Chapter 1. Introduction

This *Installation and User's Guide* contains instructions for installing the following host bus adapters in an IBM[®] System x[™] server:

- Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port HBA for IBM System x
- Emulex 8 Gb FC Dual-Port HBA for IBM System x

The Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port and Dual-Port host bus adapters for IBM System x are referred to throughout this document as *host bus adapter*.

This document contains information about:

- · Installing and configuring the host bus adapter
- · Updating the firmware and device drivers of the host bus adapter
- Performing custom configuration of the host bus adapter through the Emulex HBAnyware utility
- · Performing basic troubleshooting of the host bus adapter

Each host bus adapter is an 8 Gb Fibre Channel device that has either one or two configurable adapter ports. Communication signals are routed from the server through the Fibre Channel high-speed connector on the host bus adapter.

If firmware and documentation updates are available, you can download them from the IBM Web site. The host bus adapter might have features that are not described in the documentation that comes with the host bus adapter, and the documentation might be updated occasionally to include information about those features, or technical updates might be available to provide additional information that is not included in the host bus adapter documentation. To check for updates, complete the following steps.

Note: Changes are made periodically to the IBM Web site. Procedures for locating firmware and documentation might vary slightly from what is described in this document.

- 1. Go to http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/.
- 2. From the left navigation pane, click **Product A Z**.
- 3. Scroll to Fibre Channel Host Bus Adapter and click the link.

Fibre Channel defined

Fibre Channel technology is outlined in the SCSI-3 Fibre Channel Protocol (SCSI-FCP) standard. Fibre Channel is a high-speed data transport technology that is used for mass storage and networking.

Using a Fibre Channel Arbitrated loop (FC-AL), 126 Fibre Channel devices can be supported, compared to 15 small computer system interface (SCSI) devices with Ultra SCSI.

The host bus adapter uses a multimode shortwave optical interface for distances up to 300 meters when operating at 2 Gbps, 150 meters when operating at 4 Gbps, and 50 meters when operating at 8 Gbps.

The host bus adapter is an 8 Gbps Fibre Channel device that supports data transfer rates up to 800 MB per second half-duplex and 1600 MB per second full-duplex on optical interfaces.

This *Installation and User's Guide* contains setup, installation, configuration, and troubleshooting instructions for the host bus adapter. This document also provides general information about the host bus adapter, including warranty information, and how to get help.





Host bus adapter components

The major components of the single-port host bus adapter are shown in the following illustration.

Host bus adapter LEDs

Each Fibre Channel port has a set of amber and green light emitting diodes (LEDs). The amber LED indicates port activity, and the green LED indicates a firmware operation.

The following table describes the states of the amber and green LEDs and the host bus adapter activities that they indicate.

Chapter 2. Installing the host bus adapter

This chapter provides information about installing the host bus adapter in a server.

Installation guidelines

Before you install the host bus adapter in the server, read the following information:

- Read the safety information that begins on pageiii and the guidelines in "Handling static-sensitive devices." This information will help you work safely.
- When you install the new host bus adapter, take the opportunity to download and apply the most recent firmware updates. This step will help to ensure that any known issues are addressed and that host bus adapter is ready to function at maximum levels of performance. Make sure that you are using the latest versions of device drivers, firmware code, and basic input/output system (BIOS) code for the server and the host bus adapter. To download the most recent device drivers and firmware updates, go to http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/. Follow the instructions that are included with the download procedure.
- Observe good housekeeping in the area where you are working. Place removed covers and other parts in a safe place.
- Do not attempt to lift an object that you think is too heavy for you. If you have to lift a heavy object, observe the following precautions:
 - Make sure that you can stand safely without slipping.
 - Distribute the weight of the object equally between your feet.
 - Use a slow lifting force. Never move suddenly or twist when you lift a heavy object.
 - To avoid straining the muscles in your back, lift by standing or by pushing up with your leg muscles.
- Have a small flat-blade screwdriver available.
- When you are finished working on the server, reinstall all safety shields, guards, labels, and ground wires.

Handling static-sensitive devices

Attention: Static electricity can damage the server and other electronic devices. To avoid damage, keep static-sensitive devices in their static-protective packages until you are ready to install them.

To reduce the possibility of damage from electrostatic discharge, observe the following precautions:

- Limit your movement. Movement can cause static electricity to build up around you.
- The use of a grounding system is recommended. For example, wear an electrostatic-discharge wrist strap, if one is available. Always use an electrostatic-discharge wrist strap or other grounding system when you work inside the server with the power on.
- Handle the device carefully, holding it by its edges or its frame.
- · Do not touch solder joints, pins, or exposed circuitry.
- Do not leave the device where others can handle and damage it.

