This version does not run on all reduced instruction set computer (RISC) models nor does it run on CISC models.

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Upgrade twinaxial console to Operations Console

These instructions contain steps on how to upgrade your twinaxial console to an Operations Console.

If you are going to connect a remote control panel cable, ensure that you have the cable available before you begin this upgrade.

Install the Operations Console prerequisites on the personal computer (PC). See the Operations Console topic in the *Information Center* for prerequisites.

If you are installing LAN connectivity, go to the Operations Console topic in the *Information Center*.

You are changing the console device, the iSeries system value **QAUTOCFG** must be set to **ON**. Use the following to verify or set this system value *on* the iSeries:

- __ 1. Enter WRKSYSVAL QAUTOCFG on an OS/400[®] command line and press Enter.
- ___ 2. Select **Change option** from the *Work with System Values* display and press Enter.
- __ 3. Type 1 (ON) from the *Change System Values* display and press Enter.
- ___ 4. The **Work with System Values** display appears. Press F3 once to return to the *Main Menu*.

Before you begin

Before you begin a replacement or installation task, follow these steps:

- ___ 1. For an installation and if possible, for a replacement, ensure that you have a current backup of your system (including operating system, licensed programs, and data). If you have backed up the operating system and licensed programs since the last time you applied PTFs, that backup is acceptable.
- __ 2. Ensure that you take a few minutes to become familiar with these instructions.
- ___ 3. Ensure that you have access to a medium flat-bladed screwdriver.
- __ 4. If there are incorrect, missing, or visibly damaged parts, contact one of the following:
 - Your authorized service provider
 - In the United States: IBM[®] Rochester Manufacturing Automated Information Line (R–MAIL) at 1–800–300–8751

- __ 5. If you are installing new hardware in logical partitions, you need to plan and understand the requirements to be successful. Go to Logical partitions in the *Information Center*. Then return to these instructions.
- __ 6. If you encounter difficulties during the procedure, contact your authorized service provider or your authorized dealer.

___ 7. Determine if there are any existing PTF prerequisites before you install your new feature. Go to the following Web site:

17.	Plug in and power on all attached devices, such as printers and displays when Operations Console is operating.

System-unit control panel

Go to the front of your iSeries system unit. Open the control panel door.




Figure 1. Control panel without Electronic Keystick




Figure 2. Control panel with Electronic Keystick

Your control panel looks like either Figure 1 or Figure 2 on page 8. Refer to the control panel for your unit.

If your control panel looks like Figure 2 on page 8, before you can use F Increment/Decrement buttons and G Enter push button, you need to press H Mode Selects to select Manual mode N. To use Mode Select, the keystick needs to be inserted.






