complete.

### Install removable media devices with system powered off

To install the removable media device, follow these steps:

\_\_\_\_1. If you have installed logical partitions on your system unit, refer to the *iSeries Information Center*. Go to Manage logical partitions in the *iSeries Information Center* to find instructions on powering down a system with logical partitions.

- \_\_\_\_2. "Power down the system or expansion unit" on page 14.
- 3. Open the front cover A (Figure 3 on page 7, 5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870, 890; Figure 4 on page 8, 5079 or 5294).
- \_\_\_\_\_4. If needed, use the latch that is shown at B to remove the front cover (Figure 3 on page 7, 5074, 5094, 5095, 8093, 830, 840, 870. 890; Figure 4 on page 8, 5079 or 5294).
- \_\_\_\_5. If possible, use a wrist strap to prevent electrostatic discharge from damaging your hardware. If you do not have a wrist strap, touch a metal surface of the system or expansion unit before installing or replacing hardware.

If you received the 2209 Disposable Wrist Strap, follow these steps:

- \_\_\_\_a. Attach the disposable wrist strap.  $\square$  View video.
- \_\_\_\_b. When you unroll the strap, remove the liner from the copper foil at the end.

# Details: Install removable media devices with system powered off

To install the removable media device, follow these steps:

- 1. Find the package that contains the new device and remove it from the static-protective package.
  - Attention: Removable media devices are fragile. Handle with care.
- 2. Hold the device upright and pull both handles on both sides of the device toward you.
- 3. Hold the device with the button in the upper right for tape units or lower right for CD-ROMs. Do not hold the device by the handles.




Figure 6. Installing removable media device

- \_\_\_\_\_ 4. Refer to Figure 6 on page 13 and align the device with the position where you removed the filler bezel.
- \_\_\_\_ 5. Slide it into the unit until it **stops**.
- \_\_\_\_ 6. Push both handles in at the same time to lock the removable media device into place.

- \_\_\_\_ 7. Do you have any other devices to install?
  - \_\_\_\_ **No**: Continue with the next step.
  - \_ Yes: If you have another device such as a tape unit or a CD-ROM drive, refer to the instructions that came with that device.
- **8**. Install the front cover.

### DANGER

- \_\_\_\_12. Does 01 B V=S with Normal indicator (OK) illuminated appear in the Function/Data display?
  - \_\_\_\_ Yes: Continue with the next step.
  - \_\_\_\_ **No**: Do the following:
    - \_\_\_\_a. Press the Mode Select button until the Manual indicator (a small hand) is illuminated.
    - \_\_\_\_b. Press the Increment/Decrement push button until **02** appears in the Function/Data display.
    - \_\_\_\_ c. Press the Enter push button on the control panel.
    - \_\_\_\_\_d. Press the Increment/Decrement push button until **B** appears in the Function/Data display.

- \_\_\_\_e. Press the Enter push button on the control panel.
- \_\_\_\_f. Press the Increment/Decrement push button until **S** appears in the Function/Data display
- \_\_\_\_ g. Press the Enter push button on the control panel.
- \_\_\_\_h. Press the Mode Select button until the Normal indicator (**OK**) illuminated.
- \_\_\_\_\_i. Press the Increment/Decrement push button until **01** appears in the Function/Data display.
- \_\_\_\_\_j. Press the Enter push button on the control panel.
  **01 B S** with Normal indicator (**OK**) illuminated should appear in the Function/Data display. If it does not appear, repeat steps 12a on page 13 through 12j.
- \_\_\_\_13. Power on the workstation or PC that is the console for your system.
- \_\_\_\_\_14. Press the power button to power on your system unit.
- \_\_\_\_15. Sign on the system unit. Ensure that you have service tools authority.
- \_\_\_\_16. Do the following to verify your removable media device configuration:
  - \_\_\_\_a. On a command line, type: **strsst**. Press the Enter key.
  - \_\_\_\_b. Type your service tools user ID and service tools password on the System Service Tools (SST) Sign On display.
  - \_\_\_\_ C. When the *System Service Tools (SST)* display appears, select the **Start** a service tool option.
    - Press the Enter key.
  - \_\_\_\_\_d. When the *Start a Service Tool* display appears, select the **Hardware service manager** option.

Press the Enter key.

- \_\_e. When the *Hardware Service Manager* display appears, select the **Packaging hardware resources (system, frames, cards...**) option. Press the Enter key.
- \_\_\_\_\_f. On the *Packaging Hardware Resources* display, enter a **9** in the *Opt* column next to the expansion unit with the new removable media device. Use the frame ID that is displayed on the front of your expansion unit.
- \_\_\_\_g. The *Description* and *Device Type-Model* will be displayed along with the position where your new removable media device was installed.
- \_\_\_\_h. Press F3 once to return to the *Hardware Service Manager* display.
- \_\_\_\_\_i. At the *Hardware Service Manager* display, press **F6** to print the configuration list if you have a printer. You or a service representative may refer to the configuration list in the future.
- \_\_\_\_j. Press F12 twice and press the Enter key to return to the Main Menu.
- \_\_\_\_k. Your feature install is complete.

## Power down the system or expansion unit

To power down the system unit and any attached expansion units, follow these steps:

- If an Integrated xSeries Adapter (IXA) is present on the system, shut it down using OS/400 options.
- **\_\_\_ 2**. Ensure that all jobs are complete.
- **\_\_\_\_3.** Type **pwrdwnsys \*immed** when all jobs are complete. Press Enter.

- \_\_\_\_4. When the iSeries power down is complete, unplug any power cords, such as printers and displays, from electrical outlets.
- \_\_\_\_5. Unplug the system unit power cord from the electrical outlet.
- \_\_\_\_6. Unplug the power cord for the system or expansion unit from the electrical outlet.