- While the device is still in its static-protective package, touch it to an unpainted metal surface on the outside of the server for at least 2 seconds. This drains static electricity from the package and from your body.
- Remove the device from its package and install it directly into the server without setting down the device. If it is necessary to set down the device, put it back into its static-protective package. Do not place the device on the server cover or on a metal surface.
- Take additional care when you handle devices during cold weather. Heating reduces indoor humidity and increases static electricity.

Working with SFP modules and fiber optic cables

A small-form-factor pluggable (SFP) module converts electrical signals to optical signals that are required for Fibre Channel transmission to and from RAID controllers. The 8 Gb FC single-port HBA comes with one SFP module and the dual-port 8 Gb FC HBA comes with two SFP modules. One end of a fiber optic cable is inserted into the SFP module and the other end of the fiber optic cable is connected to a Fibre Channel device. SFP modules are laser products.

Handling fiber optic cables

Attention: To avoid damage to a fiber optic cable, follow these guidelines:

- Do not route the cable along a folding cable-management arm.
- When you attach the cable to a device on slide rails, leave enough slack in the cable so that it does not bend to a radius of less than 38 mm (1.5 in.) when the device is extended or become pinched when the device is retracted.
- Route the cable away from places where it can be snagged by other devices in the rack.
- Do not use plastic cable ties in place of the provided cable straps.
- Do not overtighten the cable straps or bend the cable to a radius of less than 38 mm (1.5 in.).
- Do not put excess weight on the cable at the connection point. Make sure that the cable is well supported.
- Use the following suggested maximum cable lengths:
 - 2 Gbps: 300 meters 50/125 μm fiber, 150 meters 62.5/125 μm fiber
 - 4 Gbps: 150 meters 50/125 μm fiber, 70 meters 62.5/125 μm fiber
 - 8 Gbps: 50 meters 50/125 μm fiber 21 meters 62.5/125 μm fiber

Handling SFP modules

Before installing or removing SFP modules and fiber optic cables, read the following information:

- The SFP module housing has an integral guide key that is designed to prevent you from inserting the SFP module incorrectly.
- Use minimal pressure when inserting an SFP module into a Fibre Channel port. Forcing the SFP module into a port could cause damage to the SFP module or to the port.
- You can insert or remove the SFP module while the port is powered-on.
- You must insert the SFP module into a port before you connect the fiber optic cable.
- You must remove the fiber optic cable from the SFP module before you remove the SFP module from the port.




Before you install the host bus adapter, make sure that the preinstalled expansion slot bracket is the correct size for the server in which you are installing the host bus adapter.

Note: The expansion-slot opening is measured along the longest dimension and might be oriented horizontally in some servers.

The host bus adapter comes with a preinstalled expansion-slot bracket that is approximately 11 cm (4.3 in.) long. If the opening for the PCIe expansion slot is approximately 10 cm (4.0 in.) long, you will use the preinstalled bracket.



The option package also contains a low-profile expansion-slot bracket that is approximately 7 cm (2.9 in.) long. If the opening for the PCIe expansion slot is approximately 6 cm (2.3 in.) long, you must replace the preinstalled bracket with the low-profile bracket. You will do this in step 6 on page 14 in the following procedure.




To install the host bus adapter in the server, complete the following steps:

- 1. Read the safety information that begins on page iii, and "Handling static-sensitive devices" on page 9.
- 2. Check the server system board and make any necessary configuration changes to accommodate the host bus adapter.


Note: The host bus adapter is self-configuring. If your server requires manual configuration to enable the host bus adapter, bus-master slot, and interrupt request (IRQ) level, use the Configuration/Setup Utility program that is part of the server basic input/output system (BIOS). For more information about the Configuration/Setup Utility program, see the *User's Guide* that comes with the server.

3. Turn off the server and peripheral devices and disconnect the power cords.


- 4. Remove the server cover. For more information, see the *Installation Guide* that comes with the server.
- 5. Touch the static-protective package that contains the host bus adapter to any unpainted surface on the outside of the server; then, grasp the host bus adapter by the top edge or upper corners and remove it from the package and inspect it for damage. Contact your IBM marketing representative or authorized reseller if the host bus adapter appears to be damaged.
- 6. If you have to remove the preinstalled expansion-slot bracket and replace it with the low-profile bracket, complete the following steps; otherwise, go to step 7 on page 15.
 - a. Remove each SFP module. A dual-port HBA has two SFP modules.
 - 1) Unlock the SFP module latch by pulling the wire tab outward 90°.
 - 2) With the SFP module wire tab in the unlocked position, grasp the wire tab and pull the SFP module out of the port.



- 3) Replace the protective cap on the SFP module.
- 4) Place the SFP module in a static-protective package.
- b. Orient the host bus adapter as shown in the following illustration.



- c. Remove the two screws that hold the bracket onto the host bus adapter.
- d. Lift the bracket from the host bus adapter and store the bracket in a safe place for possible reuse.
- e. Align the low-profile bracket so that the tabs are on the back side of the host bus adapter and the holes on the tabs align with the holes on the host bus adapter. Make sure that you do not slide the bracket past the ends of the grounding "finger" tabs on the SFP module cage.
- f. From the front side of the host bus adapter, attach the bracket to the host bus adapter using the two screws that you removed in step 6c.
- g. Reinstall each SFP module:
 - 1) Remove the SFP module from its static-protective package.
 - 2) Remove the protective cap from the SFP module.
 - 3) Open the wire tab and insert the SFP module into the HBA port until it clicks into place.



- 4) Replace the protective cap on the SFP module.
- 7. Determine which PCIe slot you will use. Depending on the server model, you might have to remove the expansion-slot cover or release the bracket lever for the selected PCIe slot. To remove the expansion-slot cover, you might have to remove the expansion-slot screw. Place the removed parts in a safe place. For detailed instructions for installing the host bus adapter in your server, see the User's Guide that comes with the server.
- 8. Position the host bus adapter by aligning the PCIe connector with the PCIe slot on the system board. Insert the host bus adapter firmly into the connector.

Note: Depending on the server model, you might have to install the host bus adapter in a riser card and then install the riser card with the host bus adapter in the PCIe slot on the system board.

 Secure the host bus adapter to the server chassis. Replace the expansion-slot screw if you removed it in step 7, or return the bracket lever to the closed position. Statement 3:



CAUTION:

When laser products (such as CD-ROMs, DVD drives, fiber optic devices, or transmitters) are installed, note the following:

- 10. Remove the protective caps from the ends of an LC-LC fiber optic cable and from each SFP module on the host bus adapter (see "Handling fiber optic cables" on page 11).
- 11. Connect one end of the LC-LC fiber optic cable to the SFP module on the host bus adapter. Connect the other end to a Fibre Channel device.
- 12. Replace the server cover.
- 13. Reconnect the power cords.
- 14. Turn on all external Fibre Channel devices; then, turn on the server. To be sure that the host bus adapter is functioning correctly, check the amber and green LEDs on the front bracket of the host bus adapter. For more information, see "Host bus adapter LEDs" on page 7.

Chapter 3. Updating the boot code and firmware and installing device drivers

After you install the host bus adapter, make sure that the latest boot code and firmware are installed; then, install the device drivers.

The device drivers, utilities, documentation, and installation instructions for the following supported operating systems are on the *Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port and Dual-Port HBAs Support* CD. You can obtain the latest information from http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/.

- Microsoft Windows Server 2003, Advanced Server, or Enterprise Edition or Microsoft Windows Server 2008
- Red Hat Enterprise Linux Advanced Server version 4, or Red Hat Enterprise Linux Enterprise Server version 4
- Red Hat Enterprise Linux Advanced Server version 5, or Red Hat Enterprise Linux Enterprise Server version 5
- SUSE Linux Enterprise Server version 9 or SUSE Linux Enterprise Server version 10

After you install the device drivers, you can customize the configuration of the host bus adapter by using the Emulex HBAnyware utility in one of the following ways:

- Use the Emulex HBAnyware utility to manage either the local Fibre Channel host bus adapter or any remote Emulex Fibre Channel host bus adapter on the storage area network (SAN) that is discovered by the Emulex HBAnyware utility. For more information about using the Emulex HBAnyware utility to update firmware and boot code and to perform other configuration functions, see Chapter 5, "Using the Emulex HBAnyware utility," on page 23.
- You can also use the Emulex HBAnyware utility through a network connection to a workstation or by starting the Emulex HBAnyware utility for IBM Director. For more information, see Chapter 5, "Using the Emulex HBAnyware utility," on page 23.

Chapter 4. Configuring BootBIOS

This chapter provides information about the Emulex BIOS utility and the BootBIOS function that you can use to configure the host bus adapter.

Important: If the configuration settings are incorrect, the host bus adapter might not function correctly.

Before you customize the configuration of the host bus adapter, consider the following guidelines:

- · Make sure that the host bus adapter is installed in the server correctly.
- Make sure that the server and all other server components are configured correctly.
- Make sure that the SAN components that support Fibre Channel operation are configured correctly.

Note: For more detailed information about the Emulex BIOS utility and the BootBIOS feature, see the *Emulex Boot Code User Manual* on the *Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port and Dual-Port HBAs Support* CD, or you can download the PDF file from http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/.

Using the BIOS utility

You can use the BIOS utility to change host bus adapter parameters (for example, topology, PLOGI retry timer, and auto-scan setting) and configure startup (boot) devices.

The following requirements apply when you are using the BIOS utility:

- The host bus adapter settings and default values will vary, according to the version of BIOS code that is installed for the host bus adapter.
- Default settings are acceptable for most installations.
- In the BIOS utility:
 - Press d to reset the selected host bus adapter to its default values.
 - Press Esc to return to the previous menu.
 - Press X to exit from the menu.
- The default topology is auto topology with loop first. For a Fibre Channel arbitrated loop (FC-AL), each host bus adapter has a default arbitrated loop physical address (AL_PA) of 01 (hexadecimal). If necessary, change this topology setting before you configure boot devices.
- All host bus adapters or boot drives can be configured to other AL_PAs instead of their default values.
- If the server has more than one host bus adapter with the same PCI bus number and each has a boot drive attached, the first PCI-scanned host bus adapter is the boot host bus adapter. The first host bus adapter is usually in the lowest-numbered PCI slot in the server. You can view this information through the server Configuration/Setup Utility.

Starting the BIOS utility

Before you can run the BIOS utility, BootBIOS must be installed and the boot up message must be enabled on at least one installed host bus adapter in the server.

To start the BIOS utility to configure your host bus adapters, complete the following steps:

- 1. Turn on the server.
- Press Alt+E immediately (within 5 seconds) when the BootBIOS prompt is displayed for starting the BIOS utility. The BIOS utility menu is displayed. This menu contains a list of host bus adapters.
- 3. Select the number of the host bus adapter that you want. The main configuration menu is displayed.
- 4. Press 2 to configure the host bus adapter. The adapter configuration menu is displayed.
- 5. Select 1 to configure boot devices for remote boot functions or select 2 to configure the host bus adapter parameters.

If you select to configure the host bus adapter parameters, the adapter configuration menu is displayed. After you change the settings, the BIOS utility restarts the server to enable the new parameters.

Important: If the BootBIOS prompt is not displayed, you must enable this prompt. For more information, see the x86 BootBIOS installation section of the *Emulex Boot Code User Manual* on the *Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port and Dual-Port HBAs Support* CD or download the PDF file from http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/.

Enabling BootBIOS on the host bus adapter through the BIOS utility

Before you can use the BootBIOS features, BootBIOS must be enabled on at least one installed host bus adapter in the server.

To enable BootBIOS on an installed host bus adapter, complete the following steps:

- 1. Turn on the server.
- Press Alt+E immediately (within 5 seconds) when the BootBIOS prompt is displayed for starting the BIOS utility. The BIOS utility menu is displayed. This menu contains a list of host bus adapters.
- 3. Select the applicable host bus adapter by entering the corresponding number. The main configuration menu is displayed.
- 4. Press **2** to configure the host bus adapter. The adapter configuration menu is displayed.
- 5. Press **1** to enable or disable BootBIOS. If BootBIOS is not already enabled, you must enable it so that you can use the BootBIOS features.

Important: If the BootBIOS prompt is not displayed, you must enable this prompt. For additional information, see the x86 BootBIOS installation section of the *Emulex Boot Code User Manual* on the *Emulex 8 Gb FC Single-Port and Dual-Port HBAs Support* CD or you can download the PDF file from http://www.ibm.com/systems/ storage/.

The adapter configuration menu choices

This section describes the choices on the adapter configuration menu. You can use this menu to view the parameters for the host bus adapter. You can change a modifiable value if the server supports the corresponding feature.

- Enable or Disable BIOS: Enable or disable BootBIOS on the selected host bus adapter. Before you can use the BootBIOS features, BootBIOS must be enabled on at least one installed host bus adapter in the server. For additional information, see "Enabling BootBIOS on the host bus adapter through the BIOS utility" on page 20.
- Change default ALPA of this adapter: This choice applies only to a Fibre Channel arbitrated loop (FC-AL). The factory default value for each host bus adapter is an arbitrated loop physical address (AL_PA) of **01** (hexadecimal).
- Change PLOGI Retry Timer (+Advanced Option+): Sets the interval for the port login (PLOGI) retry timer. The factory default value is NoPLOGI Retry: 0 msec.
- **Topology Selection (+Advanced Option+):** If it is necessary to change the topology, do so before you configure the boot devices.
- Enable or Disable Spinup Delay (+Advanced Option+): Enable or disable the spin-up delay. The factory default value is Disabled.
- Auto Scan Setting (+Advanced Option+): Enable the first device in the boot entry list to issue a Name Server Inquiry. The factory default value is **Disabled**.
- Enable, Disable EDD 3.0 (+Advanced Option+): Enable or disables the Enhanced Disk Drive (EDD) option that is available on Intel[®] Itanium[®] (IA-64) servers only. Enabling EDD 3.0 displays the path to the boot device. The factory default value is **Disabled**.
- Enable or Disable Start Unit Command (+Advanced Option+): Use this command to issue the small computer system interface (SCSI) start unit command for various devices, such as tape backup units that are attached to the SAN. You must know the specific LUN of the applicable device to issue the SCSI start unit command. The factory default value is **Disabled**.
- Enable or Disable Environment Variable (+Advanced Option+): Enable or disable the ability to set the boot controller order, if the server supports the environment variable. The factory default value is **Disabled**.
- **Auto Boot Sector:** This option automatically defines the boot sector (32-sector or 63-sector) of the target disk. The factory default value is **Enabled**.
- Link Speed Selection: Define the link speed of the port as Auto, 1 Gb, 2 Gb, or 8 Gb. The factory default value is **Auto**.

To reset a host bus adapter parameter to its default value, complete the following steps:

- 1. Select the applicable host bus adapter.
- 2. Select the applicable option on the configuration menu.
- 3. Press d.

Installation and system requirements

Make sure that you are using the latest version of the HBAnyware utility for the host bus adapter. See http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/ for the latest information about the HBAnyware utility. The latest instructions and system requirements are in the documentation that comes with the HBAnyware utility.

Features

You can use the HBAnyware utility to perform the following tasks:

- · Depending on the device driver, set the HBAnyware utility options
- Connect to hosts
- Discover and manage host bus adapters on the SAN through Fibre Channel and IP discovery
- Use diagnostics features:
 - PCI, internal, and external loopback tests
 - User-initiated POST (adapter health check)
 - End-to-end tests (based on the Echo command)
 - Ping and trace route
 - Beaconing support
 - Firmware or device-driver dump
- Use host-to-host SAN configuration policies:
 - Configuration profiles (device-driver parameters saved into and reloaded from a file)
 - Auto persistent binding (Microsoft Windows operating system only)
 - Host bus adapter/port alias symbolic name
 - Emulex vital product data (eVPD)
 - Firmware update
 - Boot code update
 - Loading of expansion ROM boot code for support of the remote boot function
- Configure port devices
- · Use logical unit number (LUN) level configuration and target binding
- · Review host bus adapter information, including:
 - General information
 - Statistics
 - Information about attached devices
 - Link status for attached device
- · Perform host bus adapter functions, including:
 - Configuring the adapter device-driver parameters
 - Running Fibre Channel diagnostics (read/write buffer loopback tests)

- Performing flash updates on a host bus adapter
- · Manage configurations: Configuring single or multiple host bus adapters
- Confirm security

Using the Emulex HBAnyware utility

The Emulex HBAnyware utility, which comes with the device drivers for the Microsoft Windows or Linux operating system, is used to configure a storage area network (SAN) environment that consists of Fibre Channel host bus adapters. It is a network-capable application that can connect to and configure remote systems, enabling centralized management and configuration of host bus adapter components.

You can use the HBAnyware utility to manage and control one or more host bus adapters that are installed on local or remote servers. Use the HBAnyware utility, along with problem determination procedures (PDPs), on new or existing installations to help diagnose Fibre Channel subsystem problems in adapters, controllers, and devices that are attached to the Fibre Channel fabric or loop.

You can also perform the following operations using the HBAnyware utility to configure devices in the server.

To reset a parameter for the host bus adapter to its default value, complete the following steps:

- 1. Select the applicable host bus adapter.
- 2. Select the Driver Parameters tab in the Adapter Properties window.
- 3. Click **Default**.

Chapter 6. Troubleshooting

If you are having a problem, use the following information to help you determine the cause of the problem and the action to take. Additional troubleshooting and debugging procedures are available in the *Problem Determination and Service Guide* or in the *Hardware Maintenance Manual and Troubleshooting Guide* that comes with the server.

Make sure that you are using the latest versions of device drivers, firmware code, and BIOS code for the server. To download the most recent device drivers and firmware and BIOS boot code updates, go to http://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/. Follow the instructions that are included with the download procedure.

To determine whether the problem is caused by the hardware, perform the following tasks:

- · Make sure that the host bus adapter is installed correctly in the server.
- Make sure that the server is configured correctly.
- Make sure that the HBAnyware utility device-driver parameters are correct.
- · Make sure that all peripheral devices are:
- Connected to the Fibre Channel host bus adapters correctly
- Turned on
- Operating correctly

For more information, see the documentation that comes with the peripheral devices.

To determine whether the problem is caused by the software, perform the following tasks:

- Make sure that the correct device driver is installed. To download or get information about the latest supported device drivers, utilities, and documentation, go tohttp://www.ibm.com/systems/storage/. Follow the instructions that are included with the download procedure. For more information, see the *Installation Guide* and *User's Guide* for the server.
- Make sure that the BIOS functional firmware and boot code in the host bus adapter are at the latest level.
- Make sure that the host bus adapter NVRAM settings are correct for your SAN and operating system.

To determine whether the problem is caused by the system configuration:

- Make sure that the host bus adapter is configured correctly.
- Make sure that the server is configured correctly.
- · Make sure that all other SAN components are configured correctly.

To determine whether the problem is caused by an attached Fibre Channel device, perform the following tasks:

- Make sure that the server is turned on.
- · Make sure that the host bus adapter settings are correct.
- See the troubleshooting section in the documentation that comes with the applicable Emulex device driver.
- If you determine that the server is configured correctly, see the diagnostics section of the applicable device-driver *Installation Guide* or *User's Guide*.

Customer replaceable unit parts

Replaceable components are of three types:

- Tier 1 customer replaceable unit (CRU): Replacement of Tier 1 CRUs is your responsibility. If IBM installs a Tier 1 CRU at your request, you will be charged for the installation.
- **Tier 2 customer replaceable unit:** You may install a Tier 2 CRU yourself or request IBM to install it, at no additional charge, under the type of warranty service that is designated for your server.
- Field replaceable unit (FRU): FRUs must be installed only by trained service technicians.

If the Machine does not function as warranted during the warranty period, contact IBM or your reseller to obtain warranty service. Contact information for IBM is provided in Part 3. If you do not register the Machine with IBM, you may be required to present proof of purchase as evidence of your entitlement to warranty service.

What IBM Will Do to Correct Problems

IBM will attempt to diagnose and resolve your problem over the telephone or electronically by access to an IBM Internet website. Certain Machines contain remote support capabilities for direct problem reporting, remote problem determination and resolution with IBM. When you contact IBM for service, you must follow the problem determination and resolution procedures that IBM specifies. Following problem determination, if IBM determines on-site service is required, a service technician will be scheduled for service at your location.

You are responsible for downloading or obtaining from IBM, and installing designated Machine Code (microcode, basic input/output system code (called "BIOS"), utility programs, device drivers, and diagnostics delivered with an IBM Machine) and other software updates in a timely manner from an IBM Internet website or from other electronic media, and following the instructions that IBM provides. You may request IBM to install Machine Code changes, however, you may be charged for that service.

Some parts of IBM Machines are designated as Customer Replaceable Units ("CRUs"). If your problem can be resolved with a CRU (e.g., keyboard, memory, hard disk drive), IBM will ship the CRU to you for you to install.

If the Machine does not function as warranted during the warranty period and your problem cannot be resolved over the telephone or electronically, through your application of Machine Code or software updates, or with a CRU, IBM or its subcontractor or a reseller that has been approved by IBM to provide warranty service, will either, at its discretion, 1) repair it to make it function as warranted, or 2) replace it with one that is at least functionally equivalent. If IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller is unable to do either, you may return the Machine to your place of purchase and your money will be refunded.

IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller will also manage and install selected engineering changes that apply to the Machine.

Exchange of a Machine or Part

When the warranty service involves the exchange of a Machine or part, the item IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller replaces becomes IBM's property and the replacement becomes yours. You represent that all removed items are genuine and unaltered. The replacement may not be new, but will be in good working order and at least functionally equivalent to the item replaced. The replacement assumes the warranty service status of the replaced item.

Your Additional Responsibilities

You agree:

- before IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller exchanges a Machine or part, to remove all features, parts, options, alterations, and attachments not under warranty service and ensure that the Machine is free of any legal obligations or restrictions that prevent its exchange;
- 2. to obtain authorization from the owner to have IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller service a Machine that you do not own;
- 3. where applicable, before service is provided:
 - a. follow the service request procedures that IBM or its subcontractor or its reseller provides;
 - b. backup and secure all programs, data, and funds contained in the Machine; and
 - c. inform IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller of changes in the Machine's location;
- to provide IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller with sufficient and safe access to your facilities to permit IBM to fulfill its obligations;
- 5. to allow IBM or its subcontractor or the reseller to install mandatory engineering changes, such as those required for safety;
- 6. when the type of warranty service requires that you deliver a failing Machine to IBM, you agree to ship it suitably packaged, as IBM specifies, to a location IBM designates. After the Machine has been repaired or exchanged, IBM will return the repaired Machine or provide a replacement Machine to you at its expense, unless IBM specifies otherwise. IBM is responsible for loss of, or damage to, your Machine only while it is 1) in IBM's possession or 2) in transit in those cases where IBM is responsible for the transportation charges; and
- to securely erase from any Machine you return to IBM for any reason all programs not provided by IBM with the Machine, and data, including without limitation the following: 1) information about identified or identifiable individuals or legal entities ("Personal Data") and 2) your confidential or proprietary

information and other data. If removing or deleting Personal Data is not possible, you agree to transform such information (e.g., by making it anonymous or encrypting it) so that it no longer qualifies as Personal Data under applicable law. You also agree to remove all funds from Machines returned to IBM. IBM is not responsible for any funds, programs not provided by IBM with the Machine, or data contained in a Machine that you return to IBM. You acknowledge that, to perform its responsibilities under this Statement of Limited Warranty, IBM may ship all or part of the Machine or its software to other IBM or third party locations around the world, and you authorize IBM to do so.

Limitation of Liability

Circumstances may arise where, because of a default on IBM's part or other liability, you are entitled to recover damages from IBM. In each such instance, regardless of the basis on which you are entitled to claim damages from IBM (including fundamental breach, negligence, misrepresentation, or other contract or tort claim), except for any liability that cannot be waived or limited by applicable laws, IBM is liable for no more than:

- 1. damages for bodily injury (including death) and damage to real property and tangible personal property; and
- the amount of any other actual direct damages, up to the charges (if recurring, 12 months' charges apply) for the Machine that is subject of the claim. For purposes of this item, the term "Machine" includes Machine Code and Licensed Internal Code ("LIC").

This limit also applies to IBM's suppliers, subcontractors, and resellers. It is the maximum for which IBM and its suppliers, subcontractors and resellers are collectively responsible.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES IS IBM OR ITS SUPPLIERS, SUBCONTRACTORS, OR RESELLERS LIABLE FOR ANY OF THE FOLLOWING EVEN IF INFORMED OF THEIR POSSIBILITY: 1) THIRD PARTY CLAIMS AGAINST YOU FOR DAMAGES (OTHER THAN THOSE UNDER THE FIRST ITEM LISTED ABOVE); 2) LOSS OF, OR DAMAGE TO, DATA; 3) SPECIAL, INCIDENTAL, OR INDIRECT DAMAGES OR FOR ANY ECONOMIC CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES; OR 4) LOST PROFITS, BUSINESS REVENUE, GOODWILL OR ANTICIPATED SAVINGS. SOME STATES OR JURISDICTIONS DO NOT ALLOW THE EXCLUSION OR LIMITATION OF INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, SO THE ABOVE LIMITATION OR EXCLUSION MAY NOT APPLY TO YOU.

Governing Law

Both you and IBM consent to the application of the laws of the country in which you acquired the Machine to govern, interpret, and enforce all of your and IBM's rights, duties, and obligations arising from, or relating in any manner to, the subject matter of this Statement of Limited Warranty, without regard to conflict of law principles.

THESE WARRANTIES GIVE YOU SPECIFIC LEGAL RIGHTS AND YOU MAY ALSO HAVE OTHER RIGHTS WHICH VARY FROM STATE TO STATE OR JURISDICTION TO JURISDICTION.

Jurisdiction

All of our rights, duties, and obligations are subject to the courts of the country in which you acquired the Machine.

Part 2 - Country-unique Terms

If one of the parties refuses or otherwise fails to appoint an arbitrator within 30 days of the date the other party appoints its, the first appointed arbitrator shall be the sole arbitrator, provided that the arbitrator was validly and properly appointed.

All proceedings shall be conducted, including all documents presented in such proceedings, in the English language. The English language version of this Statement of Limited Warranty prevails over any other language version.

JAPAN

Other vacancies shall be filled by the respective nominating party. Proceedings shall continue from the stage they were at when the vacancy occurred.

If one of the parties refuses or otherwise fails to appoint an arbitrator within 30 days of the date the other party appoints its, the first appointed arbitrator shall be the sole arbitrator, provided that the arbitrator was validly and properly appointed.

All proceedings shall be conducted, including all documents presented in such proceedings, in the English language. The English language version of this Statement of Limited Warranty prevails over any other language version.

SINGAPORE

Limitation of Liability: The words "**SPECIAL**" and "**ECONOMIC**" in item 3 in the fifth paragraph are deleted.

EUROPE, MIDDLE EAST, AFRICA (EMEA)

THE FOLLOWING TERMS APPLY TO ALL EMEA COUNTRIES:

The terms of this Statement of Limited Warranty apply to Machines purchased from IBM or an IBM reseller.

How to Obtain Warranty Service:

Jurisdiction: The following exceptions are added to this section:

1) In Austria the choice of jurisdiction for all disputes arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty and relating thereto, including its existence, will be the competent court of law in Vienna, Austria (Inner-City); 2) in Angola, Bahrain, Botswana, Burundi, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Ghana, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Liberia, Malawi, Malta, Mozambique, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Qatar, Rwanda, Sao Tome, Saudi Arabia, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Tanzania, Uganda, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, West Bank/Gaza, Yemen, Zambia, and **Zimbabwe** all disputes arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty or related to its execution, including summary proceedings, will be submitted to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts; 3) in Belgium and Luxembourg, all disputes arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty or related to its interpretation or its execution, the law, and the courts of the capital city, of the country of your registered office and/or commercial site location only are competent; 4) in France, Algeria, Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo Republic, Djibouti, Democratic Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, French Guiana, French Polynesia, Gabon, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Ivory Coast, Lebanon, Libya, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mayotte, Morocco, New Caledonia, Niger, Reunion, Senegal, Seychelles, Togo, Tunisia, Vanuatu, and Wallis & Futuna all disputes arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty or related to its violation or execution, including summary proceedings, will be settled exclusively by the Commercial Court of Paris; 5) in South Africa, Namibia, Lesotho and Swaziland, both of us agree to submit all disputes relating to this Statement of Limited Warranty to the jurisdiction of the High Court in Johannesburg; 6) in Turkey all disputes arising out of or in connection with this Statement of Limited Warranty shall be resolved by the Istanbul Central (Sultanahmet) Courts and Execution Directorates of Istanbul, the Republic of Turkey; 7) in each of the following specified countries, any legal claim arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty will be brought before, and settled exclusively by, the competent court of a) Athens for Greece, b) Tel Aviv-Jaffa for Israel, c) Milan for Italy, d) Lisbon for Portugal, and e) Madrid for Spain; and 8) in the United Kingdom, both of us agree to submit all disputes relating to this Statement of Limited Warranty to the jurisdiction of the English courts.

Arbitration: The following is added under this heading:

In Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Georgia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Libya, FYR Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Poland, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine, and Uzbekistan all disputes arising out of this Statement of Limited Warranty or related to its violation, termination or nullity will be finally settled under the Rules of Arbitration and Conciliation of the International Arbitral Center of the Federal Economic Chamber in Vienna (Vienna Rules) by three arbitrators appointed in accordance with these rules. The arbitration will be held in Vienna, Austria, and the official language of the proceedings will be English. The decision of the arbitrators will be final and binding upon both parties. Therefore, pursuant to paragraph 598 (2) of the Austrian Code of Civil Procedure, the parties expressly waive the application of paragraph 595 (1) figure 7 of the Code. IBM may, however, institute proceedings in a competent court in the country of installation.

In Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania all disputes arising in connection with this Statement of Limited Warranty will be finally settled in arbitration that will be held in Helsinki, Finland in accordance with the arbitration laws of Finland then in effect. Each party will appoint one arbitrator. The arbitrators will then jointly appoint the chairman. If arbitrators cannot agree on the chairman, then the Central Chamber of Commerce in Helsinki will appoint the chairman.

EUROPEAN UNION (EU)

THE FOLLOWING TERMS APPLY TO ALL EU COUNTRIES:

The warranty for Machines acquired in EU countries is valid and applicable in all EU countries provided the Machines have been announced and made available in such countries.

DENMARK, FINLAND, GREECE, ITALY, NETHERLANDS, NORWAY, PORTUGAL, SPAIN, SWEDEN AND SWITZERLAND

Limitation of Liability: The following replaces the terms of this section in its entirety:

Except as otherwise provided by mandatory law:

 IBM's liability for any damages and losses that may arise as a consequence of the fulfillment of its obligations under or in connection with this Statement of Limited Warranty or due to any other cause related to this Statement of Limited Warranty is limited to the compensation of only those damages and losses proved and actually arising as an immediate and direct consequence of the non-fulfillment of such obligations (if IBM is at fault) or of such cause, for a maximum amount equal to the charges you paid for the Machine. For purposes of this item, the term "Machine" includes Machine Code and Licensed Internal Code ("LIC").

The above limitation shall not apply to damages for bodily injuries (including death) and damages to real property and tangible personal property for which IBM is legally liable.

2. Limitation of Liability: The following replaces the terms of this section in its entirety:

Except as otherwise provided by mandatory law:




